LENDI RIDES SPATATINO TO WIN IRHA/NRHA DERBY

The much awaited NRHA/IRHA Derby Open Final came to an end, and assigned the champion titles to the winners of the four levels. There were 58 entries in the

entire Open Final, 16 of which were running for the prestigious Open Level 4 Derby Championship. Top honors went to Italian professional trainer, Gennaro Lendi, who

was last to compete being the go-round leader. Lendi rode ny Breeders Futurity Open Level 4 Bit Champion (score Spatatino, a fierce 7-year-old bay stallion by Spat Olena and out of Topsail Cal Bar, bred and owned by Sara Fabbri and her husband Massimiliano Rossi.

The horse performed an astonishing pattern, getting credits on all maneuvers and gaining a standing ovation after the deep, long-lasting sliding stops, the score was 227.5.

"I felt much pressure on this competition," said Lendi after the winning run. "There were some high scores to beat. I knew I had a good horse, but I probably didn't realize how strong and brave he is. When we were in the show pen, I felt him like he just wanted to win! He spun even faster than he does at home!"

The nice stallion has a funny story behind him. He was sold as a two year old, as he was not a pretty horse. The breeder, Massimiliano, saw him again after a while, and brought him back home. After a period of training and showing with Stefano Angelucci, he decided to assign him to Gennaro as he believed in this little horse with an amusing name. And Spatatino turned out to be a champion, getting better and better, show after show. In the end he won the 2017 NRHA Rome Shoot-In scoring an amazing 229.

"He is a generous guy," said Gennaro. "He never says no. He gives you more than what you ask him!"

Gennaro Lendi had two other horses in the Open level 4 finals, Star Sailor Whiz, owned by Soc. Agricola Mele and Desire Big Chex, owned by Franz Josef Braidt, who finished in 4th and 9th place respectively.

Anne Fonk riding Made In Walla, by Walla Walla Whiz and out of Hollywood Made, was Derby Open Level 4 Reserve Champion, scoring a consistent 226 after an amazing run, which represented the perfect mix of elegance, attitude and technique. The powerful 6-year-old buckskin gelding, owned by Sabine Lisec & Chuck Klipfel, did fast circles running with loose reins and head-tothe-ground, showing great talent and speed control.

"I just love him," said Ann gently stroking her show mate, bred by Ambrosini QH. "He's such a nice, and friendly one. And he has this natural attitude in circles, [that] I never worked on with him. He just like putting the head down, and run. He is cooperative, clever . . . big hearted horse!"

The gelding was trained and shown by Cody Sapergia until he was four. The pair were the 2015 NRHA Germa224) and the 2015 NRHA European Futurity Open Level 4 Champion (score 222). Afterwards, the owner showed him in Non Pro classes, before choosing to entrust the horse to Fonk's training.

Two elegant "lady reiners" shared the title of NRHA Derby Open Level 3 Champions, with scores of 218.5. Verena Klein and Sylvia Rzepka, both from Germany, decided not to run off for the title to preserve their horses.

"We both decided that they deserve to rest. They have been good all through the show: Co-Championship is fine for us," the ladies claimed.

Sylvia Rzepka competed astride USS Nu Spook, a 5-year-old sorrel Quarter Horse stallion by Smart Spook and out of USS Nu Chex. Sylvia chose him as a yearling for the owner, Günter Fellinger, and she has trained and shown him since the very beginning. The pair were Austrian and German Futurity 3-Year-Old Level 4 Open Finalists, Breeders Level 4 Futurity Finalists and Italian Futurity 4-Year-Old and 3-Year-Old Level 3 Open Finalists.

"He is a nice horse, always gentle and quiet," said Rzepka, a German top trainer, "and he's a big circler. He did them best tonight also. Unfortunately, we stumbled on the first maneuver, in the final, but we recovered and did well for all the rest of the pattern."

On the other hand, Verena was riding Cromeds Cowboy, a 5-year-old bay stallion by Cromed Out Mercedes and out of Miss Keyhole Cowboy, owned by Simon Andersson. The charming horse arrived at Verena's place from Sweden, were he was bred, as a 2 year-old, and was prepared and shown by the trainer since then. The duo were 2015 NRHA Germany Breeders Futurity 3-Year-Old SBH Open Level 4 Finalists, 2016 European Level 4 and Level 3 Futurity Finalists, and finally Equitana Reining Cup Champions in March 2017.

"He is a very special horse, very willing and quiet. He's balanced and good-tempered, but he becomes fierce in the arena. He does his best when it is time to go for a win!" Explained Verena after the final. "He is a consistent stopper. Tonight he was really good; we could have done better on the right spins. I felt he was a little bit tired, there."

