GROWING BY LEAPS & BOUNDS! **TULSA REINING CLASSIC 2016**

The Tulsa Reining Classic began an upwards trajectory a few years ago but even its management was surprised at the level of growth in 2016. Cheryl Magoteaux Cody whose Pro Management, Inc. manages the show, was clearly pleased with the tremendous increases but she was candid about the growing pains that came with them. “We anticipated and hoped for about a 5% increase,” she said. “But a couple of classes caught us off guard.”

The most notable was the Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity. In 2015 the event had 87 horses entered, but when the entries closed for 2016 there were an astonishing 138 entries! “The meant that not only were we looking at an extremely long day,” Cody continued. “It also meant that people who had entered anticipated 80 or 90 entries were now competing against nearly twice that many.”

So Global Reining Sport Group, which produces the Tulsa Reining Classic, made a landmark announcement Tuesday evening before the show. Not only would the start time be moved an hour earlier, but the Futurity would also be divided into two sections – each with the same added money as originally announced – \$20,000 – and awards as previously planned for the entire event.

According to Cody, the idea to split the event came from Colleen McQuay who felt that it was for the good of the show going forward. Her fellow Global Reining Sport Group Board Members Jerry Kimmel and Anne-Marie Burns agreed so Global Reining Sport Group added the extra \$20,000 and awards. Each section was then awarded in its entirety and pinned as an individual event. Section A consisted of Draws 1-69 and Section B was draws 70-138.

Overall the number of horses grew, too, with a whopping 10 percent increase in stalls. Cody summed it up. “We

don’t know what the future holds going forward but we do appreciate all the exhibitors who choose to attend this event and will continue to work to make it a quality venue for reiners.”

There were other challenges, of course - most notably an Oklahoma earthquake on Saturday morning. As the Hollywoodsintown Futurity went on during the day, it became apparent that there was a leak from high in the Ford Truck

Arena’s ceiling. The Tulsa Expo Center Maintenance Crew was on standby to get to the top of the coliseum as soon as the competition was completed... and the leak and subsequent puddle in the far end of the arena continued to grow. Apparently the earthquake had loosened a pipe connection in the fire containment system in the top of the building.

It became a race against time. “Could the last few horses get through around the puddle without mishap?”

Then the reduction of pressure in the fire containment system caused the fire alarms to sound. Those alarms going off in the entrance to the arena and in the hallway between the Ford and Mustang arenas was deafening and really tested the mettle of the 3-year-olds still to show. “Of course,” noted Cody, “The alarm took a while to override since it was a fail-safe alarm instead of someone just pulling a handle. And then as soon as it was stopped, the system would cause it to come right back on about a 30 or 40 seconds later and have to be shut off again!”

In spite of the challenges, the futurity was completed and the problem was repaired that night. “We were so appreciative of the patience of our exhibitors,” noted Cody. “They were amazing and managed to get their horses shown in spite of the challenges.”

JORDAN LARSON WINS CARDINAL REINING HORSES OPEN DERBY CHAMPIONSHIP ON ELECTRIC SNOW

Because of a great sponsorship from Cardinal Reining Horses, the Open Derby at the Tulsa Reining Classic featured \$33,000 added money, and every exhibitor entered received a signature Cardinal Reining Horses jacket. Several of the entries competing in the Derby had the chance at an additional \$10,000 in added money in the Whizkey N Diamonds Novice Horse Derby, thanks to a partnership with Rhodes River Ranch.

At draw No. 29 Jordan Larson and Electric Snow posted a top score of 224.5 early in the day on Sunday taking the lead in the Level 4 Open. The early lead meant he had to sweat out 58 more horses. In the end, the score held and Larson and Electric Snow became the Cardinal Reining Horses Derby Champions.

Electric Snow is by Jacs Electric Spark and out of Snow Gun and he was out of commission for nearly all of 2015 after an injury. He's finally recovered and come back even stronger to take wins at major shows and took his first title in Tulsa on Sunday.

