BARUCH, SALGADO TIE FOR OPEN SOUTHWESTERN REINING HORSE ASSOCIATION FUTURITY CHAMPIONSHIP SPONSORED BY BILLINGSLEY FORD

The Southwest Reining Horse Association Futurity saw top-shelf competition throughout the week. Reiners from across the country traveled the miles, put in the hard work and showed up in Ardmore in top form to battle it out for championship prizes and bragging rights. The Open Futurity Finals, sponsored by Billingsley Ford was the highlight of the week featuring the top scores from the two-section qualifying round.

Fernando Salgado riding Loveya and Yonathan Baruch riding Spooks Show Time marked impressive 224 scores to tie for the Open Futurity Level 4 championship, worth \$12,671 each. Salgado and Yonathan also topped the Level 3 earning another \$6,089 each, and Salgado had a record night also finishing atop the Level 2 for \$3,294.

Salgado rode Loveya who is by Gunnatrashya out of Love Em N Lena and owned by Cam Essick. Salgado and Loveya are not new to the winners circle, they earned the Level 2 championship at the Tulsa Reining Classic after only having Loveya a week prior to that show. Now, after a few months Salgado says they are really starting to find their connection as a team.

“His biggest maneuvers are his stops,” Salgado said. “So, as I went through [my run] marking plus half – I could feel it was

being a plus half everywhere – after my second lead change I was like, I’m in a good spot. My first stop was maybe my best stop of my whole life. It was so fast and big and he nailed it.”

Salgado had a phenomenal night and picked up a total of \$22,053, making the SWRHA Futurity without a doubt a special one for Salgado.

“It’s great especially this show it’s always a big score to win it and we’re so close to the Futurity it gives a lot of confidence to go to the big Futurity in Oklahoma City,” Salgado said of his wins.

Baruch rode Spooks Show Time who is by Spooks Gotta Whiz out of Dolittle Lena owned by Bobby Lewis. Spooks Show Time had a small bobble in the qualifying round, but Baruch says he came back without any hesitations.

“When I did the go-round he shied

off the people at the gates and today he looked at it, but never shied off and the second time around he said ‘Hey, to hell with it we’re on our tracks.’ And I never had to help him, not even one bit in my circles,” Baruch said. “My first run to the stop I think I was maybe a hair shy of what I needed to be, but you never know... you kind of have to go for it, but I kick my butt after that first rollback. I quit safetying up for the last two and he stopped huge.”

Baruch expressed both he and Salgado's decision to split the win rather than runoff for the championship was based on preservation for their horses.

"This close to the futurity there's really no point. We're all trying to make the Open Futurity Finals, which is the biggest thing we have in our industry, so there's really no point burning those horses [when] we already had to push them pretty hard this week," Baruch said.

Along with saving their horses, Baruch says he doesn't mind sharing the win with a class act competitor and contemporary.

"Fernando had a great year this year, and this is just an honor for me," he said. "We work every day to be competitive. This is all we do from the athlete standpoint and finally make it to the top after all these years it's very, very rewarding. This was my childhood dream – to be able to hold my own with the Level 4 riders, so finally having that much success is truly a blessing."

Baruch gave credit to owner Bobby Lewis for his help and the faith he's shown him along the way, as well as to Mystic Valley Performance Horses out of Marietta, Okla., for their support to not only him, but to the industry and horses overall.

Austin Roush took home the Level 1 title riding Shiney-Chexy Chic to a score of 219 worth \$661.

ShineyChexy Chic is by Shine Chic Shine out of TH Great Big Chex and owned by Roush's grandfather Robert Southerland. Roush's main goal for the SWRHA Futurity was to get his mare ready for Oklahoma City and he accomplished his goal in the process of claiming the championship.

ShineyChexy Chic has a tendency to get frightened in the show pen, however Roush said today she showed without fear.

"I'm really happy with her she showed good," he said. "She's really scared in the middle and when I showed her in the first go she was really scared, but today she was a lot better, so it gives me confidence showing her later on in her life."