Verena Klein and her mate also won the Level 2 Open Derby Champion Title.

Giacomo Poli Barberis took Reserve honors both in Level 3 and Level 2 Open Derby rankings, scoring a 218. The 35-year-old Tuscan trainer competed with Doc Magic Brown, a 5-year-old quarter horse gelding by Arc Magic Enterprise and out of Doc Sugar Brown, for the owners Patrizia Formicola and Riccardo Lo Iacono. Sold in the Czech Republic, since the gelding was still in that country as a three-year-old, he did not take part in the 2015 Futurity, returning to Italy only before the four-year-old competition, where the pair triumphed in all four levels of the Futurity Open 4-Year-Old, after dominating the go- round in all four levels.

Josefin Lintner claimed the NRHA Derby Open Level 1 Championship astride Gunners Western Star, a 5-year-old sorrel mare by Gunnatrashya and out West Coast Princess, owned by Anais Gasser. The German trainer, working in Mooslargue, France for the last four years, got the mare when she was a 3 year-old.

"She was born in the States, and then brought to Germany. But she was much behind with the training," the young lady explained. "So we had to work on everything. But she has a strong mind and a big heart, and she improved a lot."

The pair placed 4th in the NRHA France Futurity.

"Tonight, in the show pen, she was fantastic, just listening to me all the time. She trusted in me, and gave 100% during the final. I am very happy, especially about her circles and stops. She was so consistent!"

Italian young trainer Nico Sicuro placed second, riding Cromed Whiztress, a nice 7-year-old mare, by Custom Crome and out of The Great Whiztress, by the 11 Million

Dollar Sire Topsail Whiz. The 20-year-old trainer, working as an assistant to Davide Brighenti, started to ride the mare in January to get ready for the IRHA/ NRHA Derby, while the mare continued to take part in regional Non Pro competitions with current owner, Arianna Piacentini. The chestnut mare was born in the States, and once in Italy, she was shown by Adriano Meacci for the former owner, Giancarmine Sabatino.







GINA SCHUMACHER TOPS IRHA/NRHA NON PRO DERBY ON GOTTA NIFTY GUN

The thrilling finals of the IRHA/NRHA Non Pro Derby took her face for the entire run, despite the high concentration and place with great fun and entertainment for the enthusiastic audience.

Forty-seven finalists entered the arena, running for the four championship titles available in this Derby.

Last to enter the arena was the Non Pro Level 4 go-round leader, Gina Schumacher from Germany, who scored a resonanting 222.5 riding the powerful and charming Gotta Nifty Gun and drawing a perfect and powerful pattern astride the beautiful blue-eyed dun stallion. The much decorated 2010 dun stallion, nicknamed "Frankie" is currently the NRHA Non Pro World Champion and enriches once again his long winning career with his young but extremely clever rider. Frankie is by the NRHA Futurity Non Pro Reserve Champion Dun It Gotta Gun and out of Custom Nifty Nic, by Custom Crome. Schumacher, who has ridden since she was a little girl, has recently become one of the top Non Pro riders in Europe.

"Frankie is the horse of my heart, ever! When he was five, my mum saw him and she loved him immediately. She called to ask if he was for sale... and he was!" Schumacher and Frankie performed a magical run, rewarded by a standing ovation. The young lady-reiner had a shining, winning smile on

efforts she had to deal with.

Derby Non Pro Level 4 Reserve Champion, with a score of 218.5, is the German rider, Lena Schmidl, riding the nice 5-year-old stallion, Spooks Star Gun, by Spooks Gotta Gun and out of Elites Wildbumblebee, by Elite Eldorado. The bay overo stallion set up a convincing run, enriched with deep and longlasting sliding stops. Lena and her horse were also crowned Level 3 Non Pro Derby Champions, and this is another great achievement for this winning pair. In fact, the duo was an NRHA Germany Breeders Futurity Finalists as a 3 year-old and then as a 4 year-old, and also won the 2016 NRHA European Futurity Non Pro Levels 3, 2 and 1, and placed Reserve in the Level 4.

"He's a nice horse to ride, not too quiet, but balanced and good minded. He has strong stops and turns," said Lena after his run. "Tonight I thought: now or never... and we did it!" Lena rides and trains under the supervision of Markus Gebert.

