## AMATEUR DIVISION CONDITIONS APPROVED FOR TRIAL YEAR

The National Reining Horse Association (NRHA) Executive Committee recently finalized and approved conditions for a trial phase an amateur division.

For 2020, any producer of an NRHA-approved non pro derby who wants to offer an amateur division that meets the criteria can submit a request for approval to the NRHA office.

The criteria are as follows:

- To compete in the amateur division, the same horse/ rider must be cross-entered into the NRHA-approved non pro derby. The show conditions will govern which level(s) must be entered.
- There will only be one level of amateur. Added money cannot exceed half of the Level(L) 4 added money.
- Riders entering the amateur division must be non pros as defined in the NRHA Handbook.
- Riders must abide by the non pro ownership rules as outlined in the NRHA Handbook.
- During the test period, this will be classified as a Category 11 class.
- All other NRHA rules apply.

The following riders are excluded from competing in the amateur division:

- Youth (as defined by the youth membership require-

ments in the NRHA Handbook).

- Legal dependents of professional equine trainers.
  - A legal dependent is defined as being officially claimed as a dependent on a tax return.
- Spouses or legal partners/mates of professional equine trainers.

Partner/mate status will only be accepted when the civil status is legally and lawfully registered in the country/state of residence. All relationships must be current and lawful.

- A “professional equine trainer” is defined as someone who handles the mounted preparation of a horse with the intent to improve the horse’s performance in any equine discipline (as defined in the NRHA Handbook).
- Anyone who has exceeded NRHA lifetime earnings of \$100,000 in Category 2, 6, and 8 as of 12/31/19 or is currently eligible for Level(L) 4 non pro only.

Note: NRHA judges and breeders are eligible to compete in the amateur division if they meet the required criteria listed above.

“We’re glad to be able to provide an opportunity for flexibility in our programs to allow growth in NRHA competition,” remarked NRHA President Mike Hancock. “We’re approaching this trial phase with anticipation that it could

# SELECT NRHA EVENTS HELP PAINT REINERS EASILY QUALIFY FOR THE 2020 APHA WORLD SHOW

If you have a Paint reining horse and dreams of competing for the title of APHA world champion—along with more than \$40,000 added in Challenge classes—APHA World Show qualification is made extra easy with the following National Reining Horse Association events. These NRHA shows count toward the [qualification requirements](#) for the 2020 APHA World Championship Show.

Qualifying for the APHA World Show isn't hard—simply compete at a minimum of two approved events (or pay \$1,000 buy-in per show), and your horse is qualified to compete in ANY class and eligible division at the APHA World Show; the 2020 World Show takes place September 21 – October 4, 2020 in Fort Worth, Texas. Special qualification exceptions apply to certain classes (no qualification is required for participation in added-money challenge classes, for instance), but all world championship events require qualification by participation. The qualification period for the 2020 Open/Amateur World Show is June 1, 2019, through May 31, 2020; no qualification is required for the AjPHA Youth World Championship Show, which takes place June 22 – July 5, 2020.

Any APHA-approved show counts toward qualification for the APHA Open/Amateur World Show, but we've made it easier for reiners by including the following NRHA events.



If a horse wins the first go round, the pressure is on. "That's the one to watch. Can he do it again?" The challenge is real. Everyone anticipates the action to come...

Craig Johnson and Lenas Gyrator (Doc O'Lena X Freckles Meternmaid by Jewels Leo Bars) aced the first go of the Superstakes with a 222, so when they entered the arena for their second work, every eye was watching. Quietly and deliberately, they walked to the center of the arena... then let it all hang out!

Their circles defined exquisite control on a loose rein, with fiery spins punctuating the pattern. The longer they worked, the bolder they looked, charging into the rollbacks and stop, then finishing with a great backup.

The crowd went wild, but Lenas Gyrator just dropped his head and started to the gate with the air of someone who knew his was a job well done.

Then, when Craig dismounted and began to lead him out, the little bay stallion stopped and turned his head slightly toward the audience, as if to say, "So, how DID you like that, folks?"