"That's the best he's been - pretty much for the whole run," Larson said. "He ran in and stopped really good, he turned really, really good - he had a little tiny bobble and maybe turned a little to the left, but everything else was pretty much spot on. I couldn't have asked him to be much better."

Larson and Electric Snow took home a Leson Classic Custom saddle, National Reining Horse Association trophies and \$7,566 for owner Equine Plus.

Tom McCutcheon riding Sunglasses At Nite (Gunners Special Nite x Chex Dun It) took home the reserve championship in the Cardinal Reining Horses Derby Level 4 with a score of 222, worth \$4,605 for owner Turnabout Farm Inc.

Hutchins – Armenta are Cardinal Reining Horses Open Level 3 Derby Champions

A score of 221.5 took the top spot in the Cardinal Reining Horses Open Derby Level 3 with a shared championship between Gabe Hutchins riding FM Shine N Tag Chex and Matthew Armenta riding Lena Who Whizit.

After a little tough luck in Saturday's futurity, Hutchins

walked out of the Ford Truck Arena at Expo Square with a championship title in the Derby Level 3 riding the 5-year-old stallion by Whiz n Tag Chex out of Shine With Wanda.

From maneuver to maneuver FM Shine N Tag Chex, who's also led Hutchins to a finalist position at the National Reining Breeders Classic this year, worked well for his rider.

"He was mister honest and pulled through like he always does for me," Hutchins said. "He's just a really good show horse. One thing I've been working on with him is running through the gate and he knocked it out of the park today." Hutchins and FM Shine N Tag Chex picked up \$4,003 for owners Tamarack Ranch.

Matthew Armenta rode Lena Who Whizit to the shared championship with an equally impressive run. Armenta has been prepping his mount for the show and said sticking to his routine is part of what led to the win - the other part he credited to his horse.

"Honestly, it felt really good, it was easy," Armenta said.

"He prepped good all week long, he schooled real good and easy. I stuck to my program and warmed him up for probably 30 minutes and didn't do too much and he showed good from the get go - from the first stop to the last he was really, really good."

Armenta and Lena Who Whizit (Lena Spark x Wa Hoo Whizit) also picked up the championships in the Open Level 2 and the Whizkey N Diamonds Novice Horse Open Derby, which was ran concurrently with the Cardinal Reining Horses Derby. All totaled, Armenta and his mount picked up \$9,435.

"I'm happy, it's always good to win, but I'm just happy my horse showed good, I had him prepped like I thought I did and he showed like I thought he would," Armenta said. "So, it was good. We came and did what we planned on do-



ing and now we're going to pack up and go to the next one."

Second in the Open Derby Level 2, as well as sharing the reserve title in the Whizkey N Diamonds Novice Horse Open Derby was Francesco Martinotti riding Stiletto Tag (Whiz N Tag Chex x Kachina Oak Olena) with a score of 220.

Thiago Boechat riding Xtra Voodoo Doc (Shiners Voodoo Dr x Call Me Miss Hickory) shared the reserve championship in the Whizkey N Diamonds Novice Horse Open Derby with Martinotti.

Franco Bertolani Wins Hollywoodstinseltown Open Futurity on Dun It For Whizkey

The 2016 Hollywoodstinseltown Open Futurity at the Tulsa Reining Classic, held at the Expo Square, featured \$60,000 in added money. Competition was fierce in the Ford Truck Arena with a tough field of 108 total entries across all levels.

Franco Bertolani riding Dun It For Whizkey won the Open Level 4 Championship with a score of 223.5, winning \$15,766 plus an Elite Saddlery championship saddle. Dun It For Whizkey, by Topsail Whiz out of Dun It For Chex, is home-raised and trained and the Tulsa Reining Classic was Dun It For Whizkey's first futurity.



