OPEN CHAMPIONS CROWNED AT 6666 NRHA DERBY PRESENTED BY MARKEL

The Four Sixes National Reining Horse Association Derby presented by Markel boasted record payouts in every level as well as all-time high entries. Open Champions made their bid for championship honors Saturday, June 26 in the Jim Norick Arena at the Oklahoma State Fair Park in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

The new title sponsorship from Four Sixes Ranch brought an incredible new payout framework for both the Open and Non Pro Derby. It raised the Open L4 Derby championship

to \$75,000 – up \$15,000 from the previous year – while in many levels the money awarded to the champion more than doubled!

The record-breaking event also welcomed several new classes across the Open and Non Pro divisions, including the \$40,000 Tamarack Ranch Open Stakes and the \$15,000 Added GlycoGuard Novice Horse Open Derby, which were both decided during the preliminary round.

Trevor Dare and Jerseys Baby Driver Sweep NRHA Open Derby Level 4



Trevor Dare and Jerseys Baby Driver flew into the Jim Norick Arena in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, for the 6666 NRHA Open Derby Level 4 finals with a mission on their mind. From the first maneuver, the crowd was on their feet. From that first sliding stop to the last, the crowd stayed behind Dare and his talented equine partner. The crowd knew what they were witnessing—and the judges agreed. When it was all said and done Dare topped the field with a 226.5.

“This is the best feeling,” Dare said after his win. “I knew I needed to be perfect, stay out of his way, and just put him in the right spot and he would take care of the rest.”

Jerseys Baby Driver was picture perfect the entire run, but his stops were standout moments—an attribute Dare agrees is a strong suit. “He’s a really big stop-

per, so when we ran through the gate, I was really focused on making sure that we could nail that first stop,” he said. “He’s almost like a power lifter when he runs and stops. It’s like he tries to make the earth shake. It’s a crazy feeling.”

While Dare knew he could count on the 5-year-old stallion, by Yellow Jersey out of Wind Her Up Chic, to show up in the stops, he was careful to not lose focus during the rest of the run.

“At the NRBC, we had gotten in a bit of a hurry starting our first turns, so that was a spot I knew I needed to focus, and again he was right there,” he said. “I did my job, and he did his. It was a team effort out there. From start to finish the harder I pushed the more he gave me.”

Jerseys Baby Driver has been with Dare since he was a yearling after owner Janice Laney purchased him out of the Legacy Sale. The colt was started by Damian Rico as a 2-year-old, and then Dare took the reins. The pair have been climbing to the top of the field ever since and sharing a special bond along the way.

“The difference between a good horse and a great horse is the size of their heart, and he has a big one,” Dare said. “I always believed in him and always knew it would get there; that we just had to put it together. You ask any of the professionals out here it is hard to do, so it feels great to put it together at the same time.”

Before the 6666 NRHA Derby presented by Markel, Dare’s lifetime earnings were \$644,000, and the \$75,000 Championship check has pushed him past the \$700,000 mark.

“I think the payout is great and it’s another way to promote our business and horses,” he said. “It gives us more

Josh Tishman and Gunnarickashay Win Level 3 Open Championship

Josh Tishman and Gunnarickashay had a big feat in front of them. A 221 was leading the Level 3 and 223 was sitting at the top in the Level 4. It was Tishman’s first Level 4 finals, making the situation even more nerve-wracking. With a propitious career at his feet, Tishman focused on one maneuver at a time.

“I don’t know if I really had a strategy,” he said. “It was my first Level 4 finals and I just tried to stay cool and treat it like any other ride going through the gates.”

Tishman and Gunnarickashay came in, gave a stellar performance, and when it was all said and done Tishman—who

The Derby championship is a significant boost for anyone’s career, and while Dare is grateful and truly excited for the win, he’s humble enough to recognize that each show is a new day.

“Obviously it’s a good thing, but tomorrow it will be over with, and we will start getting ready for the next one,” he said.

Dare thanked his wife, team and clients for their support and encouragement not only in Oklahoma City, but throughout his entire career.

“My wife manages and organizes my whole life. My customers will agree if you take me out of the saddle, I’m pretty much worthless,” Dare said with a laugh. “Thank you to Janice Laney for continuing to believe in me when we have been so close. Thank you to my whole team that works for me. I couldn’t have made it through this week or this year without them. They keep everything rolling.”

trains out of Casey Deary's barn as an assistant trainer—tied his mentor with a 223. When the last horse cleared the arena, Tishman had won the Level 3 title and was part of a four-way tie for the Level 4 Reserve Championship. Thanks to the Four Sixes Ranch guaranteed payouts, Tishman won \$35,000 for the Level 3 title and earned an additional \$31,892 for his piece of the Co-Reserve tie.

