The first Big European Reining Show in 2020:

## **AUSTRIAN REINING FUTURITY & NRHA SHOW 2020 IS ON!**

August 19 - 22, 2020 in Wiener Neustadt / Austria

Due to the Corona crisis, reiners all over Europe missed the big events so far. However, now the first big reining show in Austria is confirmed to happen: the Austrian Reining Futurity & NRHA Show 2020 at Helmut Schulz' beautiful facility in Wiener Neustadt. It is schedule for August 19 - 22, 2020. Due to Corona, the original purse of \$80,000-added had to be reduced to \$57,000-added with \$48,000-added in the Futurity classes.

The Austrian Futurity is open for all 3- and 4-year-old horses. There are four levels both in the Open and in the Non Pro and all classes are NRHA approved. In the Futurity classes both 3- and 4-year-old horses can be shown either two-handed in aSnaffle Bit or Hackamore or one-handed in a Bridle. Besides the purse, the event offers eight Lawson Trophies, six Morrisons, two Morgan Trophies & sixteen

Silversmith Champion Buckles, as well as sixteen Reserve Champion Buckles. Also, the show is a qualifier of the 2021 NRHA European Championship.

The enrollment is online on www.showmanager.info. The deadline is July 13, 2020. Horse can be entered after that with a late fee.

#### NRHA SUSPENDS 2020 WORLD TITLE RACE

In a unanimous decision, the National Reining Horse Association (NRHA) Board of Directors has suspended the 2020 NRHA World Title race.



Historically, NRHA World Titles, awarded in open, non pro, and youth divisions, are coveted recognition for horses and riders. The international race allows aged reining horses a chance in the spotlight and highlights reiners from around the globe.

However, this year, COVID-19 has led to and will continue to cause the cancellation of many events, both in the U.S. and around the world. The NRHA Board agreed that suspending the NRHA World Title Race was the only fair and equitable thing to do for the entire membership, worldwide.

"The NRHA World Champion titles have played an important part of NRHA," said NRHA President Mike

Hancock. "The titles have been won by exceptional people and horses demonstrating dedication, persistence, and talent. We wanted to be fair and uphold the integrity of the title. The

uncertainty that exists today makes this the right thing to do. We look forward to the Adequan® North American Affiliate Championships this year and an exciting race for World Championships in 2021!"

This decision comes just as NRHA is about to kick off the first major event of 2020: the NRHA Derby Presented by Markel, which runs June 13–21 at State Fair Park in Oklahoma City. NRHA is pleased to announce that reiners are so eager to return to the show pen that this year's entries are higher than those in 2019. ### THE RUN FOR A MILLION CANCELED FOR 2020

From the producers of The Run for a Million:

The goal of THE LAST COWBOY and RUN FOR A MILLION is to celebrate and grow the sport of reining. The inaugural RUN FOR A MILLION generated an excitement that spread beyond the world of reining to all western performance horse disciplines — it could be felt at cutting events, cow horse events, and even in the world of rodeo. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, it is not possible to produce and film THE LAST COWBOY or THE

RUN FOR A MILLION in August. We have made the difficult decision to postpone the event until it can be produced with the same energy and excitement we experienced at the

inaugural event.

All competitors who have qualified for the RM in the Rookie, Non Pro, and last year's open shoot out are still qualified for the event once a date is secured. Those who have paid entry fees but not yet competed for the qualifier may either allow that entry fee to carry over or they may have their entry fee refunded and re-enter once a date and schedule is released.

#### NRCHA DERBY CHAMPIONS CROWNED



The NRCHA Jack and Phoebe Cooke Memorial Derby is one of the largest and most prestigious events for 4- and 5-year-old reined cow horses. Shown two-handed in a snaffle bit or a hackamore, horses are judged in three preliminary events: rein work, herd work and cow work. Top scorers from the preliminaries advanced on to the clean-slate finals for a chance to win the coveted title of 2020 NRCHA Derby Champion and a share of the more than \$330,000 in total payout.

In additional to the popular Limited Aged Event, the Derby also offers a full slate of NRCHA-approved horse show classes and several spectaculars. The crowd-pleasing \$20,000 added CD Survivor Memorial Bridle Spectacular will took place the evening of Friday, June 12 at WestWorld of Scottsdale.

