SPINNING AND SLIDING TO WINS IN NORTHERN CALIFORNIA

Nearly 200 exhibitors recently beat the COVID-19 pandemic blues by competing in the successful, well-run third and fourth affiliate shows of the West Coast Reining Horse Association. With over 1,000 actual entries, it proved to be the largest show for the WCRHA in quite a few years. Five days of showing, from June 24 - 28, gave trainers, Non Pros, and youth plenty of opportunities to get “in the pen” under the watchful eyes of NRHA judges Kelly Sapp, from North Carolina, and Mark Turner, from Indiana. The double affiliate show was held at the beautiful Murieta Equestrian Center in Rancho Murieta, California. The Third Affiliate started the week off, with a full slate of classes going through mid-Friday, at which time the Fourth Affiliate show, with duplicate classes, began.

The Equestrian Center and WCRHA directors put in place COVID-19 health restrictions that ranged from allowing only exhibitors, trainers, owners, and essential personnel on the show grounds to encouraging the wearing of masks and social distancing. The viewing stands were off limits for spectators, and there were designated entrance and exit gates into the show and warm-up pens.

One horse in particular slid and spun his way to multiple wins for his trainer and Non Pro owner. NRHA Professional

Liz Rammerstorfer and Like Madd won the Championships in all three levels of the first set of Novice Horse Open classes with a score of 71.5. Not to be outdone, owner Kelly Staley showed him in several classes during the five days and placed first, second, or third in all entered in addition to winning the Rookie 2 and Prime Time Rookie with a whopping 72.5! Like Madd is a seven -year old gelding by Maddox and out of Peppys Chexy Diva. He was bred, raised, and trained by Christian and Liz Rammerstorfer.

Another horse that enjoyed multiple wins was Mister Smartypants. With a 72.5, “Smarty” and NRHA Trainer Gabe Davide bested 45 other entrants to win the Championships of the three Novice Horse Open classes in the fourth Affiliate show. “Smarty” was also Co-Champion of the Limited Open on the first day. Smartypants is a seven-year old, sorrel gelding owned by Eileen and Gordon Maxinoski. He is by Smart And Shiney and out of Peppys Lady Di.

Excelling in the Youth classes was Lauren Hanson showing Xtra Dream Step, owned by her dad, David Hanson. Lauren scored 70s and 71s to win firsts and seconds in the four Youth classes that she entered. She also did well in the Non Pro classes. Xtra Dream Step is an eight-year old gelding by Magnum Chic Dream. Lauren serves as one of the Youth Representatives for WCRHA. She plans to attend Texas A&M in the Fall of 2021.

Coming out on top of both Rookie 1 and Rookie 2, with a score of 70.5, was Mackenzie McDowell and her own Rio Killer Gun. Reserve honors in Rookie 1 went to Cindy Laver and her Revolutionic with 69. Reserve in Rookie 2 was Like Madd and Kelly Staley with a 70. Kelly and Like Madd also won the Prime Time Rookie with Lara Prindiville and her Step Like A Star close behind with a 69.5. Cindy and Revolutionic also won the WCRHA Green class. Brianna Madill and Spook Dunit were a close second with 68.5.

Finishing the day were twenty-four Snaffle Bit/Hackamore entries. Jason Richards was Champion with Fine Whizkey owned by Kimbal Griffith earning a 70.5 from the judges. With scores of 70, a three-way split for Reserve awards went to Brooke Boyle showing her dad's Hollywood Joe Cash, Eric Laporte showing Michell Kimball's Sugar Baby, and Eric also showing Brian Nicolaides' Magnum Rowdy Dream.

Day two began in the cool of the morning with nineteen eager riders in their first or second year of showing reiners, the WCRHA Green as Grass class. Lara Prindiville was the Champion of the Prime Time Non Pro class with a score of 72. For riders aged 60 and over, the Masters Non Pro at WCRHA shows continue to get bigger every year. Nineteen, very competitive entries showed in this class. Jim Grech with his Sparkle Whiz A Banjo came out on top with his 71.5. Close behind, with scores of 71, were three reiners who tied for the Reserve: Cady Shaw with Xtra Playful Step, Debi Murnan with Jacs Red Pine, and Kathleen Cook with Chics Double Magnum.