“The horse made it easy, and it just kept getting better and better as the ride went on,” he said.

Owned by Puno Performance Horses LLC, Gunnarickashay is by NRHA Four Million Dollar Sire Gunnatrashya and out of Rondas Tio. Tishman took the reins over from Deary a few months ago, and the two have been steadily improving ever since.

“Casey has shown him a bunch, and then he (Gunnarickashay) had an injury where we had to give him a year off,” Tishman said. “Then Casey showed him at the beginning of the year at the Cactus and the Run For A Million qualifier. Then the Punos were generous enough to let me try him, because Casey had some other horses to ride. I showed him at the NRBC and had a few bobbles. Then I showed here, and he has felt amazing all week. He has gotten better and better as the week has gone on and he was as honest as he could be tonight.

“I've worked for Casey for six years now. Two thousand



twelve was the first time I sat on a reining horse,” he said. “I fell in love with reining in college.”

Tishman now lives in Weatherford, Texas, training out of the Deary's facility. He was quick to give thanks to the Punos for the opportunity to ride Gunnarickashay and other great horses. “The Punos are great customers. They've had a lot of horses with us, and have been great clients and generous enough to let us assistants ride their good horses.

Fredrik Thomsson and Nitely tied for the win of the 6666 NRHA Derby presented by Markel Level 2 Open Championship with a score of 218 for owners Patrik and Jenny Jonsson of PJs Invest LLC. The win netted a check for \$10,461.

Swedish-born professional Thomsson came to the United States to gain experience and up his horsemanship. He gained a lot more. Now, with a Level 2 Open Derby championship under his belt, Thomsson is mindful of his beginnings and how far he's transcended his expectations.

“You always want to win, and always want to win at the



major events,” Thomsson said. “I came over here from Sweden in 1993 and I didn't expect this path at all for me. I just kind of fell into it. I was going to come here for three months and planned to spend three months with Bob Loomis, and after the first month, Bob told me he needed a kid like me to work for him. That changed my life right there.

“Being a horse trainer in America, I have already surpassed the goals I had, and everything else is like icing on the cake,” he continued. “But definitely you always want to win at the major events, so it's another thing to check off the list for sure.”

Nitely, a 5-year-old stallion by Gunners Special Nite out of Dream Olena Chic, has been with Thomsson since he was 2. He's a horse that has always shined bright in Thomsson's barn. The duo started the 6666 NRHA Derby presented by Markel slightly off par but quickly overturned those missteps to redeem themselves when the stakes were high.

"He felt really good all week," he said. "I had some

bobbles in the first go, a big overturn and I botched the last stop a little bit, so today I just wanted to stay really clean with him. He ran in and stopped good, turned really good both ways, and stopped all three at the end really good. He did everything I asked of him today."

Debbie Brown and Pale Black Moon Share NRHA Open Derby Level 2 Championship

Debbie Brown and Pale Black Moon shared the 6666 NRHA Open Derby Level 2 title from a score of 218 for owner Jennifer Greenleaf, winning \$10,461. The 4-year-old mare has been with Brown since the 2020 NRHA Futurity, and they've been preparing for the major shows since January.

While Brown was swift to recognize the mare's talents, she says that went hand-in-hand with figuring out her individual quirks as well.

"She's been very good. She's difficult because she doesn't like horses being close to her, so that is the only thing that makes her hard to prepare," Brown said. "She's super good-minded, but she has a really big bubble. It makes it hard to prepare her in the running and stopping. We try to do it when the arena is not crowded."

That game plan paid off for the duo on Saturday. The mare's efforts inside the Jim Norick Coliseum impressed Brown and she said she couldn't have asked for more.

"I thought she was very, very good," she said. "She ran strong and stopped really well, backed up really freely and straight. She turned really well to the right and probably the



best she can to the left. She ran down really pure and stopped really pretty."

Brown's main goal was getting through the pattern without any penalties. Brown says the talent in today's industry is increasingly tough, and even one small bobble can be costly.

"I thought that it would be hard to get through there that hard without any bobbles," Brown said. "That was my

goal was to be really smooth and slow with my hand. She always feels good, so my goal was to get through there without any mistakes."