"Here in Tulsa it's always a big, tough futurity and I was pretty happy to have this horse here and he was great," Bertolani said. "It was the first time I've shown him and he was great I'm so happy and proud of him."

Dun It For Whizkey and Bertolani had a stellar run in the show pen with snappy maneuvers and big, beautiful stops. Bertolani said he's impressed with his mount's showing and he wouldn't change a thing about the day. Bertolani and Dun It For Whizkey are slated to show at the American Quarter Horse Association Congress in October.

"It was perfect," he said. "I'm just going to keep him happy and show him in the Congress and get ready for the big futurity."

Brian Bell and Kind Of A Big Dual (Mister Nicadual x Dun It On A Star) won the reserve title in the Open Level 4, worth \$9,597, with a 222 for owners Crews Reining Horses LLC.

Diano is Open Level 3 Champion

Gabriel Diano riding Oops Itsa Spook won the Open Level 3 Championship with a 220.50, winning \$6,034. Oops Itsa Spook is by Spooks Gotta Gun out of Tejons Finally Dunit and owned by AC Quarter Horses. The win for Diano meant a goal is checked off the duo's list.

"It's always amazing when you work that hard and it's the first time you show a horse, you don't know what's going to happen

and this horse ended up being great in the show pen," Diano said.

Oops Itsa Spook has been with Diano since his 2-year-old year and has continued to impress his trainer.

"Since [I purchased him] he's been great," Diano said. "I mean every time, every training, every day it's been easy for him and I got a new customer that came and bought him, so [the win held] a lot of emotion, because I think he's a lot of horse and I think he's going to be a horse that everyone will remember."

Martin Muehlstaetter and Wimpys Smokin Girl (Wimpys Little Step x Pleasedontspook) won the reserve title in the Open Level 3, worth \$3,673, with a 219.50 for owners Marc and Kathy Gordon.



Salgado Takes Open Level 2 Championship with Hollywood Hype

Fernando Salgado and Hollywood Hype won the Hollywoodstinseltown Open Futurity Level 2 Championship with a 218, winning \$2,144 for owners Humphrey Quarter Horses.

Hollywood Hype is by Futurity namesake Hollywoodstinseltown out of Shiners Miss Lena and Salgado said any deductions on the run wasn't due in no part to his mount's lack of ability. The duo has only been partners since January and the win was memorable for Salgado.

"It feels real good. I'm really, really happy with him the first time we came out. We still had a one point penalty on the turn, but it was my fault not his," Salgado said with a smile. "This horse is very special for me I started riding him in January and I would like to thank Carol Rose, [because] she was the one who told the owners to send him to me. Since I got him he's getting better and better and we get along really well."

"Megan and Ryan Humphrey bought him and they are being really supportive and helping me a lot," he said. "They are keeping him in training with me and letting me show, so I really appreciate the help from Carol, Megan and Ryan."

Austin Lee Roush and Shiny Chexy Chic (Shine Chic Shine x TH Great Big Chex) won the reserve title in the Open Level 2, worth \$1,142, with a score of 217.50.



Jack Medows Wins Turnabout Farm Non Pro Level 4 Championship

The 2016 Turnabout Farm Non Pro Futurity at the Tulsa Reining Classic, held at the Expo Square, featured \$26,000 in added money. Competition was fierce in the Ford Truck Arena with a tough field of 175 total entries across all levels.

Jack Medows and Chicsdreamofdiamonds won the Non Pro Level 4 Championship with a 223.50, winning \$5,477. The mare, by Magnum Chic Dream out of Princess In Diamonds, is a



half-sibling to Medows' 2016 American Quarter Horse Youth Association world champion reining horse, Surprizentheprincess. Those particular bloodlines hold a special place in Medows' heart.

The duo put together a stellar run to take the win with big stops and superb spins, but to Medows he said he wasn't focused on speed he was focused on correctness and relied on his mount's natural power to take care of the rest.