With scores of 70, the Reserve in Level 1 was split between Jan Humphrey, riding her Tivitos Top Starlet, and Jordan Larson showing My Lucky Jersey, owned by Disa Cameron-Miller. In the Level 2, Liz showed Cady Shaw's Xtra Playful Step to a 69.5 to be Co-Reserve Champion with Gabe Davide showing Mister Smartypants, owned by Eileen Maxinoski. Jordan Larson reined Gunna Outshine Ya, owned by Virginia Langley, to the Reserve in Level 3 with a 71 score.

The score held through the more than four hours of runs, and the duo was able to claim all three Championships in the end. Close behind in the Level 1 with a 72 was Kelly Keenan aboard Smart Smokin Mobster, owned by Craig Stonesifer II. Reserve in Level 2 was split four ways between Kelly and Smart Smokin Mobster, Martin Padilla on Jennifer Fisher's Midnite Whizkey Run, Jason Richards on Ann Jeppesen's Shine Kitty Shine, and Jordan Larson on Maria Livert's Mobsters Tears, all with scores of 72. There was a three-way tie for Reserve in the Level 3 class: Kelly and Smart Smokin Mobster, Jordan and Mobsters Tears, and Jesus Chavez on Grace Angelos' New Wimp In Town.

Late morning saw more than fifty riders getting ready for their Rookie classes. Taylor Banks enjoyed the victory of winning the Championship of Rookie 1 with a 71 on Rickybakinhollywood as well as the Co-Reserve with AR Oakies Last Stand, both horses owned by Kristie Banks. 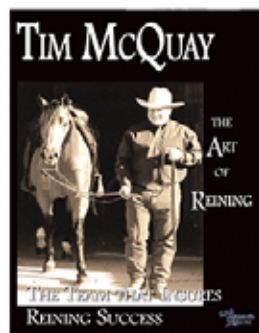
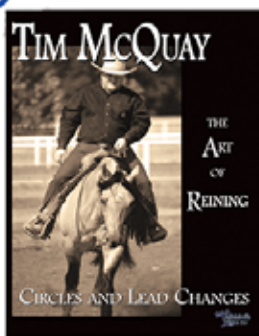
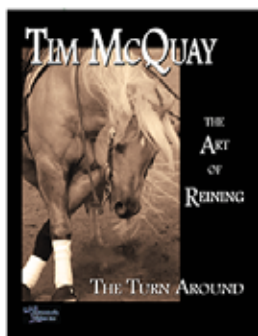
Gunners Custom Rose ridden by Martin Padilla

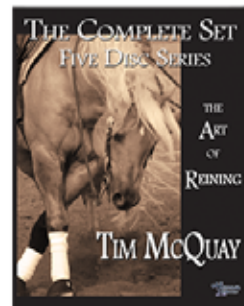

NEW RULES FOR 2020 ADEQUAN® NORTH AMERICAN AFFILIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS QUALIFICATIONS

When the National Reining Horse Association Board of Directors met on July 2, a key discussion involved the qualification route for affiliate reiners hoping to compete in the 2020 Adequan® North American Affiliate Championships (NAAC) at the NRHA Futurity November 26 – December 5.

With the looming possibility of COVID-19 restrictions impacting future shows, along with the number of events having already been cancelled, the Board approved the Affiliate Committee’s proposal that anyone receiving a score higher than a zero at an Affiliate Regional Championship be eligible to enter that class at the NAAC. It was felt that this solution would encourage people to attend the ARCs and support the affiliate program without limiting the number of horses that will attend the NAAC.

The Board also removed the existing stipulation that if someone competes in a class at an ARC, they are unable to compete at another ARC. So, for 2020, riders will be allowed to participate in multiple regional championships with one exception. If they win a class, they cannot compete on the same horse in the same class in another ARC (for example, a horse and rider that won the Non Pro ARC class at the Northwest Affiliate Regional Championships would not be allowed to compete in the Non Pro ARC class at the Southwest Affiliate Regional

Championships).

“We feel that this is a positive solution that protects all the different components of the affiliate program,” said NRHA Affiliate Committee Chairman Kelly Brummett. “We’re still supporting the ARCs by requiring that people attend one to qualify. The clubs and affiliates that commit the work and effort every year are an essential and very appreciated part of this program, and we want to do all we can to help their events.”