Italian rider, Andrea Iannetta, riding the 6-year-old bay mare ER Baby Jane Surprise, by One Gun and out of Surprise Moonlight, is Derby Non Pro Level 2 Reserve Champion with a score of 216.5. Andrea bought this mare when she was only

a 2 year-old, and he has trained her by himself since then. The pair already has a rich show record in reining Special Events. In 2014, they were the IRHA Futurity 3-Year-Old Non Pro Level 3 and Level 4 Champions, Austrian Futurity 3 year-old Non Pro Champion level 3 and 4 and go-round leaders in the 2015 Austrian Futurity Champion Non Pro Level 4, and IRHA Futurity 4-Year-old Non Pro Finalists.

shown by Francesco Barbagli, with good results in the IRHA Futurity final. In 2016, he was NRHA France Futurity Non Pro Levels 4,3 and 2 Champion and AVCR Maturity Non Pro Reserve Champion. Laura, who works as a nurse, rides by herself at home but she is assisted by Bernard and Ann Fonck at the shows, and she is grateful to them for their valuable suggestions.

Another German rider, Ulrike Krueger, gained the title of IRHA/NRHA Derby Non Pro Level 2 Champion, riding SL, an athletic, flashy 5-year-old palomino mare by Jacs Elec-

tric Spark and out of Shes Customized. The pair, who entered the arena as the fifth entry, set the pace of the entire competition by scoring a consistent 217.5 and resulted in being the 3rd best score of the whole final. The eye catching mare performed super fast circles, and ended the run with deep and strong stops.

"I bought her when she was only one and a half years

old, and I started and trained her by myself," said the smiling Krueger. "She is solid in every maneuver, but in circles and stops she is special. We can still improve the turns."

Krueger, the German rider who lives in Austria, usually rides and trains her horse by herself, but since 2013 she is assisted by Bernard Fonk at the main shows just to fix the final details before the competition. The pair gained the finals in all the reining Special Events that they took part in and won the Bronze Trophy.

Krueger added, "She is improving day after day, year after year, always getting better and better. I am so happy about her! She is very honest."

With a nice 216, Laura Dalla Gassa and Kn D Badger Classic, owned by her dad Diego, are IRHA/NRHA Derby Level 2 Reserve Champion. The 5 year-old gelding, bred by KN Reining Resort owned by Andrea Castrucci, is by Okie Dun Badger and Bragalina Classic. The young lady has ridden him since he was a 4 year-old, while he was previously trained and

Three riders scoring 213 had to face a run off to decide the winner of the Derby Non Pro Level 1 section: Serafino Soldo riding a Sailors Delite, Verena Rigott and Lonesome Saturday, and Michele Lambo with LM Kaliwood. The winner after the

run-off was Serafino, whose powerful buckskin mare made a consistent pattern resulting in a 216.5.

"I am more than happy," said Soldo after the run. "I had so great fun during the final, and it was great to hear my friends cheering at me! They helped me so much."

Soldo rides and train with Marco Pettinari, who prepares the generous mare for the special

events.

"She is a great stopper, and she is physically well built, big and strong. She is never tired, and she's always willing to do her best, over and over" said Pettinari. Serafino bought this mare (bred at Cuoghi QH by Triple Crown Winner Master Snapper and out of Smokin Sailor Jazzy) one year ago, and the pair were 2016 IRHA/NRHA Derby Non Pro Finalists in Level 1 and 2, and also NRHA European Derby Non Pro Finalists in the same levels. At this event, the duo won the Finals in Levels 1, 2 and 3.

Verena Rigott and Michele Lambo shared the Co-Reserve Champion title, despite the young lady scoring better in the run off (212.5). Verena trains with Max Ruggeri, who was extremely happy about their run. The nice bay stallion, by Saturdaynight Custom and out of Lonesome Sally Lena, 2016 Non Pro Derby finalist, was precise and clean in the circles but arrived a little tired to the final stops.





NRBC EARNINGS PROPEL GUNNER TO BECOME NRHA'S NEWEST NINE MILLION DOLLAR SIRE

Following a successful event for his offspring at the National Reining Breeders Classic (NRBC), the National Reining Horse Association announced that the legendary stallion and NRHA Hall of Fame Inductee Gunner (AQHA Colonels Smoking Gun, APHA Colonels Smokingun) is unofficially the association's newest Nine Million Dollar Sire and only the third sire to reach this milestone.

Unofficially, Gunner's offspring earned in excess of \$131,000 at the 2017 NRBC, helping push the late sire over the nine-million-dollar mark by \$63,000.

Owned by Tim and Colleen McQuay of McQuay Stables Inc., Tioga, Texas, the 1993 stallion was bred by Eric Storey of Henagar, Ala. By Colonelfourfreckle and out of Katie Gun, Gunner was a stand out in the show pen.