Staying patient and treating the mare, who's by Pale Face Dunit and out of Blazing In Black, as an individual paid off. Brown said this kind of a win has been a longtime goal of hers, and the magnitude of the win wasn't lost on her.

"I expect nothing," Brown said with a laugh. "I've been doing enough horse shows to know it takes a special run to get it accomplished. She was a lot of fun to show, so I feel good."

Franky Vazquez & Whizin Off With Guns Win Open Level 1 & 2 (tie)

Franky Vazquez and Whizin Off With Guns claimed 6666 NRHA Derby presented by Markel Level 1 Open Championship and shared the Level 2 title with a score of 218 for owner Bethanie Penning. All totaled, the pair won \$20,461.

"The last 10 years," he said of when he set his sights on a goal like winning at the Derby. "I've always been there

working hard and I'm very happy to be here. I'm very happy that [Bethanie Penning] gave me the horse and gave me the opportunity to be here."

When Vazquez first started in the industry, he didn't know a lot about horses, let alone reining. It's been a long journey to the limelight, and Vazquez says it's been an enjoyable

learning experience.

“I started working for Steve Archer and I worked for him for a couple of years, and he taught me a lot like how to handle a horse from the ground because I didn’t even know how to hold a horse when I started,” Vazquez said. “I worked for Tom McCutcheon. I thank Gunny and Ben and Tom absolutely because they gave me the opportunity to work for them. I’ve also been riding with some friends like Brian Bell, I have to say thank you to Brian Bell.”

Whizin Off With Guns, who’s by Tinker With Guns and out of Whizin Off Sparks, has been with Vazquez for a short time and they’ve overcome many obstacles together, including injury. At a show prior to NRBC Whizin Off With Guns kicked his stall and cut his leg substantially. After proper vet care and plenty of time off, the duo was back in the show pen.

“Bethanie got that horse a couple of months ago, and I got him right before the NRBC,” he said. “He’s been a great horse. We got through a little hard part where he kind of



hurt himself. So, we left him at home for a little bit and we gave him three weeks off. He’s a strong horse, really super nice and good-minded.”

Vazquez said after overcoming the injury he’s been continually impressed with Whizin Off With Guns’ talent and mind. Because of his willingness to learn and superb talent, preparation for the Derby was like clockwork.

“Before I came over here, I did the best I could at home, so we were ready before we got here,” he said. “I just keep him quiet and relaxed and made sure he was good for me mentally. He felt great, so I just left him alone. I felt like he was ready.”

Lucio Pontes Casalecchi and Xtra Magic Doctor (Shiners Voodoo Dr x Aleena Starlight) finished as the Level 1 Reserve Champions and took fifth in the Level 2, worth \$6,592. Xtra Magic Doctor is owned by Janice Laney.

Casey Hinton and Mega Mag—6666 NRHA Derby Open Prime Time

Casey Hinton and Mega Mag (Magnum Chic Dream x Big Gold Chex) turned in a 220.5 to win the Open Derby Prime Time, which was decided during the preliminary round.

The 7-year-old gelding has been a solid partner for Hinton over the years, with success as a 3-year-old futurity horse. His future seems bright, and Hinton is looking forward to making a plan for his future after he turns 8.

“I really don’t ride him that much at a show anymore. He’s older, he’s trained, he’s been honest,” Hinton said. “This year I’d say he’s probably gotten ridden less than he



has the other years. He’s pretty honest, he’s pretty fun. He’s been a favorite of ours.”

In the Open Derby Prelims, Mega Mag impressed with smart moves and big stops. Ultimately, along with winning the Prime Time also led Hinton, one of NRHA’s newest Million Dollar Owners, to the Open Level 4 Derby Finals from their score of 219 in the Level 4.

The duo marked a 217 in the finals for an additional \$3,811 in earnings.

“I thought he really tapped off in the turns. He’s a horse that squats a lot and really has a cool turn. So that was a good first impression. The right circle I thought was dead

Kole Price and Trendsetter—Tamarack Ranch Open Stakes

Seeing the need for a division focused on 4-year-old reining horses, NRHA Corporate Partner Tamarack Ranch chose to sponsor a new division – the \$40,000 added Tamarack Ranch Open Stakes.

Decided in the preliminary round of the Open Derby, Kole Price and Trendsetter (Spooks Gotta Whiz x Timed To Shine) topped the division with a score of 222, earning \$14,004. The pair also qualified for the Level 4 Open Finals, where their score of 218.5 netted an additional \$4,310.