Another benefit for exhibitors is, since qualification from the ARC is not limited to the top 10, people will not be bumped out of qualifying in their own ARC by people coming from other regions to compete.

If you have ever thought you wanted to be a part of the NRHA’s Affiliate program, this is the year to see what it’s all about.

Affiliate Committee Staff Liaison Sara Honneger is excited about the possibilities created by these measures. She said, “If you have ever thought you wanted to be a part of the NRHA’s Affiliate program, this is the year to see what it’s all about. 2020 has been a difficult year for so many, but maybe these new rules will give NRHA members a chance to try this program that we are so passionate about. We hope to see everyone at the Adequan® North American Affiliate Championships at the NRHA Futurity.”

August 19 – 22, 2020 in Wiener Neustadt / Austria

July 13th is the first closing date for the show, which this year is endowed with \$57,000-added and will be held in Wiener Neustadt from August 19th to 22nd. The announcement can be found on www.showmanager.info. Here you can also enter your horses online.

Riders from nine nations have already entered their horses. Apart from Austria, Germany, Italy, Belgium, Switzerland, Hungary, Poland, and Slovakia will be competing. The Austrian Futurity for 3- and 4-year-old horses is open for all horses and is announced in four levels. All classes are NRHA approved. In the Futurity classes, which are endowed with \$48,000-added money, 3- and 4-year-old horses can be presented either two-handed in a Snaffle Bit or Hackamore or one-handed in a Bridle. In addition to the prize money, there will be eight Lawson Trophies, six Morrisons, two Morgan Trophies & sixteen Silversmith Champion Buckles, as well as sixteen Reserve Champion Buckles and numerous non-cash prizes. The show is also a qualifier for the NRHA European Championship 2021.

The Austrian Futurity starts on Tuesday afternoon, August 18th, with the first two Ancillary classes, Rookie Level 1 and Level 2, which will be run concurrently. On Wednesday, August 19, the go-rounds of the 3-year-old Futurity Open and Non Pro will take place, and on Thursday, August 20, the go-rounds of the 4-year-old Futurity. The finals in the different levels are

then scheduled for Friday and Saturday. The show will be judged by Lara Maiocchi (ITA), Adi Wagner (GER), Adam Heaton (GBR), Ricardo Bordignon (ITA) and Ralf Hessel-schwerdt (GER). Bit Judge is Laura E. Faris (USA).

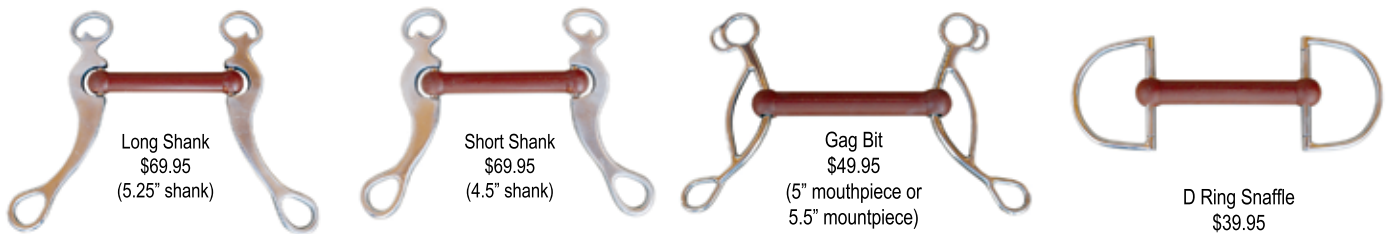

Southeast Affiliate Regional Championship Show originally scheduled for August 19–23 in Perry, Georgia. Fortunately, reiners came together to find a solution and a new home for the event.

According to HDRHA Board Member Kyndall Peeples, there were discussions with the Florida Reining Horse Association about the future of the event and the FRHA Board offered to run the Affiliate Regional Championships at its show in Jacksonville, Florida. Peeples noted, "This is the best option for our region and its membership. We know FRHA will highlight the ARC with pride and give it the recognition it deserves."

The National Reining Horse Association Board of Directors gave its approval to the location change during its July 2 meeting. The 2020 Southeast Affiliate Regional Championship will now be hosted by the FRHA October 29 – November 1, in Jacksonville, Florida.