A thrilling day of reined cow horse action on Saturday, June 13, wrapped up the main event at the National Reined Cow Horse Association Jack and Phoebe Cooke Memorial Derby. Open and Non Pro riders took center stage at the WestWorld of Scottsdale in sunny Arizona. The top com-

bined score rode away with the prestigious NRCHA Derby Champion title and a share of more than \$330,000.

#### **Derby Open Champion**

To say it was a special night for the Justin Wright Performance Horses/ Wrights Quarter Horses crew would be an understatement. Several Santa Maria, California, professionals claimed spots in the clean-slate finals and are taking home major limited age event titles.

NRCHA Million Dollar Rider Justin Wright showed Scooter Kat (Kit Kat Sugar x Scooters Daisy Dukes x Dual Smart Rey) to the 2020 National Reined Cow Horse Association Derby Open championship title with an incredible 673.5 composite. Wright and Scooter Kat, owned by Eric Freitas, won all three go rounds of the Open Finals: 224 herd, 224.5 rein and 225 cow.

The winning team rode with \$33,550, a custom saddle by Bob's Custom Saddles, presented by Heaven Sent Ranch, a Gist Silversmiths custom buckle, sponsored by the Arizona Reined Cow Horse Association, a Preston Williams custom

snaffle bit, UltraCruz product, a Handmade Exotics gift certificate and product from Platinum Performance,

Together, the duo have earned several prestigious titles throughout the 2015 stallion's career, including the 2019 NRCHA Stakes Open championship and 2018 NRCHA Snaffle Bit Futurity® reserve open championship. This win put the stallion's lifetime NRCHA earnings over \$250,000.

#### **Derby Intermediate Open Champion**



Claiming the NRCHA Derby Intermediate Open win was Jared Jones aboard PRF Peptos Smart Cat (WR This Cats Smart x She Smokes Smart x Senors Lil Brudder). Jones, from Santa Maria, California, earned \$9,981 for his 660


composite (217.5 herd/ 219 rein/ 223.5 cow). The 4-year-old stallion is owned by Tori Simons.

#### **Derby Limited Open Champion**



Taking home the NRCHA Derby Limited Open title to Weatherford, Texas, is Daniel Sanchez and Reyny Day Nickle (Shiners Nickle x Tootsie Rey x Dual Rey).

Sanchez piloted Donna Russo's 2015 stallion, sired by Shiners Nickle and out of Tootsie Rey, by Dual Rey, to a 656 composite (219 herd/217 rein/220 cow). The win was accompanied with a \$4,414 paycheck. The team also earned \$5,935 for their third-place finish in the Intermediate Open Finals.



#### **Derby Level One Limited Open Champion**



In true cow horse fashion, the Level One Limited Open Derby all came down to the fence work. It was a battle till

the end for James Robert Marshall IV and Jesus Roman.

With a high cow work score of 219, JR Marshall and Playboy Powder (Bucks Little Playboy x Full Of Powder x Powder River Playboy) prevailed. The 2015 stallion, owned by Brett Weaver, scored a 214.5 in herd work and 214 in the rein work earlier in the week. Thanks to the 647.5 composite, the team won a \$3,770 paycheck, product from Platinum Performance, a head by Dennis Moreland Tack, a Gist Silversmiths custom buckle, UltraCruz product and a Cowtrac Systems.

#### **Derby Open Novice Horse Champion**






Heath marked a 214 in the herd work and 218.5 in the rein work. Her high fence work score of 222.5 sealed the deal on the win and \$7,376.

#### **Derby Intermediate & Novice Non Pro Champion**

### CD SURVIVOR MEMORIAL OPEN BRIDLE SPECTACULAR CHAMPION



Bridle spectaculars at NRCHA premier events were created to showcase the ultimate reined cow horse - the bridle horse. These seasoned veterans have spent years in programs that follow the traditional Vaquero training methods.

The CD Survivor Memorial Open Bridle Spectacular, named in honor of the late, great stallion owned by NRCHA breeder sponsor Holy Cow Performance Horses, is a \$20,000-added event that is filled with some of the best horses and horsemen and women in the country.

The 2020 Holy Cow Performance Horses CD Survivor Memorial Open Bridle Spectacular championship belonged to Nick Dowers and High Stressin Cat (WR This Cats Smart x Playguns Melody x Playgun). Dowers, of Dyer, Nevada, piloted the 2013 gelding, owned by Clint Marshall to a 220 in the herd work, 222.5 in the reining and a 221 down the fence.