An added bonus to the Open Futurity was the Open Mare Incentive for the highest finishing mare in the futurity sponsored by Premier Equine Veterinary Services and Rancho Sereno. The Mega Mare Bonus was created to honor Mega Maggie Mae and Cinco De Mega by rewarding \$1,000 to the highest scoring mare of the futurity, this year claimed by Duane Latimer riding Shes Got Good Guns (Colonels Smoking Gun x A Bueno PocoDunit), who is owned by Roxanne Koepsell.

"She's just been a lot of fun to train, she's a really good mare. She's really consistent," Latimer said. "I thought she was really good tonight (in the Open Futurity Finals). We maybe drew a little early for everything, but I thought she didn't really make any mistakes."

Shes Got Good Guns also won the custom Gist Buckle sponsored by the American Paint Horse Association for being the furthest advancing paint in the Open Futurity.

The SWRHA Futurity gave away three golf carts Saturday night following the Open Futurity Finals. One golf cart went to the sire of the highest finishing horse that sold in the SWRHA Stallion Auction – in this case, Gunnatrashya owned by Arcese Quarter Horses.

SCOTTSDALE WESTERN WORLD SOUTHWEST REINING HORSE ASSOCIATION NON PRO FUTURITY CHAMPIONS CROWNED

Big stops, flying lead changes and flashy horses took over the Hardy Murphy Coliseum in Ardmore, Okla., during the Scottsdale Western World Non Pro Futurity at the Southwest Reining Horse Association Oct. 28. Highlighting the day, the Non Pro Futurity featured 44 entries paying out a total of \$36,709.

Topping the Scottsdale Western World Non Pro Futurity Level 4 was a tie between Kelle Smith riding GottaShiney Whiz and Cade McCutcheon riding Whiz My Freckles. Smith and McCutcheon piloted their mounts to scores of 218.5, which earned them the co-championship after the decision was made to forego the runoff option. Each pocketed \$4,290 plus championship prizes.

Smith rode GottaShiney Whiz (Spooks Gotta Whiz x Cee Bee Shine) who she says is her "comeback" horse. The duo have only been partners for a few months and the connection

seems to be a perfect fit.

"I tried her literally for five minutes at the Tulsa Reining Classic," Smith said of purchasing the mare. "After that horse show I went to Waco (Texas) just to see what she was and then I took her to the Congress and had a couple of bobbles and still won money on her."

In preparation for the SWRHA Futurity Smith received help from Dany

Tremblay and the team was able to get those few bobbles ironed out. The hard work paid off in big ways for Smith and “Shiney,” who along with the Level 4 co-championship took the top spot in the Level 3 Intermediate, as well.

“It feels amazing since I have not been Level 3 since the first year I did reining,” Smith said of winning both levels. “All this time I’ve only been Level 4, so it’s awesome I’m happy. I’ve had a bad couple of years and I think I kind of have a comeback horse.”

Sharing the win in the Level 4 was Cade McCutcheon riding Whiz My Freckles, who is by Spooks Gotta Whiz out of Dun Lost My Freckles. McCutcheon says although he and Whiz My Freckles are still figuring each other out he’s happy with his run and confident for their future.

“I feel good about going to the big futurity, because there’s stuff I could improve on and she was really easy for me to show,” McCutcheon said. “She turned really good to the right, just how I wanted her to. The left we had a little bobble, she started her turn and I kind of rushed her and she missed a couple of steps, but she finished good.”

Although McCutcheon is only 16 he shows with maturity beyond his years, making knowledgeable decisions about his horses and preserving their future. When Smith and McCutcheon were informed they had the option to runoff for the win the decision was made to share the title and preserve those young aspiring equine athletes.

“I try to save her a little bit before the big futurity,” McCutcheon said. “I want to win here obviously, but this is a stepping stone to the big futurity and I’d rather not run out of horse here then have nothing left there. So, I just save her to have something to show there.”

There was a three-way tie for third place in the Level 4 between Mandy McCutcheon riding One Last Nite (Gunners Special Nite x One Last Corona), James Morgan riding Gals N Guns (Spooks Gotta Whiz x Dun Lost My Freckles) and Mandy McCutcheon riding Customized My Gun (Colonels Smoking Gun x Dun Step N Out) with scores of 216.5.