The Jacksonville Equestrian Center provides exhibitors with a large indoor coliseum and a large outdoor covered arena with additional outdoor riding areas. There are 470 permanent stalls at the facility as well as five local hotels (within 5 miles) and 80 camper hookups on site.

It's a popular and familiar facility for reiners as the Florida Reining Classic, an NRHA Top 20 event, is held there each February. Besides the onsite accommodations, there are several restaurants nearby and an international airport within a 25-minute drive.

The FRHA has committed to hosting the ARC classes and providing the roughly \$4,000 in added money that was planned by HDRHA. The ARC classes will run with the second slate of NRHA classes throughout the four-day show.

FRHA Secretary Shannon Rafacz noted, "We are fully staffed and ready to handle this event as we understand its importance to our Southeast membership. We will work hard to make this a true regional championship, putting emphasis on the ARC classes and providing championship awards for each division, including the short stirrup."

She continued, "We are prepared to award down to 10th place for each ARC. This particular show was already slated to host a derby, futurity, and 7-Up. The FRHA was not able to hold its March or May shows so the club opted to pool the monies and put together a larger show, pushing our projected total added money over \$57,000 for this event."

"We realized what we had as a combined force - how many horses we had in training, how many babies on the ground, how many yearlings. Between the two of us, we had a dozen really great mares. It was time to take SBS to the next level and go big time. We have Arno Honstetter training out of our facility and he is doing a great job for us

as well as his own clients. We also keep a few horses with other trainers which keeps it exciting."

Story Book Stables is committed to a small but elite breeding program with their two stallions, Star Spangled Whiz and Wimpys High Bid, and an exceptional band of broodmares. "We are focused on our mares. People think we only breed to our own stallions, but we breed to outside stallions like Gunnatrashya, Voodoo and a few more. We have a great crop of twos and yearlings this year."

In 2019, Brenda realized it was time to seriously begin developing an Open program. "I'm not sure when we were bitten by the Open bug, but for sure, in 2019, I wanted trainers on Open horses, especially at the Futurity, not trying to make the Open Finals on my Non Pro horses."

In the fall of 2019, Story Book Stables purchased the 3-year-old Super Marioo. The rest is history with Cade McCutcheon's historic win on Super Marioo at the Futurity in not just the L4 Open, but in Level 2 and 3 as well. "What a way to end the first year of our Open Program!"

—Installing— **REVERSE GEAR**

Oklahoma trainer Carl McCuiston discusses his program for teaching horses to back.

“**B**ACKING IS such a natural part of the training process that it's hard to separate it from all the other things you teach a horse,” says Carl McCuiston of Wilson, Oklahoma. “If you go through your training, teach the horse to walk, trot, and lope, and then decide, all of a sudden, that it's time to teach him to back, you are making a mistake. You are asking the horse to back without having given

him the framework for it. I develop the back on my horses gradually, throughout the entire training process.

“When I ask a horse to back,” he continues, “I want him to give his head, stay collected, and move back quickly. I want to be able to keep him moving straight by using both the reins and my leg pressure, and I want to be able to control how fast he backs up. To do those things, I must have control of

his face, and must be able to collect him and move his front end and rear end in either direction.”

Engineering that kind of control begins on day one for McCuiston's young horses.

“When I start working a 2-year-old, the first thing I want him to learn is to bend laterally in both directions and give to the bit. I use a D-ring snaffle, and I pull his head around by moving

my arm out to the side, turning him around. I'll be pulling out from my shoulder at this stage, with very little bend in my elbow, because I'm actually pulling the horse's head to the side to teach him how to give to the bit. Later, as he learns to respond to pressure, a slight lift with my hand (bending at the elbow) will be sufficient to cue him to give his head and tuck his nose."

Carl adds, "As I pull to the right, for example, I also squeeze with the calf of my left leg, about 6 inches behind where my leg normally hangs. On some young horses that are really thick-sided or unresponsive, I lay a spur on them and push with it." But he cautions against poking with the spurs: "You don't want to make the horse mad or scared. You just want him to learn to respond to the cue."