Price has had Trendsetter since he was a 2-year-old, and from the beginning, has recognized his talent inside the arena. The colt stepped up again in Oklahoma City to showcase his talents at the right time for Price.

“He's one of the most fun horses that I've ever trained,” he said. “He's extremely smart, and his athletic ability is kind of freaky, which also makes him a little tricky to show. I don't ever feel like I've really got him shown to his full



ability yet, I'm getting closer, but he's so much horse.”

Price added, “He is as a big of a stopper as anybody here, so adding another stop in the next finals pattern I think is going to be key to that horse and kind of cleaning up a few things. I was really happy. Under the circumstances, we kind of held it together and showed really good.”

Price was especially happy to see the addition of the Tamarack Ranch Open Stakes, which provided the opportunity to show Trendsetter for even more money.

“I think it gives a whole new twist. Maybe that 4-year-old you would have left at home to give it a little time off, you can show it here and maybe not put as much pressure on it, but still win money,” he said. “I think it's an incredible step to the future of reining horses.”

Lane Colston and Lil Ruf Whizkey Win Level 4 & Youth Non Pro Derby

Lane Colston and Lil Ruf Whizkey secured the Non Pro Derby Level 4 and Youth championships with a 221. Thanks to the Four Sixes Ranch guaranteed payouts for this year's Derby, Colston took home a first-place check for \$30,000 and pocketed an additional \$2,000 for the youth title.

Already in their young career together, Colston and Cowboy are making big strides in the reining world. With Colston, Lil Ruf Whizkey was the co-reserve Level 4 Non Pro Champion at the 2020 NRHA Futurity, where they also won the Youth Futurity.

"My horse is not the average 4-year-old. He is so strong, and he looked like a 4-year-old this time last year. He is a great horse and has a huge heart," Colston said. "He's friendly, nice to be around and so laid back. He's a little brown gelding, but big things come in small packages."

Now, the 2021 NRHA Non Pro Derby is his biggest win thus far.

"I don't think I have taken it all in yet," he said. "People work their whole lives for this. It's a dream come true."

Colston came into the finals prepped and ready with the help of a few veterans in the game. The ascending horseman was quick to note that without help from a team of supporters and a talented horse, his success wouldn't be possible.



"Before I showed in the go-rounds, I had Craig Schmersal give me a few tips that helped me," Colston said. "Both Craig and Brandon (Brant) pointed me in the right direction. He was good in the go-round—a 219.5— so we just did the same thing the night before the finals and he was great."

Lil Ruf Whizkey is by NRHA Million Dollar Sire Whizkey N Diamonds out of Lil Ruf Startime, and the 4-year-old has lifetime earnings of \$41,124. Cade Mc-

Cutcheon helped Colston find Lil Ruf Whizkey and Colston purchased him from Jake Ballard—who was training him for breeder Terry Leffew—in July of 2020. Colston has big plans for the young gelding but was quick to note that this win will be pretty hard to beat.

"It's pretty hard to beat that. I just want to keep him happy and keep showing him," he said. "He's so talented. I may show in Las Vegas at the High Roller. I want to show him the next couple of years. Maybe we will try something a little harder down the road."

Colston thanked his parents, Kevin and Amy Colston, his horse Lil Ruf Whizkey, Brandon Brant, the McCutcheon family and Abigail Janes as well as the Four Sixes Ranch and all the sponsors of the NRHA Derby.

Jack Medows and Dream On Whiz Win NRHA Non Pro Derby Level 3

Jack Medows and Dream On Whiz took home the 6666 NRHA Derby presented by Markel Level 3 Non Pro championship after marking a 217.5. The duo also tied for fifth in the Level 4 for their efforts inside the Jim Norick Arena on Friday night. Thanks to the guaranteed payouts for the 2021 event, Medows will leave Oklahoma City \$27,555 richer.

"It's amazing. I'm just so happy for this horse. He's a 4-year-old that we just bought not too long ago. Every day he comes out and tries. We bought him right around NRBC from Samantha Griffin. Martin Larcombe had him, and he

did a great job with him," Medows explained.

Medows, a lifetime earner of \$319,827, is continuously impressed with the gelding, who's by NRHA Seven Million Dollar Sire Magnum Chic Dream and out of Ms Sassy Whiz. Prior to the Derby, Dream On Whiz had lifetime earnings of \$10,696 and was nominated by Hill Country Reiners.

"This horse is just phenomenal-minded, and it just comes out," Medows said. "I think the biggest part of him is his

heart. I knew I drew up last in the drag, it got me a little upset because I knew how big of a stopper he is, but he just plowed right through it. That just shows more about him than anything.”