The dual-registered paint and quarter horse stallion made his debut at the NRHA Futurity and the reining world fell in love with the diminutive sorrel with the floppy ears and white tail. After tying for the NRHA Futurity Open Reserve title as a 3-year-old and claiming NRBC Reserve honors, he went on win the US Equestrian Team Reining Champion-ship in 2001. He was immortalized as a Breyer Horse and finished his career with earnings over \$177,000.

If he was superior as a performer, he hit another level as a sire! Gunner's highest money-earning progeny include:

Tinker With Guns (out of TinkerNic): NRHA LTE over \$344.100

Gunners Tinseltown (out of Miss Tinseltown): NRHA LTE over \$305,300

Americasnextgunmodel (out of Cee Dun It Do It): NRHA LTE over \$289,400

Gunners Special Nite (out of Mifs Doll): NRHA LTE over \$219,700


Gunnatrashya (out of Natrasha): NRHA LTE over \$218,00

The National Reining Horse Hall of Fame inductee and (at the time) \$5 Million Sire was humanely put down on July 8, 2013 after losing a battle with laminitis.

For Tim McQuay, it is amazing that four years after his death Gunner keeps making history and passing milestones. "He was an incredible horse that we were fortunate to have," he said. "I still miss him!"

Founded in 1966, the National Reining Horse Association is a nonprofit association dedicated to promoting and encouraging the development of and public interest in the sport of reining. The focus is on developing and maintaining suitable standards of performance and judging and in providing a fun-filled, family-oriented atmosphere.

TERZI WINS THE EUROPEAN REINED COW HORSE ASSOCIATION NON PRO DERBY

Luca Terzi, a doctor from Camaiore, gained the title of 2017 ERCHA Derby Non Pro Champion, riding GSR Bet Hesapuddytap, by Dualin Puddy Tap (by Dual Pep) and out of Bets Cat (by High Brow Cat).

The pair ended the three runs with a composite score of 283.5. The horse showed great cow sense and physical strength all over the Derby, performing at the top in all three disciplines involved. The 5-year-old red dun gelding was born in the States, where he was started for cutting competitions. Arriving in Italy at the age of four, "Tappo" reached Samuele Poli's stable, to be worked and trained for team-penning competition. Poli, a trainer from Sarzana, immediately noted the talent of the horse, and he suggested to his Non Pro, Terzi, that this was the right horse for him to compete in Non Pro Cow Horse Special Events. Poli was definitely right.

"He has an incredible physical strength and mental order, together with a high potential, and great maneuvers. He is an easy horse for a Non Pro, but so strong and efficient to

He bought this miracle horse almost one year ago, and loves him as if he is a great fun mate, easy to ride for a Non Pro but with great power and talent.

"Being my horse is so easy and talented with cow work, both in cutting and fence work, the most difficult part for me is always the reining," said the Terzi. The ERCHA/NRCHA Derby Novice Amateur Champion

was Luca Terzi riding GSR Bet Hesapuddytap with a score of 286.5, while Swiss rider Shirley Schalcher placed second astride her Big And Sweet BB, 6 year-old paint stallion by Big Chex To Cash with a score of 269.0.

Terzi won the title also in the Limited Non Pro Derby with a composite score of 212, while Alberto Sbraga took Reserve honors riding Dual Cat Moon, 4-year-old mare by WR This Cats Smart.

There were ten horse-and-rider combinations competing in the Open Finals of the ERCHA/NRCHA Open Derby 2017.

AQHA 2017 STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS AVAILABLE

The AQHA Executive Committee met April 24-26 in Amarillo to review the standing-committee recommendations approved at the 2017 AQHA Convention by the AQHA Board of Directors, with the exception of those related to bylaw changes and rules of registration, for which final approval lies with the board of directors. Even though some agenda items were not approved, careful consideration,

discussion and debate were devoted to each item. Below are the highlights of approved agenda items from the <u>2017</u> standing-committee reports. Read the full committee reports at <u>www.aqha.com/convention.</u>

AQHA Equine Research Committee

The Executive Committee approved the American Quarter

Horse Foundation funding of \$252,735 in research projects. The Equine Research Committee also discussed various methods to improve the distribution of research results to the membership to promote better understanding of important issues such as animal welfare, selective breeding practices and overall horse health.

2017-18 AQHA Equine Research Committee Chairman: Dr. Bob Coleman

AQHA International Committee

The Executive Committee approved: an international educational exchange task force to examine and make recommendations regarding the international horsemanship seminar programs and other international educational program opportunities; an international championship event task force to examine the existing European and Latin American championship events and make recommendations for the structure of future international championship events; and an international affiliate task force to examine and make recommendations regarding the structure and function of international affiliates and their relationship to AQHA.