"Both of them (Chicsdreamofdiamonds and Surprizentheprincess) are such people pleasers," Medows said. "They don't want to do anything wrong, if they do you just have to ask nicely and they won't do it again. That's a really great quality to have.

"She was just really good," he added of Chicsdreamofdiamonds performance on Friday. "She was just so good everywhere. It was just a really cool feeling to go in there and her almost relax. She almost relaxed more inside the show pen than she did riding the night before, which is a really cool feeling. I just sent her down the pen to stop her and she stopped huge!"

Medows said although he's had big wins before none have been quite like this and he thanked his family for their support and Fernando Salgado for his help preparing the mare before Medows was able to make it to Tulsa this week.

"This is just an amazing feeling," he said. "I've never really done this well before at a pre-futurity event and so I'm super excited about this. There are so many good horses out here today and I'm excited that she was honest with me."

Allison Sutton Wins Non Pro Level 3 Championship

Allison Sutton and Mercedes N Pearls won the Non Pro Level 3 championship as well as the reserve title in the Non Pro Level 4, worth a combined \$6,523 with a score of 219.

"It was a lot of fun. She was a lot of fun to show, she really let me be present in every maneuver and that's new for me, I like that," Sutton said with a laugh. "As soon as I loped off it just felt good, she just felt like she was going to be there with me so that was a nice feeling.

Mercedes N Pearls is by Cromed Out Mercedes out of Katijac Miss and Sutton said sometimes as a Non Pro she can get a little unnerved in the show pen and Mercedes N Pearls takes care of her rider to remove those anxieties. "She just let me enjoy it and relax," she said.



Taylor Zimmerman Rides Wimpys Little Jessie to Non Pro Level 2 Championship

Taylor Zimmerman and Wimpys Little Jessie won the Non Pro Level 2 championship with a score of 214 for \$1,263.

Zimmerman took the win after a long wait her run was re-

viewed by the judge, but after the agonizing wait she could finally rejoice in the win.

Wimpys Little Jessie is by Wimpys Little Step out of Jessie Dot Tari.

"I'm happy with what happened," Zimmerman said. "I thought I had did something wrong or she failed a lead, but she didn't!"

Zimmerman said she had a few bobbles, however she was able to stay hooked for the win. She also showed a second mount, Just A Custom Spook (Smart Spook x Wimpys Little Custom) to a score of 211 for a tie in fourth shared with Kathy Thompson riding Baileys Sidekick.

"It started off pretty good, my first set of circles were really good, better than I expected," she said "My turns, she didn't really start amazing, but she ended up starting pretty good."

Second in the Level 2 was Jessica Mullin riding Miss Top Whiz Dunit (Jumping Jack Whiz x Miss Bogle 012).



Jim Morgan is Prime Time Champion

Jim Morgan had a great night Friday inside the Ford Arena when he took home the Prime Time championship and reserve championship; third and fourth place in the Non Pro Level 4; and second and third place in Level 3. Morgan rode two mounts to the big payday of \$9,104.

Friday wasn't the only night he Morgan found success inside the Ford Arena.

Thursday he took home the Prime Time win in the Non Pro and after his win he said he doesn't go into the arena worrying about the scores put up by the other riders. Instead, he focuses on his run and if it's good enough for the win at the end of the class he's happy.

"I don't have any control over how everything else happens," Morgan said. "It's really more about being there, getting the job done, being prepared and having the kind of run you would like to have."

The mount Morgan took the championship on in the Prime Time was Shiney Workboots, who's by Smart And Shiney out of Reminic At Work, and also led Morgan to third in the Level 4, reserve in the Level 3.

Morgan's reserve championship horse was Poetik Justice, who's by Pretty Peppy Chec out of Little Chex 499, and is also the horse he took home fourth in the Level 4 and third in the Level 3 on.