Along with being an accomplished Non Pro competitor, Medows recently graduated from Missouri SMT with a bachelor’s degree in civil engineering. While his college career took him away from the show pen for a brief time, Medows is excited to get back in the game. He was quick to note that while showing “Patrick” was an enjoyable jump back into competition, he won’t continue showing the colt, but rather pass the reins to his sister.

“We bought him for my sister. With that short time frame, we decided I would show him and she would show him in



a couple weeks at the youth world,” he said. “That’s his next big show. She just didn’t feel that comfortable to just hop on. That left him to me, but I’m so excited and happy for her to have this horse.”

Medows’ main goal for the Non Pro Derby was to get a good feel for the horse and show him to the best of his ability.

“He’s just a show horse,” he said. “He’s going to have a good, long future and that will be good for my sister. He is her horse and I just got lucky enough to steal him.”

Medows thanked his family, Fernando Salgado, and God.

My first turn, again, I had a penalty, which bumped me down but she was good everywhere else. I take responsibility for the penalties."

She can turn a [plus-] half, circle a [plus-] one and stop a [plus-] one. If we can put it all together, we can be really big.”

Avila plans to keep showing the mare to try and put more earnings on her. He thanked Nelson for giving him the opportunity to train and own the mare, who will eventually join her owner’s broodmare band.

“It’s great to tie with Doug and awesome to win here,” Avila said. “We took her to two shows in a row, gave her a couple weeks off and turned her out before we came here to freshen up. It really made a difference.”

NRHA OWNER CASEY HINTON CROSSES MILLION DOLLAR MILESTONE

With a career that has spanned disciplines, decades, states and roles, it's fitting that Casey Hinton of Whitesboro, Texas, has achieved a career milestone that few have. The National Reining Horse Association Professional, who has also had an impressive career in the show pen, became a Million Dollar Owner in April.

Just a few thousand dollars away from that milestone, the success of Hinton's horses at the National Reining Breeders Classic clinched the achievement.

"I think this is a major accomplishment in your career, but when I started out, this wasn't my goal. You start out with a love of horses and training, owning, and showing them," Hinton explained. "To reach a milestone that few have accomplished is very exciting."

Growing up in Ohio, Hinton began showing horses in 4H. The All-American Quarter Horse Congress in Columbus, Ohio, provided plenty of inspiration to the budding trainer. "It is such a big influence on every part of the horse industry. It gets you thinking that the horse business is something to be a part of," he said.

While at Findlay College, Hinton was able to work with Dale Wilkinson. "He was the grandfather of reining, so with that exposure in college, the NRHA Futurity and the Congress both being held in Ohio, I wanted to direct my-

self towards a more advanced level of training," Hinton recalled. "I saw what the successful horsemen were doing and wanted to emulate that."

Hinton later worked for professional horse trainer Doug Lilly, and when Lilly made the move to Arizona, Hinton followed as his assistant. Soon after he began working for renowned horseman Al Dunning. "At that time, the horse training world hadn't reached the point of specialization yet, so we trained cutters, cow horses, reiners, western riding horses, and more, because the all-around titles were the thing to win," he explained.

Hinton soon went into business for himself, taking numerous youth and adult riders to all-around titles. His barn, however, began to evolve, transitioning from having a few reining horses to a specialized reining facility.

It was when Hinton and his wife Kathy moved to Texas that his business and career really flourished. The couple created Cedar Ridge Stallion Station, and began to diversify, not only with a training and competition division, but also breeding and selling. "We have been entrepreneurs and invested in ourselves by buying or raising our own prospects. We've had success with that, and are fortunate it has worked out," he said. Cedar Ridge Stallion Station is home to NRHA Seven Million Dollar Sire Magnum Chic Dream, NRHA Triple Crown winner Not Ruf At All, and two-time

AQHA World Champion and earner of \$188,000 In Like Flinn.

Hinton has owned several standout athletes, including Smarty Starlight, Lil Magnum Jessie, Black Hails Gold, Guaranteed A Magnum, and Mega Mag. It was on Lil Magnum Jessie, by NRHA \$7 Million Sire Magnum Chic Dream, that Hinton won the 2009 NRHA Level 4 Open Futurity Reserve Championship. Hinton won the NRHA Level 3 Open Futurity Championship in 2013 on Black Hails Gold (by Shine Like Hail), and in 2017 on Mega Mag (by Magnum Chic Dream).