Gunners Special Nite earned distinction from the Non Pro Futurity and won the SWRHA signature golf cart, which went to the sire of the highest scoring Non Pro Futurity horse for sires that participated in the SWRHA Stallion Auction.

The Level 2 Limited Open champion was Deb McCandless riding One Fancy Magnum (Magnum With A Dream x Ms Diamonds Fancy) with a score of 216, for \$1,102.

McCandless and One Fancy Magnum have only shown

once prior to the SWRHA Futurity and “Rio” shows, talent which makes his owner excited about his future. Having only purchased Rio in August McCandless says he’s quickly finding his stride in the show pen.

“He was very green,” McCandless said of One Fancy Magnum when she purchased him. “He’s just been a real good guy. He was behind, but he’s catching up very quickly.”

Furities hold a special place in McCandless’ heart and she loves the challenge and connection of starting a young horse. In Friday’s Non Pro Futurity she relied on her connection and skills as a rider to prepare One Fancy Magnum for his run.

“He was a little green on one side, but we worked it out, outside [in the warm up area],” McCandless said. “He’s so quiet and so cute loping he’s stylish that way – hanging and stylish, so that helped us a lot I think. And he ran down and stopped, I mean that’s a big part of our game. It was just a really fun ride.”

The McCutcheon team was a big winner in one way or another throughout the entire Non Pro Futurity. Audrey Jewell works in the McCutcheon Reining Horses office by day and shows a Gunners Special Nite in her time outside of work. Jewell rode Special Nite Time to the Level 1 Non Pro championship with a score of 214.5 worth \$238.

“I’ve always loved Gunners Special Nite and when I bought him (Special Nite Time) it was before I started

working for Tom and Mandy (McCutcheon),” Jewell said. “It’s actually kind of fate that I had a Gunners Special Nite and I started working for them, so it’s been pretty cool.”

The SWRHA Futurity was Special Nite Time’s first show and Jewell admitted when she purchased him in February he was a little behind. The duo have been making great progress and the win in the Non Pro goes to show the team is sure to have a bright future. The win was even more special for Jewell, because Special Nite Time is her first futurity horse.

“This was kind of awesome that he’s doing so well,” Jewell said. “He’s a really cool horse. He’s really quiet, super chill and he’s the calmest horse I’ve probably ever shown in my entire life. I’ve never actually had a 3-year-old before - I’ve only ever shown derby horses. So this is kind of my first show back really.”

It was a bittersweet victory for James Morgan at Friday’s Scottsdale Western World Non Pro Futurity. Morgan’s brother died Friday morning prior to the Non Pro Futurity. A day which would have normally been filled with thoughts of preparation for his run was clouded with the passing of his brother.

“Today it was a little hard for me to focus,” Morgan said. “It was one

of those kind of days where I just had to drive myself away from those thoughts and I just tried as hard as I could. My emotions were just everywhere about the whole thing. I really don’t want to glamorize the death of my brother, but if I didn’t mention it, it really wouldn’t be what today was all about, because he use to ride horses with me way, way back.”

Morgan rode Gals N Guns to the Prime Time Non Pro Futurity championship. The duo also picked up a shared third place finish in Level 4 and second in the Level 3 Intermediate.

Gals N Guns is by Colonels Smoking Gun out of Dun Step N Out and Morgan has only had the mare about a month.

“She’s the kind of mare that she’d been passed around and she really wasn’t working out for people and when she came down to Brian Bell’s for training I just saw her and loved the way she looked, her conformation,” Morgan said. “I’d ridden a couple of other horses that looked just like her – long time ago and I got on her and I thought that I felt that there was a very special horse in there. With the help of Brian Bell and myself we spent a ton of time on her and we just decided that we were going to have a try out between my

Level 4, but it was a huge thing for her to mark a [216.5]. One judge even had the courage, I would say, to plus 1 her circles and to get a plus 1 maneuver on a horse that was pretty far behind was very rewarding.”