2017-18 AQHA International Committee Chairwoman: Lori Bucholz

AQHA Judges Committee

The Executive Committee approved an amendment to rule SHW911.6 to read as follows: At all shows where there is an official videographer, judges will be allowed to review "all major and/or severe penalties of two points or more, excluding marker penalties in the reining and the reined work portion of working cow horse as long as one (1) judge has called a penalty." The Executive Committee also approved the creation of a judges' task force to create guidelines for self-monitoring among judges.

2017-18 AQHA Judges Committee Chairman: Al Dunning

AQHA Marketing and Membership Services Committee

The Executive Committee approved the creation of subcommittees of the marketing and membership committee with specific objectives and measurable goals. The committee will be broken into subcommittees to work throughout the year and report back at the March convention meetings. The committee also discussed a variety of other marketing and membership initiatives that included an update from the young adults task force regarding its research on acquiring and retaining more members in the 19-34 age range; better ways to help promote the American Horse Council's Time to Ride initiative to AQHA affiliates and Professional Horsemen; the potential to use microchips as a tool to drive AQHA membership and improve record keeping on horses in speed events and roping; a partnership with the Arabian Horse Association to assist in the creation and promotion of a literacy program tied to horses; a need to better involve non-horse people in events like the AQHA world shows via the creation of a hands-on horse experience, tours of the grounds, meeting with a trainer, etc.; and the consideration of a free equipment program, like those offered for other sports, where we could engage corporate partners and donors to provide things like helmets and boots to horse-interested youth.

2017-18 AQHA Marketing and Membership Services Committee Chairwoman: Gale Little

AQHA Nominations and Credentials Committee

The AQHA Board of Directors approved modifications to the following bylaws:

Bylaw Article IV, Section 7:

All vacancies in the elective and appointed offices of AQHA may be filled by the Executive Committee for the unexpired term and those so appointed shall serve until the election and acceptance of their duly qualified successors.

Bylaw Article V, Section 2:

The president shall be the chairperson of the AQHA board The Executive Committee approved an amendment to rule of directors and shall preside at all meetings of the board of directors.

Bylaw Article VI, Section 2:

Executive Vice President: The executive vice president is the chief executive officer of AQHA, and, pursuant to direction of the Executive Committee, shall implement the actions, decisions and directions of the board of directors and Executive Committee

Bylaw Article IV, Section 9(e):

If there are fewer than 3 candidates that meet the requirements in (d)(i), the past presidents may submit resume(s) and written nomination(s) of additional candidate(s) which must be received by the executive vice president on or before December 1. Such candidates shall also be eligible to be nominated at the new board meeting by the committee of past presidents or nominated from the floor at such meeting so long as such candidate(s) personally appeared for an interview before the committee of past presidents at the annual convention in the same year of the election.

2017-18 AQHA Nominations and Credentials Committee Chairman: Dr. Scott Meyers

AQHA Public Policy Committee

The Executive Committee approved supporting language

for the accelerated depreciation of racehorses in the upcoming tax reform legislation; the Horse Protection Act Amendment draft final rule; the American Horse Council's request that USDA-APHIS publishes a rule for public comment on enhanced equine infectious anemia testing and reporting; and AHC's efforts for continued development and collaboration between state, federal and industry representatives in implementing the National Equine Health Plan. The Executive Committee also approved the appointment of a task force to explore an AQHA public policy or congressional fellowship/internship program.

2017-18 AQHA Public Policy Committee Chairwoman: Dr. Eleanor Green

AQHA Racing Committee

No significant motions were made at convention by the racing committee that needed to be reviewed by the Executive Committee. However, the Executive Committee approved the recommendation by the racing council to incorporate crop rules as presented by The Jockey's Guild rule proposal submitted March 19, 2017, when submitting a Quarter Horse breed-specific model-rules proposal to the American Racing Commissioners International, Inc. (ARCI) this spring. The racing council proposed and the Executive Committee approved that an AQHA Integrity Team Request Form be submitted by racetracks and/or commissions prior to AQHA's involvement in any future onsite integrity teams. Effective January 1, 2018, the minimum requirement for AQHA Superior Race Horse award will be increased to 300 points. The Executive Committee also approved the 2018 AOHA Graded Stakes races.