They loved it and so did the judges, who scored him a 226.5 - the highest score of the weekend - and a clean sweep, first go, second go, average.

"He amazes me!" said Johnson about his mount.

"He's getting more mature - and becoming stronger as he matures. He has such a good mind and attitude. I said after he won the Lazy E Classic that he's the perfect combination of really quiet and really stingy, and he's just getting better. He's totally focused, and it's completely natural for him. Reining is like a game - to see how well he can do. For me, it's a great feeling to know that no matter how hard I ask him, he'll do it."

Lenas Gyrator is owned by Bar S Quarter Horses of Alton, Illinois. "We got him from the Mullendore Ranch, when they asked us to sell him as a two year old," continues Johnson. "Sam Powell had started him, so he had the right foundation. When we got him down here that November, he was a little scrawny but he had a lot of talent!" Already qualified for the 1993 AQHA World Show in reining, Lenas Gyrator will be started in cutting by Doug Jordan. "Then we'll show him in the reining at the World Show, and decide where to go from there."

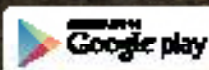
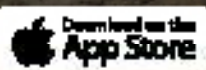

# Sizzling Summer Excitement...



## Limited Open Champions Albert Burton & Fast Forward Artie

In the Limited Open division, it was the Albert Burton show. Last year, Burton, of Grayslake, Illinois, captured the Superstakes Limited Open Championship. "Could he repeat the win?"

Not only could he repeat, he went one better than last year - winning **both** champion and reserve champion honors in the Limited Open Division!

In the first go, Burton finished tied second on Fast Forward Artie (Pine Fast Forward X Artifice Bar) and Mighty Red Rosie (Mister Mighty Pine X Bar Bea Doolin) with scores of 212. He came back in the second go to score a 217.5 on Fast Forward Artie - good for first - and a 215.50 on Mighty Red Rosie - to clinch second place.

Fast Forward Artie's two run composite score earned him the Superstakes Limited Open Division Championship. The graceful brown gelding was awarded the Mehl Lawson bronze, Saddlesmith Saddle, Superstakes Champion Trophy Buckle sponsored by Pard's Western Shop, and a set of Professional Choice Sport Medicine Boots.

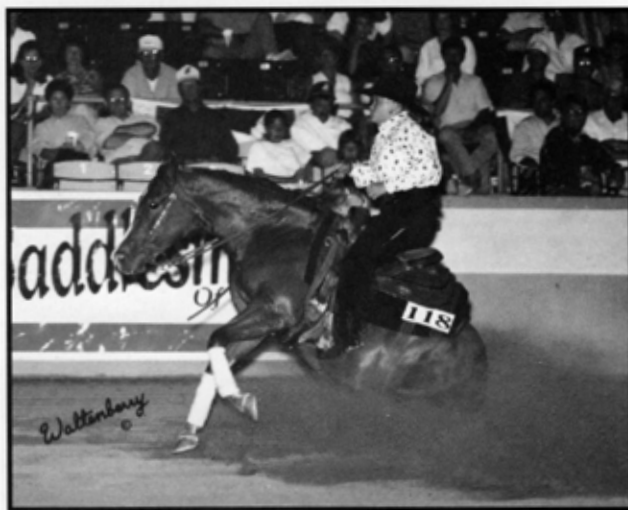
Artie, owned by David E. McNiece of Westminster, Ontario, earned nearly \$2800 for the win, but big wins are nothing new to this equine athlete. The gelding was the Limited Open winner of the 1992 NRHA Futurity, with Burton aboard, and was also an NRHA Lazy E Classic open division finalist. After a short rest, Fast Forward Artie will be ridden by his owner, David McNiece, in the Limited Non Pro classes during the 1994 season.

Mighty Red Rosie, owned by Diane Eppers and Terry F. Sroka of Grayslake, Illinois, was the reserve champion of the Limited Open Division. Her share of the Limited Open prize money was over \$2200. Future plans for Rosie also call for Limited Non Pro classes for owner Terry Sroka.