The SWRHA Futurity strives to bring not

only a great show for the competitors, but top-notch entertainment for all attendees and a chance for all the young guns of reining to share in the fun of the show. As such, a Lead Line and a Walk/Trot – sponsored by Sebastian Petroll Reining Horses

A second custom golf cart went to the winner of a drawing from all the stallions that participated in the annual Southwest Reining Horse Association Stallion Auction and the winner of that drawing was the stallion Electric Snow.

The third golf cart went to the Open Futurity Champion

and was sponsored by Show Me The Buckles. Because the win was split between Salgado and Baruch a coin toss was done and determined the winner to be Spooks Show Time.

HATCHETT WINS SOUTHWEST REINING HORSE ASSOCIATION LUCAS OIL – PROTECT THE HARVEST ROOKIE CHALLENGE

The rookies took center stage in Friday's evening performance of the Lucas Oil Protect the Harvest Rookie Challenge. The challenge was open to all rookies, but limited to 30 contestants and those 30 riders were rewarded big for their participation thanks to the generous sponsorship of Lucas Oil and Protect the Harvest.

Topping the Rookie Challenge in both Levels 1 and 2 was Alexandra Hatchett riding HickorysBaylite to a score of 146.

HickorysBaylite is by Hickory Chic Olena out of Lucky Baylite and the Southwest Reining Horse Association Futurity Rookie Challenge was only Hatchett's second show with her mount. To make the win even more impressive, Hatchett has only been reining since June when she purchased the 7-year-old. A former Hunter and Jumper rider, she chose reining after being a part of a horse accident to get the same thrill, but in a safer atmosphere.

"I'm just really excited," she said. "[My run] was really quick. I had to run up here, because I didn't know I was next. So, he turned really well, slowed down really well and then

stopped really well."

Kendra Cooper took the Lucas Oil Protect the Harvest Rookie Challenge Prime Time championship riding Startime Vintage with a score of 144.5. It was her second win of the day. She'd took the top place in the Prime Time Rookie in the Ancillary Arena earlier in the day.

Startime Vintage is by Hollywood Vintage out of Startime Baby Doll and Cooper says they achieved a personal goal in the Rookie Challenge. As icing on the cake Cooper can finish the year with a win as the SWRHA Futurity was her last show of the year.

"My personal goal was to get in the top five and we succeeded that and just for him to stay with me and we stayed connected," Cooper said. "I was just very happy with him. The win kind of gave me some confidence that I needed to get back because I haven't shown in a while and this is a new horse with a new trainer and this got me started up for next year. I just feel we have a long way to go and we can do it together."

With larger numbers and more stalls sold than ever before, the sellout show featured the best of Futurity competition, but also offered a double slate of ancillary classes.

Baird, Berg Earn Novice Horse Non Pro Titles

Featuring 41 entries in both levels the National Reining Horse Association competition was tough in Novice Horse Non Pro Levels 1 and 2 classes.

Melissa Baird riding Easy Money Miss took the win in the Novice Horse Non Pro Level 1 with a score of 73 for \$150. Easy Money Miss is a homebred 9-year-old mare by Easy Otie Whiz out of Major Money Miss.

The talented mare had taken a short three year hiatus from the show pen, but has come back this year performing strong taking multiple wins already at the SWRHA Futurity. She led Baird to win in Wednesday's Novice Horse Non Pro Level 1 and put Parker Wurst at the top of his class in Thursday's Limited Open.

"She's been having a great year," Baird said.

Owned together with her husband, Marshall, the couple are enjoying the success with the mare. During the awards presentation, Marshall said "I think this is going to be a common thing with this mare," and it looks as if wins in the show pen are indeed becoming of Easy Money Miss.

Sally Berg riding Highlanders Scandal took home the win in the Novice Horse Non Pro Level 2 with a score of 71.5., worth \$261. Highlanders Scandal is by Conquistador Whiz out of HR Short Wheel Base and owned by Barn 66 LLC.

prior to showing because she and Highlanders Scandal had never shown in Ardmore prior to this year, however the duo had a great showing taking the win. Berg said she was excited for her first show in Ardmore and of course the experience was made even better with the win.