While Hinton initially competed on Guaranteed A Magnum (by Magnum With A Dream), he passed the reins to his assistant Jimmy van der Hoeven, who piloted the gelding to back-to-back NRHA Derby Championships in 2018 and 2019 (owned by Chad and Molly Cherry).

Hinton was adamant that his success as both an owner and showman is due to help from people surrounding him.

“You can’t accomplish something like that without a team. We have had many great assistants help us over the years, and we have been a real team. I don’t think this is an individual honor for me by any means,” he said. Hinton shared that Kathy, who has owned NRHA earners of more than \$720,000, has been the driving force behind the couple’s success.

The current team at Casey Hinton Reining Horses includes Casey and Kathy, along with NRHA Professional Jimmy van der Hoeven, Abby Kampman, Mateo Argentero and Rodrigo Nieves.

While achieving Million Dollar Owner status is a huge accomplishment, Hinton is not resting on his laurels and is less than \$115,000 away from becoming an NRHA Million Dollar Rider. “We still have some more goals, and we hope we have the endurance to reach them. The fact that we can do what we love, which is raising, training, and showing reining horses makes us fortunate. It’s fulfilling, so we hope to continue for a long time,” he said.

chea and bred by Clyde Wilmott, rode to a 663.5 and earned \$29,050.36.

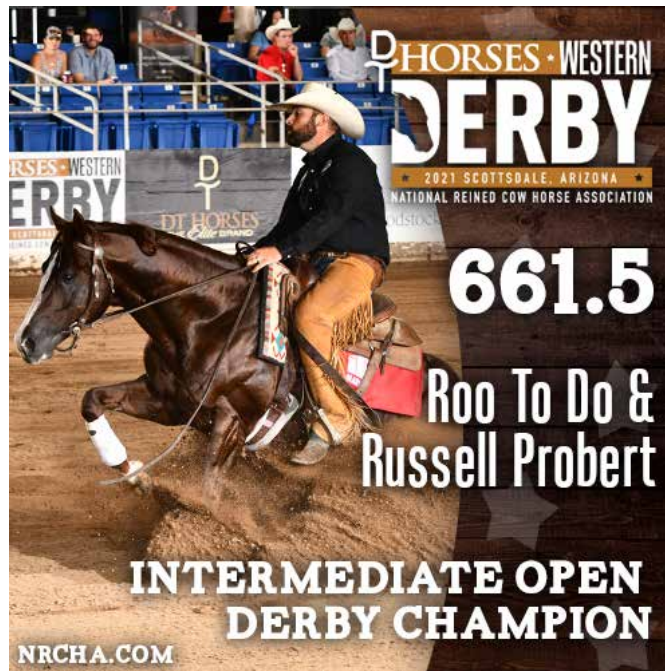

Riding for a total \$63,403.56 purse, the Intermediate Open Derby Champion title goes to Russell Probert riding owners Laurie Woods'/Lexi Kastanis' 2016 stallion Roo To Do (One Time Pepto x Roosters Chicaroo x Gallo Del Cielo), bred by Jim & Jo Anne Carollo. It was a special win for the young trainer who has only had his shingle hung out solo for a year.

"This is the biggest [win] for me; there have been some highlights but this probably tops it off," said the Joseph, Oregon, horseman. "He's the first one I've gotten to take all the way through from a yearling into a show career and it is pretty special to put the work in and have it pay off. He's special; it's really cool."

Probert had the high scoring run in the Open and Interme-



mediate Open herd work preliminaries with a 222.

"We had a really good prelims and drew good in the herd work, enough to get some good cows," he said. "We had a really good cow in the fence work but he toughed it out and we got it done."

In the Intermediate Open, the pair scored a 661.5 (H:218/R:222.5/C:221) for the win and earn recently new owners Woods and Kastanis \$12,046.68. They took home a Gist buckle from the NRCHA, a Platinum Performance gift certificate for product and a \$50

UltraCruz gift card.

Reserve Champion Tucker Robinson piloted 2017 gelding Smooth Outta Style (Smooth Talkin Style x Dualin Curly Pep x Dual Pep), owned by Julie Weinhardt & F Velazquez

and bred by Kerry & Jenny Frazier, to a 661 composite that earned \$8,876.50.