All in all, it was a great weekend once again for Albert Burton - a repeat performance of his Limited Open win. So the question for the 1994 Superstakes will be, "Can he **threepeat**?"

## Non Pro Champions Mandy McQuay & Jiffy Pop

In the Non Pro Division of the Superstakes, the winning team was small in size, but big in determination and grand in the stopping department. Mandy McQuay tied for second in both the first and second goes with identical scores of 113 to win the average and the Non Pro Championship on her little sorrel mare, Jiffy Pop, by Hollywood Dun It, out of Soda Pop.

Just how tall is Jiffy Pop?

"Well," admits Mandy McQuay, "if she were a hunter, she'd be classified as a pony!"

Commenting about the little mare after the Superstakes, she added, "She's not as fast, big or pretty as others, but she's cute and athletic."

"Tonight, I felt good about it - she felt good. I know she has a disadvantage of being so little, but I always know she'll stop." Mandy's confidence in her mount was obvious as she worked, blazing into the stops and rollbacks, delivering each one smoothly and stylishly.

Mandy and Jiffy Pop earned nearly \$2700, a Mehl Lawson Bronze, a Saddlesmith Saddle, the Superstakes Champion Buckle, and a set of Professional Choice Sport Medicine Boots.

Jeff Fox rode Hollywood's New Star by Hollywood Dun It out of Betsy Bar Cody to the reserve championship of the Non Pro Division. The duo scored 213 to tie for second in the first go, then won fifth in the second go with a 209 for second place in the average. Jeff, an agribusiness student at Texas A & M, bought the bright buckskin mare from Doug Carpenter of Hernando, Mississippi, after the Lazy E Classic.

Jeff has been showing reiners for 2-1/2 years but has concentrated mostly on AQHA shows until recently. He won over \$1300 for the reserve finish, as well as a set of Professional's Choice Sports Medicine Boots.

A Real Glo Getter and Charles E. Smith of Westminster, MD, finished the trio of Hollywood Dun It get that walked away with the top three Non Pro honors at the Superstakes.

# SUPERSTAKES SIRE AWARDS

The Superstakes is about reining excellence - peak performance of world class equine athletes - but it is also about excellence in breeding. A premiere event of the NRHA year, the Superstakes is the place where stallions are able to share in the limelight and at the pay window.

This year, awards totaling over \$8,000 went to the sires of the top three horses in the Open, Limited Open and Non-Pro divisions. With 35 stallions eligible for prizes, the list of entries showcases the future of the industry.

1993's big winner in the sire category is a former Open Champion of the Superstakes, Hollywood Dun It, who won the event in 1987.

In only his first year to have get of age, Hollywood Dun It, owned by Tim McQuay, of Tioga, Texas, had an unmistakable impact on the Superstakes Sire Awards program. With one winner in the open division (Melody's Dun It) and three in the Non Pro (Jiffy Pop, Hollywoods New Star, A Real Glo Getter), his get

earned four of the top nine slots and over \$3200 in sire awards.

Hollywood Dun It's accomplishments allowed him to join his sire, Hollywood Jac 86, on the elite list of Top Ten All Time Superstakes Sires. Not a bad start for a freshman Superstakes stallion!

The other five sire awards were distributed to five other stallions, each having one winner on the rolls.

Doc O'Lena, sire of Lenas Gyrator, earned \$1,855.91 for first in the Open, with second place and \$1100 and change going to Hall of Fame Inductee, the late Hollywood Jac 86 for Fancy Jac's reserve win. Pines Fast Forward's favorite son, Artie, earned Bernard Marquess over \$2,000 for his win in the Limited Open.