2017-18 AQHA Racing Committee Chairman: Kelvin Childers

AQHA Ranching Committee

The Executive Committee approved recommendations to modify and clarify several rules related to Versatility Ranch Horse, in addition to adding Level 1 Open Ranch Riding as an approved AQHA class, effective immediately, and ranch trail to be offered at AQHA-approved shows as part of a slate of classes in 2019. The Ranching Heritage Breeder subcommittee revised the application for the Ranching Heritage Breeder program and the criteria of the Ranching Heritage Breeder of the Year application. In cooperation with Zoetis, the Ranching Heritage subcommittee will develop a ranch vaccination program for cattle and horses for Ranching Heritage Breeders.

2017-18 AQHA Ranching Committee Chairman: Jim Hunt

AQHA Recreational Activities Committee

The Executive Committee approved the following chang-

es to the Recreational Activities Guidebook:

In the Trail Challenge section:

- a) Strike the phrase "or praise" from penalty five of the Recreational Activities Guidebook.
- b) Change "Each obstacle should have different degrees of difficulty" to "Each obstacle may have different degrees of difficulty."
- c) Edit the obstacle scoring system to a sliding scale of -1/2 which is poor up to -3 which is extremely poor, 0 is correct, and +1/2 which is good up to +3 which is superior In the Horseback Riding section:
 - d) Review and update rules of the program.

The Executive Committee also approved the application of a \$50 late fee to those not meeting the 10-day deadline to return all paperwork and fees after an event. Additionally, subcommittees of the Recreational Riding Committee were created to monitor, refine and promote AQHA's recreational riding programs.

AQHA Show Committee

The Executive Committee approved modifications to several show rules. The Executive Committee also approved the formation of the Leveling review, individual rail and stewards' expansion task forces.

Modifications to three registration-related items were approved by AQHA members and the AQHA Board of Directors at the convention. Read more about the <u>registration</u> changes.

AQHA Youth Activities Committee

The Executive Committee approved to accept changes to the AQHYA officer and director application process; to remove the requirement that regional director candidates must be, or have been, an officer in his or her state affiliate; and to standardize the time allotment for both national officer and regional director speeches to be three minutes in length, in addition to judging the national officer and regional director speeches separately. The Executive Committee also approved to allow nominations from the floor in the event of vacant regional director positions following regional elections. The youth scholarships task force was approved to explore additional opportunities for providing scholarships

to youth members. Also approved by the Executive Committee was the pursuit of creating a horsemanship outreach program, and exploring the creation of a youth advisory board to mentor young leaders, develop youth alumni events and outreach to collegiate equine organizations.

NRHA BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY MEETING RECAP

The National Reining Horse Association (NRHA) hosted meetings for the Executive Committee and Board of Directors in Oklahoma City on May 1-2. The members, elected by the membership annually, reviewed and prepared for discussion of agenda items; raised issues and spoke of opportunities; and voted to make decisions to guide the progress of the Association. In total, the Board members committed nearly 250 hours of effort to NRHA over the course of two days. The largest topic on the agenda was 2018 rule change proposals. A brief overview is provided below along with information on other important discussions.

2018 Rule Change Proposals – The Board of Directors reviewed 37 rule change proposals submitted by members, committees and staff. Prior to their vote, they considered feedback from NRHA Committees and from members via the online survey. Unless otherwise noted, approved rule changes become effective January 1, 2018. More details on what was approved, along with the new rule verbiage, can be found in the Members Only area of nrha.com.

Some of the most significant changes include the following changes or additions to NRHA rules:

Beginning in 2019, memberships will last for a complete 12-month or 36-month period, and will no longer expire on December 31.

Non Pro Conditions were changed with the approval of Random equipment check 27-01-18. The largest change came from the addition of this of \$500 or less are allowed. text:

Even without remuneration, a Non Pro may not train or participate in mounted preparation of a horse not owned or leased by the non pro or the non pro's immediate family, at or for, a show. It is the intent of the NRHA to limit the ability of a non pro to assist a trainer or other person in the training or preparation of the horse while mounted for a show if that horse is not owned or leased by the non pro or the non pro's immediate family.

World Para-Reining, USA Reining and approved breed

restricted para-reining classes were added for Category 4 approval.

Event approval deadlines for BB and Top Ten Events changed to 60 days prior to the entry closing date.

Added money limits were removed from Category 7 Affiliate Championship classes.

The Single Purse Payout structure was approved for optional use in aged and closed aged shows.

NRHA Lawson bronzes must be presented when \$2,000 or more in added money is offered and other special NRHA Lawson Bronze qualifications are met.

Show results now can be sent electronically as long as some requirements are met.

Guidelines were added for breaking first place ties.

Allowances for touching the horse with the freehand and holding the saddle horn in Freestyle Reining, Entry Level and Youth 10 & Under Short Stirrup classes.