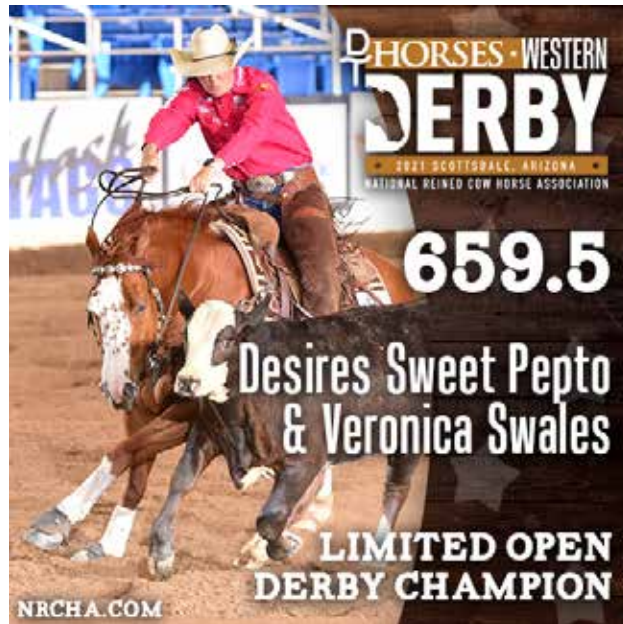
Desires Sweet Pepto & Veronica Swales Limited Open Derby

Veronica Swales began the preliminary events at the DT Horses Western Derby confident in her horses. She had two horses in the Open Derby, Desires Sweet Pepto and Aint No Nag. During her cow work preliminary run on Aint No Nag, the horse tangled with the cow and took a fall that left Swales in the dirt. After a clean bill of health from the doctors, she came back to compete at WestWorld of Scottsdale, especially eager to compete in the Sunday Finals.

After the judges blew the horn for a new cow in the Finals, Swales breathed a sigh of relief. Then, the native Canadian focused in on mastering the new cow.

“I felt pretty awesome coming in. I was a little bit worried after my first cow came in because it was pretty wild; I got a second one and I was pretty happy,” she said. “I was super happy with my horse, he was great. I had a few concerns going in, but when that black cow lined out down the fence, I felt good.”

A 2016 stallion, Desires Sweet Pepto (Sweet Lil Pepto x Desires Lil Scoot x Scootin Boon), was bred by Leea Arnold/Dudley Caraway and is owned by Robin Lynn Morrison. Swales and Morrison grew up together. Though the



Canadian owner was not able to attend, Swales says that she was watching.

“I think she is super happy and wishes she could be down here, but with everything with COVID she hasn’t been able to come down,” Swales said. “She’s been watching and is pretty stoked. We’ll finish out this year with the derbies on him and then I am going to try and get him qualified for the hackamore at the World Show. Then, hopefully, his owner will come down [from Canada] next year and get to enjoy [showing] him.”

The pair rode to a composite 659.5 (H:217.5/:220.5/C:221.5) to earn the win and \$4,322.97. They won a Gist buckle from the NRCHA, a Cow Trac system from Cow Trac, a \$50 UltraCruz gift card from Santa Cruz Animal Health and a Platinum Performance gift certificate for product.

In reserve was Abigayle Mixon aboard owner Kathryn Rippatoe's 2016 gelding Vintage Ambrosia (One Fine Vintage x Miss Fancy Juice x Smart Like Juice), bred by Mike & Linda Silver. With a composite 646.5, the pair earned \$3,458.38. Kelby Phillips & Petilion Open Novice Horse Champions

The DT Horses Western Derby saw 53 entries eligible for the Open Novice Horse division. Following a high cow work score of 220.5, Weatherford, Texas-based trainer Kelby Phillips and Julie Strenge's 2017 palomino stallion Peptilion (One Time Pepto x Sparktilion x Shining Spark) took the top spot and the championship title.

Phillips, an NRCHA Million Dollar Rider, took over training Peptilion following the 2021 NRCHA Stallion Stakes in

April. Following only one schooling show, the duo clicked in the Equidome arena at Westworld of Scottsdale.

“Jake Telford trained him and did a really good job with him,” Phillips said. “I took him to a schooling show to get with him, but it feels like the more I ride him, the more we get together. A win like this helps me build confidence in me with the horse.”

The pair started the Derby off with a strong 220.5 in the rein work, then followed it up with a 215.5 in the herd work before taking the division high score in the cow work. The hard-stopping stallion has impressed Phillips with his abilities in the show pen.

“In the fence work, he’s been solid. He is reading a cow really good and obviously stops really big, which is one thing I like about him—he can run and stop,” he said. “We got a new cow after we made a huge first turn, the cow fell down. But he did it again and had a nice run.”