"I was a little nervous she'd be looking around, but we took it easy, but did correct stuff," Berg said. "She was really there with me the whole time, she's just one of the best horses to show; she's really easy."

Ordner Wins Non Pro, Intermediate Non Pro on Chex From A Star

Frank Ordner riding Chex From A Star topped the Non Pro and Intermediate Non Pro with a score of 146.5, worth a total of \$1,666. Chex From A Star is by Colonels Smoking Gun out of Chex From Hollywood and owned

by David Silva Sr.

This is the first time Ordner has shown Chex From A Star aka "Cliff" for Silva. Typically, Ordner says he just lopes

the 6-year-old for Silva when he's out of town. As such, Cliff and Ordner are very familiar with each other and Ordner says he really enjoys riding the stallion.

"He's just a fun horse to ride," Ordner said. "If you're having a bad day, you get on this one."

Ordner was excited about his win and said it was his first "big" trophy, meaning his first Lawson. "It felt awesome; one of the best ones I've ever had," Ordner said of his run. "He was really locked in all week. It's my first big trophy. I have a couple of the little ones."

Second place in the Non Pro, as well as the Intermediate Non Pro, was Carlton Crowe riding Whizout Chrome (CromedOut Mercedes x Miss Whiz Biz) with a score of 143.5.

Jennifer Greenleaf tops Limited Non Pro

Jennifer Greenleaf riding Survivorman (Colonels Smoking Gun x Shining Survivor) took home the Limited Non Pro title with a score of 143. Up to this point, Greenleaf's trainer, Tom McCutcheon has been showing the 5-year-old stallion and had great success with him in the aged events. Now, Greenleaf has stepped on to have her own success in the show pen.

"He's (Survivorman) just perfect and I'm just getting to know him and it all just came together, so I'm thrilled," Greenleaf said of her win. "He just knows his job and he's just great he's got a great attitude so it makes him easy to show."

In the Ancillary Arena Green Reiner Level 1, sponsored by First Bank and Trust; Green Reiner Level 2, sponsored by Sam and Martin Larcombe; Ride and Slide Non Pro, sponsored by First National Bank of Ardmore. Also battling for championship titles in the Ancillary Arena were Rookie Level 1, sponsored by Brian Bell

Rachel Munday riding FS Einstein Dun It topped the Green Reiner Levels 1 and 2 with a score of 72.5, worth a total of \$116. FS Einstein Dun It is by Einsteins Revolution out of Ms Malibu Barbie.

Munday and "Biscuit" have had a busy week having just come off of a win at the American Quarter Horse Congress, where they won the Green Level 2. The SWRHA Futurity Green Reiner class was their first

run since Congress and it gave Munday confidence going into Friday evening's Lucas Oil Protect the Harvest Rookie Challenge.

"I was a little bit nervous just because I got in late last night so I didn't ride him that much, but he warmed up great and we had a really solid run," Munday said. "Everything was correct and he was listening to me and we were connected so I'm really excited about the Rookie Challenge tonight."

Second place in Level 1 was Janet Cowels riding MJG Colonel Dry (Colonels Smoking Gun x Hollywood Dry) with a score of 72. Second place in Level 2 was Brittany Putman riding HA Lenas Tune (Lena Spark x DA NicA Tune) with a score of 72.

McCutcheon Wins Ride And Slide Non Pro Level 1

Jodie McCutcheon riding Great Time To Spin (Great Resolve x Checker Stich Nic) took home the Ride and Slide Non Pro Level 1 title with a score of 69.5. Great Time to Spin is owned by Gary Hostetler.

Youth 13 & Under, Youth 14 - 18

The future of reining took center stage in Saturday morning's youth classes, when the Youth 13 and Under, Youth 14-18 and Short Stirrup contestants battled it out for the top spots in each class.

In the Youth 13 & Under, sponsored by Luke Gagnon and Belar Ranch Madison Gustin topped the class riding Guns R Spooky to a score of 72.5, which was a personal best for the youth.

Guns R Spooky is by Smart Spook out of Berry Yer Guns and Gustin says he showed to the best of his ability in Saturday's youth class.