Additional guidelines were added to determine when judges may judge an unapproved reining class.

Random equipment checks in classes with added money of \$500 or less are allowed.

A 5-point penalty was added for a horse that loses forward motion and falls to knees or hocks while showing signs of disobedience, intimidation, exhaustion and/or distress.

Equipment clarification – The NRHA Executive Committee recently made a clarification to Rules for Judging. B.(4)(b) and (i) concerning belly bands and belly wraps. This type of equipment, or other materials wrapped around the belly, can cover abuse prior to and during exhibition, and can give an unfair advantage. Therefore, the use of this type of equipment in pre-check or in the show pen is not al-

lowed and will result in a no score.

2017 NRHA Futurity Updates -

Addition of the new Level 4 Open Semi-Finals (approved in February).

Open Futurity horses will not show on Sunday, November 26. This gives one-day off between the 1st go round and the semi-finals.

Sunday's Non Pro 1st go, 1st section will be longer than the other sections. This allows the go round to end one day earlier and helps manage the overall length of days.

The Non Pro Consolation will be held one day earlier than usual on Wednesday, November 29.

Adequan North American Affiliate Championship and ancillary classes have been rearranged to avoid conflicts and to move the Silver Spurs Equine Rookie of the Year to later in the schedule.

Affiliate Regional Championship Trophies – If a class at an Affiliate Regional Championships does not offer the level of added money required to award an NRHA Morrison trophy (\$1,000), the host can award an NRHA Morrison trophy for that class.

Collegiate Judging Contest – NRHA will work with the Horse Judging Team Coaches Association to implement a collegiate contest during the 2017 NRHA Futurity Level 4 Open Semi-Finals.

European Council Bylaws – Bylaws for the European Region were presented and approved. They consisted of definitions and guiding principles for the council and its executive board. It also included a list of responsibilities specific to the European Region.

IT Project – The Board was given an update on the IT project. Testing on tools for joining and renewing memberships has begun. These tools will become available to members when testing is complete.

Member Survey and Long-Range Planning – Approximately 1,000 members participated in the online survey. Results of the survey have been shared with the Long-Range Planning group and the Board of Directors. A plan, based on those responses and the group's discussion, is being final-Freestyle Reining will be held on Thursday, November 30. ized at this time. It will be presented to the Board at a later date for review and approval.

> **Regions and Elections Procedures** – The procedures were updated to better clarify voting regions for California, Nevada and Idaho residents. The voting region will be based on a member's affiliate designation. If an affiliate if not designated, it will be based on the member's state of residence. > **Task Force Appointment** – A task force was appointed to optimize the benefit of International Affiliate Program funds for affiliates and NRHA. The previously appointed Nomination/Payout Task Force will meet in Oklahoma City in the coming weeks.

AQHA ANIMAL WELFARE RECOMMENDATIONS APPROVED

The <u>AQHA Executive Committee</u> approved several recommendations from the AQHA Animal Welfare Commission at the 2017 AQHA Convention. The recommendations ranged from adding specific medications to the AQHA forbidden drugs or substances list to creating educational efforts for specific animal-handling procedures to a recommendation to use all drug- and animal welfare-related fines to support the AQHA steward program.

The recommendations approved by the Executive Committee include:

Fines generated from drug and animal welfare violations be placed in the animal welfare budget to support the steward program.

AQHA should encourage show managers to establish an isolation protocol at AQHA shows using the industry-developed template to ensure horses on the grounds are protected should there be a disease outbreak. In addition, show management should be encouraged to conduct practice runs or audits to ensure proper procedures are carried out.

Develop a one-page educational flyer to educate exhibitors on the importance of vaccinating their horses for equine influenza virus and equine herpes virus prior to entering

AQHA show grounds.

AQHA staff should continue work on an educational flyer regarding reporting animal abuse.

Effective January 1, 2018, AQHA Rule SHW325.1.2 be reworded to read: "Lameness is obvious at a walk."

Form a joint task force made up of members from the Animal Welfare Commission, Professional Horsemen's Council and the Show Format and Procedures Subcommittee to discuss options to increase AQHA Steward presence at shows.

Effective January 1, 2018, a no-jerk-down rule for tie-down roping will be implemented. The rule will read: "In the tie-down roping class, an exhibitor will receive a no score for that run if they bring the animal over backwards with the animal landing on its back or head with all four feet in the air."

Effective immediately, the "use of any drug, chemical, foreign substance, surgical procedure or trauma that would alter a horse's normal tail function" be added to the prohibited inhumane practices set forth in AQHA Rule VIO204.

Effective immediately, AQHA stewards can show at AQHA events that they are not assigned to steward.