Backing is first introduced casually. As a matter of course, much of Carl's original bending work is done on the fence. He'll ride the colt parallel to the fence, then pick up on the inside rein, turning into the fence to reverse directions. "In order to turn him into the fence, he's got to take a step back, then turn, and go."

Not only does this teach a colt to get his back end under him for turns and

roll-backs, it's also the framework for his stopping and backing.

McCuiston is quick to explain that, contrary to common practice, pressure with one rein is the foundation of the back. "I never *pull* straight back on both reins because I know I can't out-pull a horse. Instead, he learns to stop, turn, and back from primary pressure on one rein, with the other rein just steadying him. When you pull with both reins, the colt will usually pull against you. But when you apply pressure with one, he gives to that pressure because it's more difficult for him to brace against it. After the horse learns to give to rein pressure, you can pick up, and ask him with both reins, but if you have to apply pressure, go back to one rein."

When the horse gives his head to pressure, the next step is to collect him and make him arch or round his back so he can move back more easily. "If you drive the horse forward, drop his nose, collect him, and elevate the front end and arch his back, this puts him into position. The horse has to be collected in order to back, just like he does to lope slowly, or change leads. His back must be arched, not hollowed out, and he must be giving to the bit,

not resisting it."

Throughout the horse's training, Carl teaches him to collect himself. "I'll get the horse loping, and let him go faster. Then I take hold of him, to slow him down. As he slows down, I'll drop my outside leg back a couple of inches behind where it normally is and squeeze to push his rear end up under him—while maintaining his head position. I also change my body position from being up in the saddle to down and relaxed. Pretty soon, I can collect the horse from any speed by leg pressure, body position, and contact with his mouth."

The rider's body position is crucial throughout the backing process. When a rider asks a horse to back, he should be sitting deep in the saddle, with his own back relaxed. "You need to be centered on the horse's back. If you are too far back, you cause more pressure on the kidney area and it's harder for the horse to elevate his back and collect himself."

He cautions against leaning as the horse backs. "If you lean forward, and the horse moves back fast, it will throw you even farther forward. If you lean back, you're out of the balance point for the horse."

When McCuiston asks for the back

in a horse farther along in his training, he picks up the reins and clucks to him, while maintaining the leg pressure. "Clucking is a personal preference," adds Carl. "Just be consistent with your signals. I cluck to my horses to back, and 'smooch' to them to go forward. The opposite would work just as well as long as you do the same thing every time."

If the horse is collected, and the rider picks up lightly on the reins, the horse should respond by taking a step back. If he does, release the pressure; if he doesn't, then increase the pressure on one rein, steadying with the other.

Throughout the training process and beyond, the secret to making a horse back properly and keep him doing it is to release when he gives in to the pressure. "Most people get into trouble when they don't realize that the horse is responding. In the beginning, don't overdo." Look for the subtle give. One step back is satisfactory. When the horse responds correctly, release the pressure, then ask him to back again, then release the pressure when he responds.

Remember, you keep a horse's back limber by putting pressure on one rein, then the other, so that he gives to the bit and tucks his head. If his head is down, his back is up. If his head is up, his back is hollowed out.

It's also safer to pull with one rein if you have to put pressure on the horse, because he is less likely to rear. "Sometimes with a nervous or hot horse, if you pull hard with two reins, he'll come right over backwards on you," Carl warns.

It's important to separate the stop from the back. Carl cautions against putting too much pressure on the rein immediately after a stop. "This can

cause a horse to brace on his front end. If the rider stops the horse and keeps right on pulling, the horse will often throw his head, because he doesn't know what you want him to do. Let him stand momentarily to separate the stop from the back."

Also, if you stop and immediately pull back, you stop the forward motion of the stop and encourage a sudden stop instead of the sliding, reining-type

stop. When you do 'whoa' him, make him finish his stop, collect him, then make him back a step.

As horses learn to respond to the cue to back, they normally speed up on their own as they get lighter. If Carl wants to hurry up a horse's back, he does so by increasing leg pressure, squeezing more with both legs, and clucking more—never by increasing pressure on the bridle. "Remember, with your bridle, you are controlling the horse's head position; increasing bridle pressure confuses him because he is already giving you the correct response by giving his head."

As the horse backs, Carl controls the direction of the back by the reins and by leg pressure. "If a horse starts to drift over to the right as he is backing, for example, the rider can bump him with his right leg to straighten him out."