"I feel amazing," Gustin said. "He was so good today and he was so easy to show. It was our best score ever. I'm so

happy with him!”

In the Youth 13 and Under Raeanna Thayne took first and second place aboard Nics Wimpy and Codes Electric Heir, respectively. With Nics Wimpy (Wimpys Little Step x Nics Whiz) Thayne scored a 72. With Codes Electric Heir (Electric Code x Dunits Reining Heir) Thayne scored a 71.5.

In the Youth 14 – 18, sponsored by Metcalf Quarter Horses, McKinnon Larcombe topped the class with a score of 72 riding My Nu Mercedes Rox, worth \$52.

My Nu Mercedes Rox a 4-year-old by Cromed Out Mercedes out of Roxanna Chex and has had success with Larcombe’s mom prior to finding success with the 15-year-old.

“My parents bred him. My mom’s pretty much trained him, she showed him at the Futurity last year and made the Level 1 finals on him. My mom showed him at the NRBC this year and I took him over this year – I kind of stole him,” she said with a laugh. “This is really only my fifth time to show him, so I’m still getting to know him, but every time we get in the show pen he gets better and better.”

Second place in the Youth 14-18 went to Sean Allen riding Deltas Colonel Rey Ct (Colonel Rey Lena x Nu Delta) with a score of 71. Third went to Sidney Perdue riding Yes Ima Gunner (Colonels Smoking Gun x Double Sweet BH) with a score of 70.

Hattie Nance Rides Straight Shottin Gun to win Short Stirrup

The Short Stirrup class, sponsored by Gabriel Diano, was full of exciting competition from the younger guns of reining. Topping the class was Hattie Nance riding Straight Shootin Gun to a score of 70.5.

Second place in the 10 and Under Short Stirrup was Faith Horner riding Bullet Proof Benz with a score of 70. Chase McInteer was third riding Rainy Day Wrangler to a score of 69.5.

Jeff Sizelove Wins Saturday Green Reiner Levels 1 and 2 / Munday wins High Point Buckle

Green Reiners Levels 1 and 2 and the Ride and Slide Non Pro highlighted Saturday’s classes in the Ancillary Arena.

Topping the Green Reiner Levels 1 and 2 was Jeff Sizelove riding Bit Of Magnum to a score of 71, worth \$78.

Bit Of Magnum is by Magnum Chic Dream out of Bitsy Bye Remedy and has been in Casey Hinton’s Cedar Ridge Stallion Station and training facility have had the 13-year-old since he was 3.

“He worked really well, was real pure in his circles. The turn arounds - I was a little short there, but everything else went really well,” Sizelove said of his very first reining

show. “This is my first reining that I’ve been to, so it was great to win at your first one like this and the week has been great. I’ve got a whole village of people helping me here with Casey Hinton and his team, so it’s been really fun.”

I was surprised I didn’t think I would win both for sure so I’m just very fortunate and happy.”

eon. McCutcheon took first in Friday's Ride and Slide Non Pro as well as Saturday's, making her the high point rider and earning the Skyline Buckle.

McCutcheon rode Great Time To Spin who is by Great Resolve out of Checker Stich Nic. She marked a 69.5 for the win. McCutcheon says she purchased Great Time To Spin in May with no intentions of showing the 3-year-old mare.

"My dad said 'Hey, there's this nice horse in Oklahoma, buy her,' and I said 'OK.'," McCutcheon said with a laugh. "I had no intentions of showing her, and then I showed her and I won!"

In order to take the win she needed to enter and do well in both days' performances and McCutcheon said she's happily surprised by the win.

"Yesterday wasn't a full pattern, thankfully, because I'm very weak in lead changes. So, we didn't have to do lead changes yesterday, but just kind of break her in and she was really good, listened to me perfectly. She's such a little angel," she said. "Then today was a full pattern and we did darn good! I love this buckle! This is so exciting because I didn't think I was going to even have a prize in that class and I have a buckle now!"

Second in Saturday's Ride and Slide Non Pro was Antoinette Rand riding Carmel Smartini (Im Genuinely Smart x Genuinely Twisted) with a score of 68.5.