CADE MCCUTCHEON RIDES CUSTOM MADE GUN TO SMARTPAK NON PRO DERBY

The Tulsa Reining Classic had a week full of impressive runs and sharp maneuvers. One of the highlights of Thursday's event was the SmartPak Non Pro Derby Levels 1 through 4.

Taking top honors in the SmartPak Non Pro Derby Level 4 was Cade McCutcheon riding Custom Made Gun to a score of

223 for \$4,980, plus a beautiful championship saddle sponsored by Kyle Tack, for owner McQuay Stables.

Custom Made Gun is by Colonels Smoking Gun out of Custom Made Dunit and made an impressive run in the Ford Truck Arena at Expo Square. McCutcheon's picked up some nice wins with the palomino, but he said this has been the biggest marking show so far.

"He's a good horse. I didn't have to go very hard and he made everything easy," McCutcheon said. "Any time you win it feels good, but this was fun too. It's fun to win by a lot, but it's fun to win by nothing too."

Jim Morgan Wins SmartPak Level 3 Derby on Smart Steppin Lena

Jim Morgan riding Smart Steppin Lena took the win in the SmartPak Intermediate Non Pro Derby Level 3 with a score of 218.50 for \$2,477. Morgan and his mount also took second place in Level 4, plus the win in the Prime Time Non Pro with a score of 220.

Smart Steppin Lena is by Wimpys Little Step out of



Smart Shiny Lena and Morgan said turned on the power to make an impressive run for his owner.

"It's pretty hard to get excited about anything at my age about anything, but I do get very

excited about showing my horse and he's a fun horse to show," Morgan said with a laugh. "He's won about \$57,000 and he's a 4-year-old.

"It kind of started last night," Morgan said of his run, "because we were practicing our run ins and this horse was so powerful. You can just see when he takes off, he's just so strong and big he feels like he's going 100 miles an hour. He's so smooth he doesn't look like he's going anywhere so I said I'm going to run him as fast as I've ever rode a horse in my life and he did, he took my breath away he was running so hard, but he handled the ground well."

Second place in the Prime Time Non Pro was Michelle George riding Cant Spook Me, who's by Spooks Gotta Gun out of Te On The Trashy Side.

Maggie Gratny-Young & Wallywood Top Level 2

Taking home the win in the SmartPak Limited Non Pro Derby Level 2 was Maggie Gratny-Young riding Wallywood, to a score of 218 for \$1,126.

Wallywood is by Walla Walla Whiz out of Custom Mahogany and Gratny-Young says the mare has one particular strong suit.

"She did a great just really easy run in and back and her turns

were good," she said. "She really excels in her stops so I think that's where we really [put a] plus on this pattern. She stops hard and deep every time."



Shevin Haaverty Wins Novice Non Pro Derby on The Crow Bar

Shevin Haaverty riding The Crow Bar took the win in the Novice Non Pro

Derby with a score of 217.50 for \$864. Haaverty and her mount, who is by Gallo Del Cielo out of Blonde At The Bar also took second place in the SmartPak Limited Non Pro Derby Level 2.



MCCUTCHEON, MURPHY, PIPER TIE FOR TAMARACK RANCH DEVELOPING HORSE FUTURITY SECTION A

In an impressive three-way tie Tom McCutcheon, Josh Murphy and Nathan Piper each scored 217 and took home top honors as Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity Section A Open Level 4 champions, and \$2,584.

Tom McCutcheon rode Hot Hollywood Nite for owners White River Ag Products. Hot Hollywood Nite is by Gunners Special Nite out of Hot Hollywood Jewels and was born on McCutcheon's ranch and McCutcheon said the mare's been effortless from the beginning.



"She's just been easy from day one and she keeps getting better and better," McCutcheon said. "So, I'm really excited about her future."

Co-champion, Nathan Piper shared the title riding Smart Ebony Spook who is by Smart Spook out of Ebony Shines. H has had the mare since she was a yearling.