Sometimes a horse is backing, but just isn't doing it smoothly or well.

Collection is often the problem, according to Carl. "If he's too elevated in the front with his rear too low, you have to elevate his back and get his hind end up before he can back. You see this a lot when a horse is not allowed to finish a deep stop before he is asked to back."

The reverse is also a problem. Sometimes a horse is too high behind and his front legs are not under him, and drag as he backs. This horse needs to be gathered up.

Even though backing is built on a pressure-release-pressure system, be careful not to jerk the horse's head.



"This will scare him. If you jerk, the horse's head goes up, he hollows out his back, and after a while, he'll refuse to back, or will run off. When a horse pulls against your rein pressure, pull with one rein; that bends the head, arches the back, and gets him back into position."

A common problem with novice riders is uneven reins. "The horse is not centered on the reins, so he is not going to back straight. If you are using both reins, the point of pulling should be in the center of the reins. If you're using more pressure on one side than another, the reins should work independently of each other," Carl points out.

Sometimes a horse has never had basic training, or has been injured or frightened and won't back at all. If that is the case, McCuiston will ride him into a fence corner. "I'll hold him there, not letting him go anywhere. If he tries to move his rear around to get out, I'll take his head to the side to prevent that. And I'll just keep asking him to take one step back. When he does, I'll reward him. Eventually, he learns what I am asking and I get him to back without using the corner."

Carl McCuiston

Originally from Fowler, Colo., Carl McCuiston attended Lamar Community College, in Lamar, to study horse training and management, then went to work for John Hoyt and Bob Caruth in Texas, before opening his own business in 1986.

In 1986, his first year at the NRHA Futurity, he placed in both the open and the limited open with Rita Kip, owned by Robert Caruth. He earned a total of \$22,000 in cow horse and reining futurities. He won two Palomino world championships (reining and working cow horse) aboard Heza Fancy Straw, owned by Patri-

cia Bennett, in 1987. In 1989, he won the Colorado, Amarillo Golden Spread, and Oklahoma Snaffle Bit (cow horse) futurities, with Solano Squeeky, owned by his daughter. In 1990, he showed Ris Key Business, owned by J.T. Pattison of Riverside, Tex., to the APHA Working Cow Horse World Championship.

Horse training at the McCuiston Ranch is a family affair. Carl's wife, Karen, also rides and shows. She, Carl, and daughter Resa make their home in Wilson, Okla., where the McCuistons operate a breeding and training facility.

What about the horse that takes a few steps back, then freezes? "Drive him forward before you ask him to go again. It allows you to collect him and get him out of that 'braced' position and into the position to back. If he has somewhere to go, he is less likely to rear."

Often a novice rider reports that his or her horse throws his head when asked to back. "Usually that means they need to spend some more time getting the horse to give to the bit before they try to back," says Carl.

McCuiston also cautions against depending on a bit to take the place of training. Too severe a bit can frighten the horse and result in more chance of injury to the rider. "People who progress to more and more severe bits eventually reach a point where there is nothing more severe to go to."

Carl prefers a snaffle-type bit for schooling his horses. "Depending on the horse's age and experience, I will use a D-ring or a shank bit with broken mouthpiece, but I want to stay with something I can pull sideways with."

"Overall," says McCuiston, "the key is to have enough control and communication with your horse so that he clearly understands what you are asking him to do and how to do it, and to be able to put him in the right position and help him through the maneuver. If you can do that, backing is just a natural part of the training process." 🐾

open-minded for everything. I never organized rules or restrictions against anything. I had the feeling our horsemen were enthusiastic for other breeds; that they did not want only the warmbloods."

Krober's vision was well-founded. Each breed introduced to Europe through Equitana has brought with it its own small market. If people bought western horses, they needed western tack. If they bought Paso Finos, they needed special gear. The global horse market has flourished through the efforts of one far-sighted horseman.

After Equitana '91, the reins to the fair will be given over to a British equestrian promotions company with a worldwide management base. Krober sold the rights to the show last December, but will remain as manager of Equitana until the year 2001.

Initial discussions between Krober and the new management company include bringing a similar fair to America every other year. Maybe Mr. Equitana has another good idea. 🐾