The 663.5 composite earned a \$10,557 paycheck and a plethora of prizes including: a C.R. Morrison NRCHA bronze finished trophy, sponsored by the Arizona Quarter Horse Association, a Gist Silversmiths buckle, a gift ceri-



In addition to the \$2,010 win check in the Intermediate Open, the duo also tied for fifth place in the Open, collecting another \$3,901.

#### Non Pro Bridle Spectacular Champion

#### Open Two Rein Spectacular & Open Two Rein Champion



Reigning NRCHA Derby Open champions, Bet He Sparks and Clayton Edsall, returned to the prestigious premier event to capture two more championship titles - the Open Two Rein Spectacular and Open Two Rein.

The California horseman piloted Bet He Sparks (Bet Hesa Cat x Sparking Train x Shining Spark), owned by K & L Phillips, LLC, to a 148 in the herd work, 146.5 in the rein work and 151 in the cow work. The 445.5 composite score came with combined winnings of \$7,201, a CR Morrison bronzed finished trophy, UltraCruz product, a Dennis Moreland Tack headstall and Platinum Performance.

#### Non Pro Two Rein Spectacular & Non Pro Two Rein Champion



The Non Pro Two Rein Spectacular and Non Pro Two Rein championship titles belong to Lia Savas, of Central Islip, New York. #### **Open Bridle Champion**

The Paso Robles, California, horseman scored a 146.5 in the rein work and 149 down the fence for a composite of 295.5 and \$1,860 payday for owner Sarah Davis.

#### **Intermediate Open Bridle Champion**

Wyatt Fisher, of Nipomo, California, rode Prize Winning Gal (Smokums Prize x Ill Be A Winning Gal x Ill Be Smart), owned by his parents Jayson and Teresa Fisher, to first place in the Intermediate Open Bridle. The 295 composite score (144 rein/151 cow) was accompanied with \$420 in earnings. This is the second consecutive year this team has claimed the title.



**Limited Open Bridle Champion** 



Claiming the Limited Open Bridle championship, for owners, Scott and Darnell Trueblood, was Andrew Steiger aboard Cash Master T (Cat T Masterson x Nu Cash Box x Shining Spark). Steiger earned a 288.5 composite and \$1,275 paycheck.

Non Pro Bridle Champion



With a 144.5 in the rein work and big 150 down the fence, Ordway, Colorado, competitor, Debbie Crafton, captured the NRCHA Derby Non Pro Bridle title aboard A Quick Remedy (Very Smart Remedy x A Quick Prize x Smokums Prize).

The win was accompanied with a \$2,100 paycheck, CR Morrison bronze finished trophy presented by Schrack Drilling Company and Platinum Performance product.

## THE BASICS OF REINING By CHERYL Photos by Peri Hughes



Last month, in the October '90 issue, Dick discussed how to select your reining partner and give him the correct foundation through suppling exercises. This month, we're going to take that youngster for a spin...

Part II: The Maneuvers—Circles and Spins

NCE the colt has the foundation skills of softness side to side and in the poll and is moving away from leg pressure (see "Part I" last month), he is ready to begin learning maneuvers. The horse is graduating to a higher level of skills and building on the basics, but the exercises he learned are not forgotten.

"We review the basics every day, in every training session," says Dick Pieper. "We never stop fine-tuning those basic skills, and they form the foundation for learning each new maneuver."

#### The Circle

"We start a horse working on a circle in a three-phase program," says Dick. "First, we teach him to circle in a frame or circle position with his hip pushed a little to the inside and his nose tucked a little to the inside, following the arc of the circle. Next, we teach him how to redirect from the outside rein and finally, we work on speed control in the circle."

#### Circling In A Frame

The first part of Dick's circle program is teaching the horse to work a circle in a particular frame—that means nose and hip slightly to the inside. Dick explains, "Start by loping the horse on a lead, for instance the left lead, loping to the left in a circle. Support the horse's nose with the inside rein, and use outside leg pressure several inches behind the cinch keep his body in a flexed position."

The amount of bend is proportional to the size of the circle... the horse's body should be arced as an extension of the circle. The smaller the circle, the more pronounced the arc. "The horse will try to get out of position by dropping his shoulder to the inside and moving his head to the outside. Correct this by pulling straight back on the left rein, and pushing with the right leg. ALWAYS use your leg when you use your hands."