"[I've] had her in the program the whole time and really enjoyed training her," Piper said. "She's always been really talented turning and stopping and she seemed like she showed that today."

Josh Murphy also shared the win in the Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity Open Level 4 on CBK Hang A Wright who is by Hang Ten Surprize out of HR Wright On Cash for owners William & Corliss Kellogg. However, for Murphy the really exciting part was the fact he also took home a co-championship in Open Levels 3 (tied with Piper), and won Levels 2 and 1.

"It feels great," Murphy said of his win. "I'm really happy for the owners of this mare they have been so great and I'm really glad to see this mare have some success."



Murphy had a great run and being entered in all four levels paid well. He took home a total of \$6,510. Plus, he tied for the second time this month with a million dollar rider, Tom McCutcheon, with

whom he shared the North Central Reining Horse Association Futurity championship.

Murphy said with a laugh. "That's good company. I'll tie with any level 4 rider any day especially million dollar riders."

Murphy and Piper tied for the Level 3 title and each rider picked up \$1,909 in that level.

Second place in the Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity Limited Open Level 2 was Mirjam Stillo riding Mister Dual Shine (Mister Dual Pep x Shiners Valentine) for \$874.

Second place in the Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity Open Level 1 was Sam Bremenor riding Chics Special Nite (Gunners Special Nite x This Chic Dun It) for \$429.

Section A of the Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity ended mid-day and section B had a late evening finish. But the excitement was palpable and at the end of the long day the second section ended like the first - in a tie!

Adam Hendrickson riding Little Bit Risky shared the win with Brian Bell riding Guns N Sparks, each scoring a 219 for \$3,330 each.

Little Bit Risky is by



Wimpys Little Step out of A Lasting Attraction and owned by Roger Weibel.

Hendrickson piloted Little Bit Risky to an impressive run inside the Ford Truck Arena taking home two titles. Along with the Level 4 win he also won the Open Level 3 class for \$2,374.

"He felt really good. I've got a few things to work on for sure before the Futurity and before the Congress, but he feels really cool! I really like this horse," Hendrickson said.

Guns N Sparks is by Tinker With Guns out of Whiz Off Sparks and owned by Kimberly Tillman. Bell has only been riding him for a little over two weeks and he said the training credit goes to John O'Hara.

"John did a good job of having everything where it needed to be and the horse has really been accepting of everything I've tried to teach him," Bell said. "I had two stops that I just loved. He was just easy to show. I could have gone faster or slower; he was really fun."

Fernando Salgado rode Loveya to the Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity Section B Open Level 2 championship and to the Open Level 3 second place finish for owner Cam Essick. Loveya is by Gunnatrashya out of Love



Em N Lena and Salgado has only had Loveya for a week. He said the horse's abilities are a true testament to his training.

"It feels great," Salgado said. "I appreciate the owner who trusted me and let me show him, but I would not take the credit. All the credit goes to Erin Taormino. She's the one who got the horse ready. I just got on, went in there and it worked."

Second place in the Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity Limited Open Level 2 Section B was Jonathan Gauthier riding Shine Man Shine.

Barak Gibori rode Pearl Haggard to the Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity Section B Open Level 1 championship for owner David Silva. Pearl Haggard is by Hollywoodstinstown out of Gunners Pearl and had a nice comeback in the arena for Gibori to finish with the win.

"He turned really, really big the first way," Gibori said. "The second way he kind of had a little bobble getting him hooked, but then he came back to me and since then he was trying to be a show horse and do his job."

Second place in the Tamarack Ranch Developing Horse Futurity Open Level 1 was Colin Fitzpatrick riding Dummies Luna Negra (Cromed Out Mercedes x Dummies Prescription) for owner Carl Lambert.

The highest scoring Paint horse was Mister Dual Shine ridden by Mirjam Stillo for owners WW Ranch LLC. He earned a custom Gist trophy buckle from the American Paint Horse Association.