Youth Classes

The final day of the Southwest Reining Horse Association Futurity saw another set of tough youth competitors in the affiliate classes. In the last round of the show titles were awarded along with high-point championships.

"It went really good," McCutcheon said of her run. "My lead change might have been a little early otherwise she was really good."

Nics Wimpy, by Wimpys Little Step out of Nics Whiz, led Thayn to not only the round win, but the Youth 13 and Under High Point championship and Carla Clay Memorial Award. She received a high point Skyline buckle sponsored by Dean Latimer Reining Horses and the commemorative Carla Clay Memorial Skyline buckle.

The Carla Clay Memorial Award is given to the highest scoring youth over the course of the two-round youth event, and because Thayn rode two horses at the SWRHA Futurity she garnered the highest collective score.

"I really like her stops and her spins," Thayn said of her 9-year-old mare. "[My run] felt really good, she was circling really pretty it felt like."

Dani Latimer riding Snapbacks topped the Youth 14-18 with a score of 73. Snapbacks is by Master Snapper out of A TufChexer and had a great showing for Latimer.

"I showed her on Friday, too, and she showed really good so I had a lot of confidence going in on how she felt and she proved it, it was good," Latimer said.

Latimer showed the now 4-year-old mare last year as a 3-year-old and says she's becoming stronger and stronger in the show pen.

"Every time I show her everything just gets better and better, so I'm really happy with her," she said.

The Youth 14-18 High Point champion was McKinnon Larcombe riding My Nu Mercedes Rox, owned by her mother, Samantha Larcombe. She received a championship Skyline buckles sponsored by Stefano Calcagnini Reiners. McKinnon said the best part of her win was being able to do so on a family bred and raised mare.

"I'm excited, because I haven't been showing this horse for very long, so it's a pretty good feat," she said of winning the Youth 14-18 High Point award. "He's been in our family since he was born, so it's nice to show something that we've bred as a family and raised and trained."

McKinnon had a very successful day about the mare also picking up a win in the Limited Non Pro class, plus the Limited Non Pro High Point Championship as well. For the High Point award she received a championship Skyline buckle sponsored by Twin Cities South Trailer Sales.

"My run was really fun and I just want to thank Mike Hancock and Barbara Williams and "Mikey" (Straight Shootin Gun) for helping me win," Nance said.

She added the High Point win was extra special to her, "It's very exciting. Last time I came here I got a zero and I was very upset, but now I'm like wow!"

The Walk Trot High Point championship went to Maggie Nance, riding Hickorys Dr Pepper.

Carlton Crowe wins Non Pro, Intermediate Non Pro on Whizout Chrome

Carlton Crowe topped both the Non Pro and Intermediate Non Pro classes with a score of 73 on Whizout Chrome. Whizout Chrome is by Cromed Out Mercedes out of Miss Whiz Biz and was injured at birth when a pack of dogs attacked making her future seem grim. However, Crowe says after 20 surgeries she's a strong competitor in the show pen.

"This was a mare that was injured at birth. She had her

tail and about 1/3 of her left buttocks eaten off by dogs the day she was born,” Crowe explained. “She’s had 20 surgeries to correct all of her problems, she wears a prosthetic tail – she has no tail, there’s nothing to even tie to back there. But, she’s got a huge heart and has always had a big will to survive and thrive and do well.”

Crowe thanked Casey Hinton for his help getting the mare ready for the show and his help through the entire process as Crowe rides with Hinton’s training facility.

“This mare was very, very good to me the entire weekend, today was especially good,” Crowe said. “We tried to fix the mistakes we made on Friday and she came through for me today big time.”

For his wins in both levels he received a total of \$814, plus a high-point Skyline buckle sponsored by Ron Thompson Reining for the Non Pro level and a championship Skyline buckle sponsored by Todd Sommers Reining Horses for the Intermediate Non Pro win.

McKinnon Larcombe Wins Limited Non Pro

"He has not been shown since Tulsa (Tulsa Reining Classic) and I felt bad – I thought he's so fat and out of shape, but he showed fantastic," Williams said.