Make the correction, hold a few strides, then release. "It is a mistake to hold a horse in position," says Dick. "Instead, let the horse make a mistake, correct him, then release him again. That way, the horse learns that he has to hold the position—he doesn't rely on the rider to do it for him."

To introduce the spin (from left to right above), Dick begins walking in a circle about 15 feet in diameter. Keeping pressure on with his outside leg, he begins decreasing the size of the circle while maintaining forward motion and body position. When the horse's front end seems to be making a larger circle than his rear, keep the forward motion, but draw him down with some pressure on his nose from the inside rein and bump with the outside leg. Let him begin to cross over in front, then release and let him walk forward out of the turn.

Some practice and polish is required at this point. "The horse can't progress any further on circle work until you can ask him to take a lead, and he'll stay in a frame with a minimum of control. In a big circle, he should be able to stay in position all the way around, maybe having to be 'fixed' one time. He's ready to go on when he can maintain that body position."

Teaching The Redirect

The second phase of circle work is learning to guide off the outside rein while maintaining the frame or circle position. "We do this by teaching redirecting," explains Dick. "In a typical training session, I might take a three-year-old and work him on circle position for a few minutes to remind him to stay where he's put. Then I might go right to teaching the redirect."

To begin, Dick will again lope the horse. "Say we're loping on the left lead. I'll let him lope off on a straight line or slightly to the left. Visually, I will pick a tree or fence post that is out in front of me and go in more or less a straight line toward it. I'll then take the right rein and move the slack out of it, moving my hand across his neck to the left, sliding the rein across his neck."

According to Dick, the object is,





When a youngster can work quietly and isn't having any problems, Dick focuses on speed control. To ask the horse to speed up, he leans forward slightly and pulls his legs back a little, "chasing" the colt two or three times around a big circle.





"when I move the slack with the outside rein, the horse should go to the left—still in frame with the hip and nose slightly to the inside (left)." If the horse doesn't redirect when asked to with the outside rein, Dick will go ahead and make him move by pulling him over with the inside rein while pushing with his outside leg. Of course, as soon as the horse responds, pressure is released. "The important thing is that he doesn't drop his shoulder or put his head to the outside. If the horse gets out of position, put him back in place, then go on.


"Remember, you're just doing a slight


alteration of direction. Instead of a smooth-sided circle, envision a stop sign to get an idea of the degree of change." The change of direction is slight, but the horse learns to guide from the outside rein while keeping himself centered between the reins. "This is a good maintenance exercise, too," adds Dick. "I use it on my finished reining horses."

Speed Control

Dick usually works on speed control (speeding up and slowing down) about midway through or toward the end of the training session. He prefers waiting until the horse has been worked a while "and is not 'chargey' or having a problem with anything."

To regulate speed, Dick will lope the horse on a large circle, "then lean forward, pulling my legs back a little. My hands will be out over the horse's neck and I'll be asking him to go a little faster." This is called "chasing" a colt. "I'll chase him like that for two or three big circles with quite a bit of speed. Usually, by the time he has done three big circles he wants to slow down. If that's the case, I'll relax, sit down, drop my hand, and allow him to lope a couple of slow circles, then walk and rest." The exercise is then repeated

going the other direction.

Dick emphasizes the need to "repeat this over and over. Once we introduce speed control, we do it about every training session until the body position of the rider becomes a cue. Eventually, every time I lean forward it means speed, and every time I sit down it means slow." When the horse is responsive to body position in the arena, take him out in the wide open spaces and do the same type exercises.

"The problem area for most people is having a horse that is always pulling so they have to hold him back all the time. That situation is created when people teach the horse to circle by holding him in position all the time—never turning loose. Even if you know the horse is going to mess up on the very next stride, let him do it; then correct it. Teach him to respond correctly instead of holding him there and doing his work for him."

means warming up first, then going over the basic exercises that the horse has already mastered and is comfortable with. Maybe 20 minutes or so into the workout, I will insert something new, but I never introduce anything new in the beginning of the training session."

For the spin, start by walking in about a 15-foot circle. Have the horse The horse's body is moving in a circle so small that it almost appears that the front end is walking around the rear end. "If the horse wants to walk out of the position, or gets heavy or whatever, just walk him forward in a straight line for 10 to 15 feet, then go back to the little circle.