Wednesday was full of ties at The Tulsa Reining Classic, and another one was recorded in the National Reining Horse Association Open class, held in the Mustang Arena.

Jarvis Anderson riding This Guns For

Nic shared the win in the Open with Matthew Mills riding Criminal Intentions, to a score of 147.50 for \$387 each.

This Guns For Nic is by Nic It In The Bud out of Katie Gun and is owned by J&S Partnership.

Criminal Intentions is a 4-year-old daughter of Gunnatrashya out of Princess In Diamonds and Mills brought the mare to Tulsa to season her. She exceeded his expectations.

"I really brought her to this show to mature her and get her a little more broke for next year and today I went in there with the idea to go through the pattern smooth and if I

needed to work on something then I could and everything just clicked for us," Mills said.

Mills commended the Tulsa Reining Classic and said it's one of his favorite places to show.

"It's a great horse show and all the arenas are nice," he said. "In fact, the ancillary pens here are better than some of the ground in the big pens. It's a great place to prepare a young horse or bring an older one."

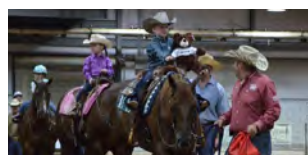
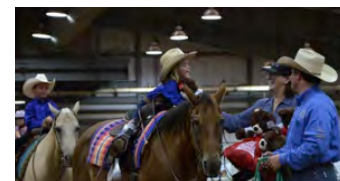

The thought of her walking, let alone riding a horse ever again was far beyond the doctors' beliefs. The Utah native proved the world wrong when after only 18 months she was astride a horse once again.

Since then she's been able to accomplish goals many riders only dream of and inspire a nation along



the way. She's competed against the barrel racing industry's toughest competitors at RFD-TV's The American through the fan exemption in 2015 and received a standing ovation from more than 40,000 fans inside the Dallas Cowboy's AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

This year she's qualified for RFD-TV's The American barrel racing semifinals during the Salina, Utah qualifying race. She also competes in the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association in barrel racing and breakaway roping and she regularly competes in amateur and professional rodeos across the western United States.

On her website you can find this quote, which accurately describes Snyder's influence: "She has let the challenges she faces refine her, not define her."

(Tulsa, Okla., Sept. 4, 2016) - Saturday the Super Duty arena at Expo Square saw talented Non Pro competition with smart patterns and big stops. Lindsey McCutcheon and Anita Horn swept the National Reining Horse Association and Affiliate Reining Championships Non Pro classes.

McCutcheon rode Mega Watt Shine to the NRHA Non Pro championship, ARC Non Pro and American Quarter Horse Association Amateur Reining titles with a score of 145. McCutcheon had a long wait to find out she was the champion, because she was first out in the class of 68 entries. She was happy the score held the entire time.

"When I saw I was draw No. 1 I was a little bummed," she said with a laugh, "but my main goal was just to qualify for the affiliate finals. So, I just wanted to have a decent run and get qualified. I really had no idea that score would hold then whole entire time, but he was really good I was really happy with him."

She began her run with a small bobble, but she said she was able to compose herself and finish the pattern strong.

"I walked in and actually had a turn penalty right off the bat and I just sat there for a second and thought 'This is not the way I want to start draw No. 1,'" she said. "But, everything after that was good."

McCutcheon and Mega Watt Shine, a stallion by Marthas Mega Jac out of Bella Della, banked \$617 for wins in both classes. She's been riding the stallion since he was 5 and as a 9-year-old now, she said they have a solid connection.

Second place in the NRHA Non Pro went to Heather Weisz riding Electric Sparked (Jacs Electric Spark x Dun Wrangled A Star) with a score of 144.5.