Effective immediately, allow hydroxyzine to be submitted on a medication report form as long as all requirements of AQHA Rule VIO403 are met.

Effective January 1, 2018, and with respect to the medication rules that govern show horses, furosemide (Lasix) will be removed from the list of conditionally permitted therapeutic medications and added to the list of forbidden drugs or substances in AQHA Rule VIO401.

Develop and publish a list of medications that can be reported on a medication report form as long as all requirements of AQHA Rule VIO403 are met. Develop and publish a list of forbidden substances.

Effective January 1, 2018, add hair testing to AQHA Rules VIO302 and SHW120.1.

The AQHA Animal Welfare Commission, which was created by the Executive Committee in 2012, reports directly to the Executive Committee, which evaluates all proposals in relation to the current state of the industry. The Animal Welfare Commission serves as AQHA's primary body for rules, policies and procedures related to all areas of animal welfare. In addition, the commission oversees the educational processes associated with AQHA officials responsible for animal welfare.

The Animal Welfare Commission's mission is to provide a framework for its members to 1.) Identify issues negatively affecting the welfare of the American Quarter Horse, 2.) Stay current on all animal welfare issues and 3.) Recommend actions that will help to protect the American Quarter Horse from inhumane practices and AQHA and its members from the negative impacts associated with those practices. The AQHA Animal Welfare Commission, in an effort to do right by the horse, will share discussion, action items and recommendations with alliance partners.

DON'T LET DEWORMING MYTHS KEEP YOU UP

SmartPak offers myth-busting facts on deworming

PLYMOUTH, MA – Deworming – every horse owner has done it, but there is often confusion surrounding when to do it, how often to do it, and what product to use. Smart-Pak has heard some of the most common myths surrounding this common practice, and is here with expert advice to help clear the air and demystify deworming!

"Many horse owners have been deworming their horses the same way for a long time, based on recommendations from years ago that no longer apply," said Dr. Lydia Gray, SmartPak's Staff Veterinarian and Medical Director. "By taking a more modern approach to parasite control that is based on the latest science, we can do a better job of protecting our horses from damage due to internal parasites."

Myth: Rotating dewormers prevents resistance and is still the best way to protect against parasites.

Of the three chemical classes that horse owners were advised 30 to 40 years ago to rotate between, parasites have become widely resistant to one of them (benzimidazoles), somewhat resistant to another (pyrantel), and are showing emerging resistance to the third (macrocyclic lactones like ivermectin and moxidectin). So when horse owners give a benzimidazole like fenbendazole or oxibendazole, few if any worms may be killed. The best way to protect your horse is by only using dewormers that are effective against parasites.

Myth: Targeted deworming is a ton of work (and expensive!).

The fact is, targeted deworming is actually less work and less expensive and more effective! If a horse's fecal comes back less than about 200 eggs per gram (of feces), then the horse is likely a low egg-shedder and only needs to be dewormed twice a year. If the results show more than 500 eggs per gram, then the horse is likely a high egg-shedder and needs to be dewormed more often, maybe four to six times during the grazing season in your area.

Myth: A horse doesn't need to be dewormed because the fecal always comes back negative.

It's critical to realize that a negative fecal egg count test does not mean a horse is parasite-free. Believe it or not, there is little correlation between fecal egg count results and a horse's parasite load. A horse with a negative fecal still almost assuredly has intestinal parasites—those parasites simply are not actively shedding eggs. Failing to deworm based on a negative fecal could have serious health consequences. The American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) recommends that even horses with a negative fecal, or those categorized as low shedders, be dewormed 1-2 times annually.

Myth: Horses that never leave the barn don't need to be dewormed.

While horses do technically get "infected" with parasites, it doesn't happen exactly like getting infected with a contagious disease like influenza or rhino (Equine Herpes Virus). With parasites, a horse can re-infect himself with his own intestinal worms (yuck!). So even if you have just one horse that never goes off-site, he could still have quite a parasite load just from the eggs he himself passes and re-ingests.

Myth: Horses should be dewormed regularly year-round.

An expert in parasitology once compared deworming horses to mowing your lawn. In the North, you wouldn't mow your lawn in January, as the grass doesn't grow then. And in the South, you wouldn't cut grass in August because, again, it's probably not actively growing then. So, if you're in a more northern climate, you may be able to refrain from giving dewormers when parasites aren't active.

"There are factors such as geographic location and your horse's parasite egg shedding status, just to name a few, that should be considered when developing a parasite control plan," added Gray. "It's important to remember to work alongside your local veterinarian, as they know the area and your horse's health best."