"When the horse gets to the place where his front end seems to be making a larger circle than his rear, keep the forward motion, but draw him down with some pressure on his nose with the right rein and bump him with the left leg. Let him begin to cross over in front, then release and let him walk forward out of the turn. Repeat the exercise again."

Dick cautions against changing directions too often. "Don't walk a circle in one direction, then immediately switch to the other way. I like to do it three or four times one way, then rest the horse, then go the other direction. If you go to the right, then the left, then





#### Making The Switch

When the horse is working well when ridden with two hands, Dick begins the transition to one hand. All the signals remain the same, but now the reins are crossed over each other while he holds them, palm down, with four fingers inside.

For the most part, work to the right is done with the reins held in the right hand and work to the left with reins in the left hand. The thumb side of the hand drags the rein over the horse's neck to cue him. If he fails to respond, the opposite side of the hand guides the horse's head to the inside

Eventually, the transition is made to one finger between the reins, still using the separation to emphasize dragging the slack in the reins over the horse's neck.

#### The Spin

Like the circle, teaching the spin correctly is absolutely dependent upon the horse already having mastered the basics—being soft side to side and in the poll, and moving away from leg pressure. Well-refined basic skills are a must for learning this maneuver. The response, and the spin, has to be light, willing, and soft.

Dick explains his method of teaching this maneuver. "To introduce the spin, I start the workout like any other. That walking with his head and neck down and relaxed, nose and hip to the inside. Keep pressure on with the outside leg, pushing forward, forward, forward while drawing the circle down smaller and tighter.

"For example, to the right, you would have the horse's head slightly to the inside using your left leg to bump the horse forward, walking a medium walk. As he gets more comfortable, I draw the circle down, making it smaller and smaller, increasing the bend, bumping with the left leg."

the right, the horse can get confused and lose position.

"From that point, I duplicate this procedure over and over until I can walk the circle, draw it down, and the horse will do a 360-degree turn," continues Pieper. "Then I try to walk into the spin and out with the same stride and cadence... kind of a no-stop, no-start maneuver."

When the horse can do one 360degree spin, try for two-still with no speed. If the horse loses forward motion and gets tangled up in the turn, the correction is to make him walk forward out of it, then walk back into the circle and try it again.

"When the horse gets to the point that he can do this remedial spin, I might try to just gradually walk forward in a straight line, then draw him into a turn and turn him around. Always stress walking out of the spin throughout the training period."

Many novices worry about the horse correctly planting the pivot foot. "I don't even think about that at this point," says Dick. "Some of them will and some won't plant their foot at this stage, but that's not a problem until you are starting to build a lot of speed. As long as he is doing everything else right, when you ask for speed, he'll soon find that planting the pivot foot is the easiest way to complete the maneuver."

If the horse has a problem reaching over the inside front foot with the outside front foot in the turn, help him by increasing the bend of his body. That bent position shortens his stride with the inside leg and lengthens his stride with the outside. It also results in less weight on the outside and more freedom to reach across in the front.

As the horse gains confidence, he is


able to refine his spinning technique. "And as he does, you can begin to add speed to the spin," says Dick. "The only thing you do to speed up the spin is use more leg. Once the horse has learned to correctly execute the spin and do it quietly, he learns cadence and the series of steps involved. Gradually, over a period of time, I begin to bump more with my outside leg back on the horse's rib cage to speed up the spin. Sometimes a horse will get a little out of position when he speeds up. If he does, I slow down and let him get his position back, then ask him again with that extra leg pressure. Sometimes,

you might also bump the horse's outside elbow with the side of your foot, then take it away, then bump again, to encourage him to keep moving in the front end."

He continues, "The most common mistake we see is that people try to increase the speed by increasing the pressure on the inside rein. They put more pressure on the rein-that causes more pressure in the mouth, which means 'slow down or stop' to the horse, so it really gets in the way of speed. This process of adding speed is really simple-use more leg pressure-if the horse increases his speed and maintains his body and head position, fine, gradually add more. Any time the horse loses body position, decrease the leg pressure/speed until he is able to handle it.

"Actually, the horse will be in the kindergarten stage of circles, stops, spins, and rollbacks all at the same time. I wait until the circles are pretty far along before I initiate lead changes." \*\*