Mister Mighty Pine, sire of Mighty Red Rosie, earned second place money in the Limited Open, for owner, Tom Kosty. Finally, Bill Horn's never-to-be-overlooked Be Aech Enterprise added to his stranglehold as the all time leading Superstakes sire with Be Aech Enterprise's third place finish. □

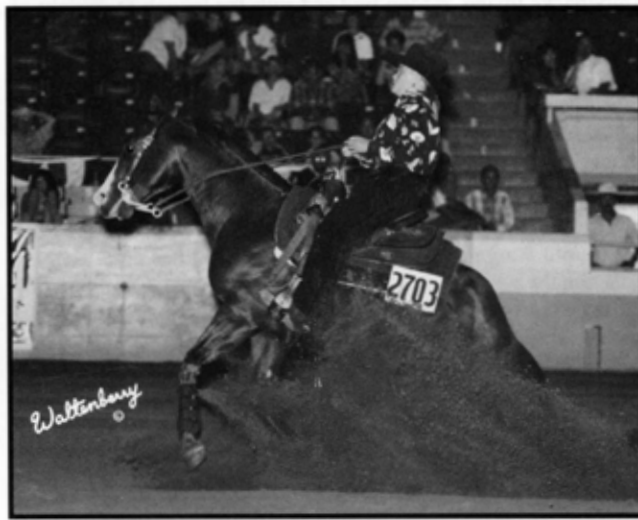


Saddlesmith Open Champions

She continued, "Carrying the series through three events (the NRHA Derby, the Superstakes, and the NRHA Futurity) showcases the industry's premiere performers in both the Open and Non Pro."

In the Non Pro Division of the Saddlesmith Reining, Mandy McQuay piloted Jodies Doc Tari (Taris Catalyst X Royal Jodie Bar) to a familiar place - first! The 1992 Saddlesmith Non Pro Series Champions repeated their 1992 Superstakes win, scoring a 220 to earn the Mehl Lawson Bronze and \$2415.97.

"I really like him", said Mandy about her mount, Jodies Doc Tari, or J.D., as he is affectionately called. The stallion has been a consistent winner, even while working reining performances into a spring breeding schedule.

Like Johnson, Mandy moved into a commanding lead in Saddlesmith Series standings. She had placed second at the NRHA Derby Saddlesmith event, and her total put her well over the