Williams also topped the Intermediate class with Dun Lost My Gun and in fact, tied herself aboard her 3-year-old Nics Custom Dually (Mister Nicadual x Custom Whizzer),

TRYON, NORTH CAROLINA TO HOST FEI WORLD EQUESTRIAN GAMES IN 2018

The FEI World Equestrian Games™ 2018 will be held at the Tryon International Equestrian Center in North Carolina September 10-23, 2018. The FEI Bureau today unanimously agreed that the Games should be awarded to Tryon, meaning that the FEI's flagship event remains in North America, following the withdrawal of Bromont, Canada earlier this year.

The original dates for the Games (12-26 August) have been changed following two scientific studies commissioned by the FEI which stated that climatic conditions would be significantly more favorable in North Carolina during September, particularly from a horse welfare perspective. The FEI also looked at date clashes with other fixtures on the FEI Calendar to ensure the optimum time slot for the 2018 Games.

"We are very pleased to announce Tryon as the host of the FEI World Equestrian Games 2018", FEI President Ingmar de Vos said. "The Tryon team submitted a really impressive bid and we have every confidence in the organizing committee. It's a truly spectacular venue and almost all the necessary infrastructure for our eight disciplines is already in place. We are looking forward to a fantastic celebration of top level sport as all the disciplines come together to crown their world champions at the Games in two years' time."

The Tryon International Equestrian Center, created by Mark Bellissimo in Mill Spring, North Carolina is situated on a 1,600 acre site at the foothills of the Blue Mountains. The venue has 1,200 permanent stables, 12 arenas including a floodlit international arena with a potential spectator seating capacity of up to 12,000 and VIP seating for up to 1,500, a covered arena with 5,000 seats, and has a world-class cross country course that will be used for both Eventing and Driving. The venue is surrounded by hundreds of miles of equestrian trails for Endurance. The venue contains excellent facilities for athletes and spectators including restaurants, hospitality, accommodation, retail and resort amenities. An on-site state-of-the-art veterinary facility is currently under construction.

"We are thrilled with this news and thank the FEI Bureau for having faith in us and entrusting us with the honour of hosting this prestigious event", Mark Bellissimo said. "It's a really great fit for The Carolinas Equestrian heritage and we look forward to working closely with the FEI and with the USEF to produce fabulous FEI World Equestrian Games in 2018."

The FEI World Equestrian Games™ 2018 were previously awarded to Bromont (CAN), but a lack of secure funding led to mutual agreement between the FEI and the Canadian Comité organisateur des Jeux Équestres Mondiaux 2018 (COJEM) to terminate the host contract in July of this year.

Following the withdrawal of Bromont, the FEI Bureau mandated the President to find a solution and, after a thorough assessment of a number of options, the President proposed that the Bureau allocate the Games to Tryon. In light of the time frame, with the Games in less than two years, existing infrastructure was a crucial factor in the evaluation process.

The Bureau met by teleconference today (3 November) to agree the allocation and were unanimous in their support of the Tryon bid.

"The FEI is 100% committed to the FEI World Equestrian Games concept and we are extremely grateful to all those that showed interest in hosting the 2018 Games", Ingmar de Vos said. "Their enthusiasm demonstrates the importance of the event across the equestrian community."

The FEI World Equestrian Games™, held every four years in the middle of the Olympic cycle, is one of the biggest events on the global sporting calendar, combining eight World Championships at one event. The FEI disciplines - Jumping, Dressage and Para-Equestrian Dressage, Eventing, Driving, Endurance, Vaulting and Reining - are all included on the competition schedule.

The inaugural FEI World Equestrian Games™ were hosted in Stockholm (SWE) in 1990. Since then the Games have been staged in The Hague (NED) in 1994, Rome (ITA) in 1998, Jerez (ESP) in 2002, and Aachen (GER) in 2006. The first Games to be organized outside Europe were the Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games™ in Kentucky (USA) 2010. The Games came back to Europe for the 2014 edition, the Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games™ in Normandy (FRA).

The 2014 Games in Normandy attracted more than 500,000 on-site spectators and a worldwide television audience of 350 million, as well as delivering an economic impact of €368 million to the French economy.