Anita Horn had a big day inside the Super Duty Arena cleaning house in the NRHA Intermediate Non Pro, ARC Intermediate, NRHA Limited, ARC Limited, Prime Time Non Pro, ARC Prime Time, second in the AQHA Amateur Reining, third in the NRHA Non Pro and second in the ARC Non Pro. Horn pocketed a total of \$1,175 plus a plethora of championship awards and prizes.

"I'm so excited! I just can't believe it, I'm shocked," said

an emotional Horn. "He felt really good in the warm-up and we came in the pen and he was looking around, but he stayed right with me. He's such an honest horse and he doesn't like to get in trouble and I'm learning to trust him, so we had a great day."

Horn rode Spookaroanie (Smart Spook x Little Roan Chick) to a score of 144.5 for the wins on Sunday. Horn's been riding Spookaroanie for two years and she said they are continuing to improve inside the arena. She thanked NRHA professional Casey Hinton for his help.

Second in the NRHA and ARC Intermediate was Savannah Grace Ostner riding A Bueno Chic (Bueno Fritizi Nic x A Hollywood Chic) to a score of 144.

Second in the NRHA Limited Non Pro and NRHA Prime Time Non Pro was Michelle George riding Cant Spook Me (Spooks Gotta Gun x Te On The Trashy Side) to a score of 143.

Blair Thompson riding Whiz N Chica Dee (Topsail Whiz x Chic A Dee Hickory) took second in the ARC Limited Non Pro with a score of 144.

Kim Burnett and San Juan Whiz (Topsail Whiz x Tamu Oaks Bay Etta) took second in the NRHA Prime Time with a score of 142.5.

Tamra Kyle took the win in the USA Reining Amateur with a score of 142.5 riding Gunner Git Ya Dun, by Colonels Smoking Gun out of Gotta Git Ya Dun. She also took third in the USA Reining Amateur riding KR Red Tag Special (Gunnars Special Nite x Go Red Pine).

"It's been a good show. I think they've done a tremendous job with it here. It's huge and they've handled it well. And, I'm tickled that Cheryl [Cody] is involved with USA Reining and can get it out there, because we definitely need it."

The NRHA Youth 14-18 championship was shared by Savannah Grace Ostner riding A Bueno Chic and Margaret "Susie" Dunn riding Spooks Smoken Wimpy.

A Bueno Chic is by Bueno Fritz Nic out of A Hollywood Chic and owned by Debbie Honeycutt. The 11-year-old gelding led Ostner to a score of 145.5 for a win she said was bitter sweet.

"He tries so hard in the show pen and he's been phenomenal for me for a couple of years," Ostner said. "This is actually my last year showing him, because I'm going to college, so I'm really excited."

Ostner and A Bueno Chic went into the pen looking for a win and gave it they're all. The duo also picked up the win in the ARC Youth 14-18.

off I knew it was going to be a great ride. He stayed right with me... I couldn't ask for a better ride.

Dunn's only been riding the 7-year-old gelding for about a year and the teenager said Sunday's run was their first "really good ride."

Second place in the ARC Youth 14-18 went to Blair Thompson riding Whiz N Chica Dee (Topsail Whiz x Chic A Dee Hickory) with a score of 144. Thompson and his mount also took the wins in the USA Reining Youth 14-18 and AQHA Youth Reining. Thompson said his mount has been consistent for him all week.

"I had actually taken [Whiz N Chica Dee] in the Non Pro right before this class and scored the exact same score and showed him yesterday and got the exact same score in the Youth," Thompson said. "He just felt with me all week and I couldn't have asked for anything more, or anything less, of him."

Jacob Zimmerman riding Kansas City Whiz took the championships in the NRHA and ARC Youth 13 & Under with a score of 143.

Kansas City Whiz is by Easy Otie Whiz out of Kansas City Royal and Zimmerman's been riding the gelding for a year and a half and said the mount is easy to get on with.

"I feel happy with him, I liked the run," Zimmerman said. "He tried to change on with me through the center, but I controlled it and it was good. His stops were good, too."