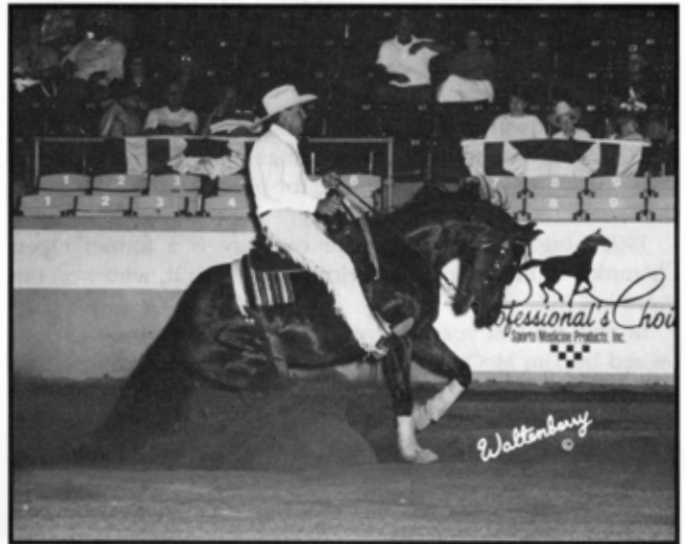

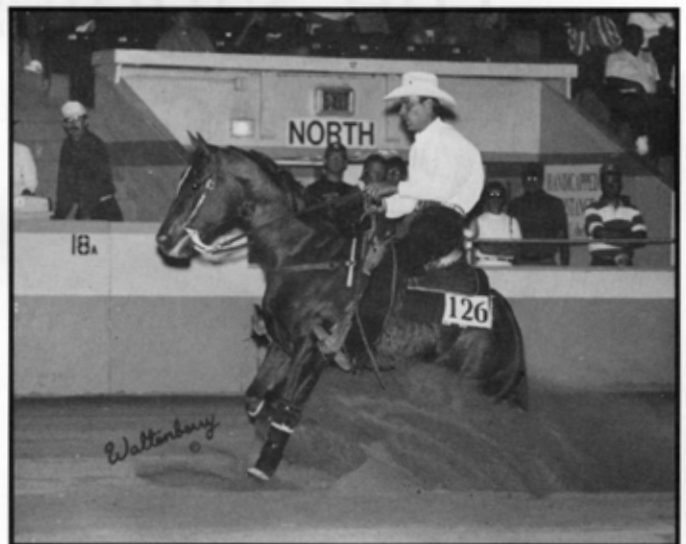

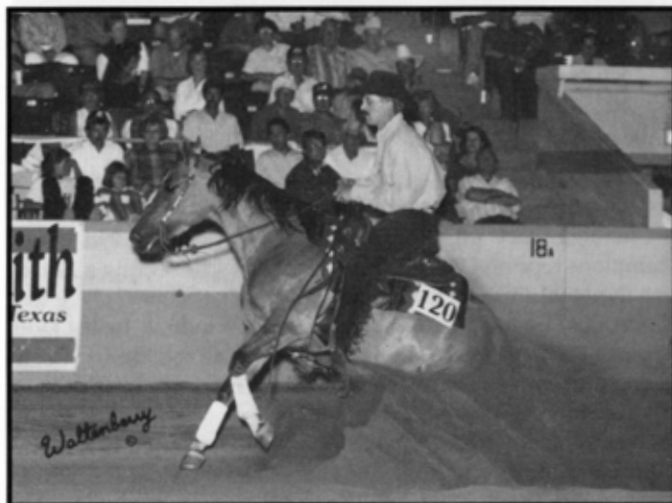

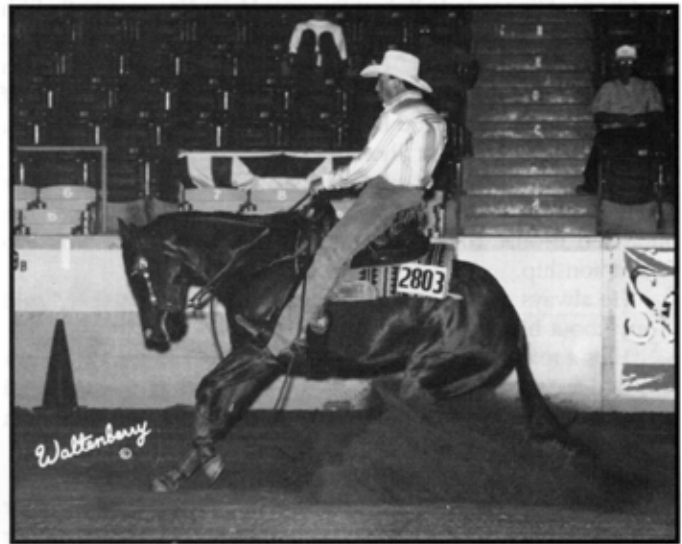

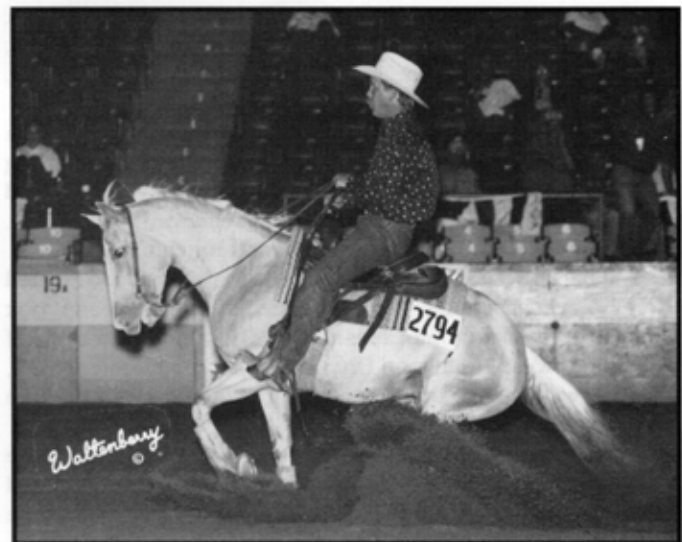

"His capability of total concentration is really rare for a stallion, but even at home, he's that way. I don't need to ride him more than about twenty minutes at a time because by then he's done all he needs to. His personality is so good, even my ten year old daughter, Sarah, rides him."

Lenas Gyrator earned \$6263, a Mehl Lawson Bronze, a Saddlesmith Trophy Saddle, the Superstakes Champion Trophy Buckle from Rod's Western Palace, and a set of Professional Choice Sport Medicine Boots for the win.

For Johnson, it was his second Superstakes Open victory. His first came in 1984, aboard Mainly Martha.

Fancy Jac (Hollywood Jac 86 X A Great Star), owned by Sally W. Brown of Maple Plain, Minnesota, tied for second in the first go with a 220, and was second in the second go with a 223 to earn the Superstakes Open Reserve Championship.

The dun mare finished second at the NRHA futurity in 1992, and Doug Milholland is understandably impressed with her. "She's probably the most attentive horse I've ever ridden. From the first day I rode her, she got right down to business. As a three year old in cold weather, I would work her good, get off her, and as I'd lead her back to the barn, she would buck and kick like she hadn't even been ridden. If I got back on, she was all business."

"She's got this quality riding her - I never worry about her running off - no matter how fast she's going, she comes right back to you. She's an easy keeper, doesn't require much maintenance, and seldom more than twenty to thirty minutes of riding. She's on a diet, but just stays fat."

"We'll go to Reno next, then maybe freestyle with her."

"She's maybe not the most dynamic horse I've ever had but I'll take her kind of honesty over exceptional talent, because she's always there for a paycheck. I've had a few exceptionally honest horses over the years, and she marks up there with them."

Tim McQuay, of Tioga, Texas, and Melodys Dun It (Hollywood Dun It X Stages Melody) were fourth in the first go with a 219, then came back strong to place third in the second go with a 221, winning third in the average and earning a total of nearly \$1900 for owner Jennifer Newel Easton of Stillwater, Minnesota.

Melodys Dun It, who tied for third at the '92 NRHA Futurity, was one of four Hollywood Dun It horses to earn paychecks at the Superstakes. □

memorable performances by top-level competitors. Craig Johnson sweetened his Superstakes victory by winning the \$5,000 added Saddlesmith Open Reining, with Smart Chic Olena, owned by The Smart Ones, Gainesville, Texas. He collected nearly three thousand dollars and a Mehl Lawson Bronze for the win.

Craig and Smart Chic Olena had also won the first leg of the Saddlesmith series - at the NRHA Derby in St. Paul, but Craig went into the Superstakes in second place on the standings roster. Doug Milholland had placed two horses, Catalyst Too and Fancy Jac, and was leading the race with \$3213.72, nearly \$600 ahead of Johnson. That all changed at the Superstakes, when Johnson moved into the lead with well over \$5000 won - now over \$2,000 in front of Milholland.

Smart Chic Olena, by Smart Little Lena and out of Gay Sugar Chic, is definitely a horse with "star quality". The eight year old stallion had already won over \$100,000 in cutting competition before being started in reining - and he was an instant natural at his new event, placing his very first time out. He won the \$2,000 added open at the NRHA Futurity and Championship Show at Oklahoma City, then won the Lazy E Open in April.

"He's a cool horse," says Johnson. "And the great thing is the amount of pressure I'm putting on him is only scratching the surface of what the cutters did. Reining is fun to him - kind of what they did before going to the cutting pen. He thinks he's warming up and the hard stuff must be coming later!"

Reserve honors went to Rocky Dare, aboard Sun Dappled, owned by John & Linda Pape of Wilmington, Ohio. Sun Dappled, by Zans Diamond Sun, was a top ten finisher at the 92 NRHA Futurity. In third place was Bruce Liggett, on Right This Minnick, owned by Kent and Becky Le Doux of Vinton, Louisiana. □