For Phillips, the Open Novice Horse division offers an opportunity for horses that had challenges in the show pen when they were younger. This horse, like many others, would have a hard time competing in the Open, but in the Novice Horse, eligibility is limited to 4- and 5-year-old horses with earnings less than \$12,500, allowing another opportunity for late bloomers to find the spotlight.

“I think [this division] is awesome. This is obviously an Open horse, but he’s had some bad luck here and there,” he said. “They raised the limit from where you could win out in one show. Now, you have a chance to win money in more divisions. This doesn’t mean the horse isn’t good [to be in Novice Horse], it just means they had some bad luck or circumstances didn’t work out. There is now a chance for the horse and the owners to win some money. It is so hard for some of these 4-year-olds to compete against these 5-year-olds, and this division is a big deal.”



Phillips thanked Stenge for giving him the opportunity to work with Peptilion. The win boosts his confidence in the horse headed into the next premier event. For the win, the Champion Open Novice Horse receives a Classic Equine saddle pad from the company and a Platinum Performance gift certificate for product as well as \$4,906.80.

There was a tie for the reserve spot in the division. Lil Starlight Cat (High Brow Cat x Lil Foxxie Starlight x Grays Starlight) and Lance Johnston tied CR Tuff Star War (Woody Be Tuff x Shortys Starlight x Grays Starlight) with a composite 654.

Lil Starlight Cat is a 2017 stallion bred by Glenn and Debbie Drake and owned by Kenneth and Karen Haugland. With Johnston riding, the pair marked a 219 in the rein work, a 216.5 in the herd and a 218.5 in the cow work to earn \$3,496.10. Johnston will also ride the stallion on Sunday, June 13, in the Open Finals.

Bergen rode Eric Storey’s 2016 gelding, which was bred by Center Ranch, to a 221.5 rein work score, a 215 in the herd and a 217.5 in the cow work to earn \$3,496.10. He and CR Tuff Star War will also compete in the DT Horses Western Derby Open Finals.

Reserve Champion Open Novice Horse receives a \$300 gift certificate for product from Farnam and a pair of ice boots from Classic Equine.

Abbie Phillips & CR Tuff Guns N Roses Non Pro Derby Champions

Non Pro Champion Abbie Phillips rode CR Tuff Guns N Roses (Woody Be Tuff x Gypsy Rose Rey x Dual Rey) to a commanding lead, earning the win by 8 points. Phillips' 2016 gelding was bred by Center Ranch. Their composite score of 659.5 (H:220/R:224.5/C:215) earned \$8,207.55.



For the win, Phillips took home a custom Bob’s saddle and a Gist Buckle from the NRCHA, a \$50 UltraCruz gift card from Santa Cruz Animal Health, a straw hat from Shorty’s Caboy Hattery, and a gift certificate for product from Platinum Performance.

Megan Waddell & Boonshinen Non Pro Limited Derby

Congratulations to Megan Waddell on earning the Non Pro Limited Derby Championship aboard her homebred mare Boonshinen (Smart Boons x Shine Up My Sliders x Shiners Vintage). She scored a composite 651.5 (H:213/R:219.5/C:219) to top a class of 34 entries vying for \$15,552 in added money.

Waddell, from Fort Worth, Texas, was jubilant to have the win, and more so on a mare that is the next horse to help continue achieving her show-pen goals.

“She is actually out of my old show mare that I’ve had since she was 4 and now she is 19; [this mare is] my first baby out of her,” Waddell said. “Chris and Sarah Dawson have been helping me with her.”

On Thursday, June 3, Waddell started off her DT Horses Western Derby with the high rein work score with a 219.5. From there, she took that confidence into the herd work.

“The highlight [of the show] was definitely winning the reining,” she said. “She’s been great all week. I am super nervous in the herd, so surviving that was nice. She’s been on all week for me.”

Securing the event win was exciting for Waddell, who earned \$3,576.96 here at the DT Horses Western Derby and

It’s only been a year since Landon began riding the mare,

and the success he’s had has been “crazy.”

“It’s kind of surreal to finish so high riding with these amazing riders. I look up to all of them! I knew she was a good horse, but I did not think this show would end up like this,” Landon said. “This is my first year showing a limited age horse and I’ve [only] been riding cow horse for two years. It’s been a blur. I’ve gone through all kinds of stuff, where for the first year all I heard was ‘don’t pinch your cow.’ Everything’s gone so fast! My family, all the trainers,

everybody—thank you!”

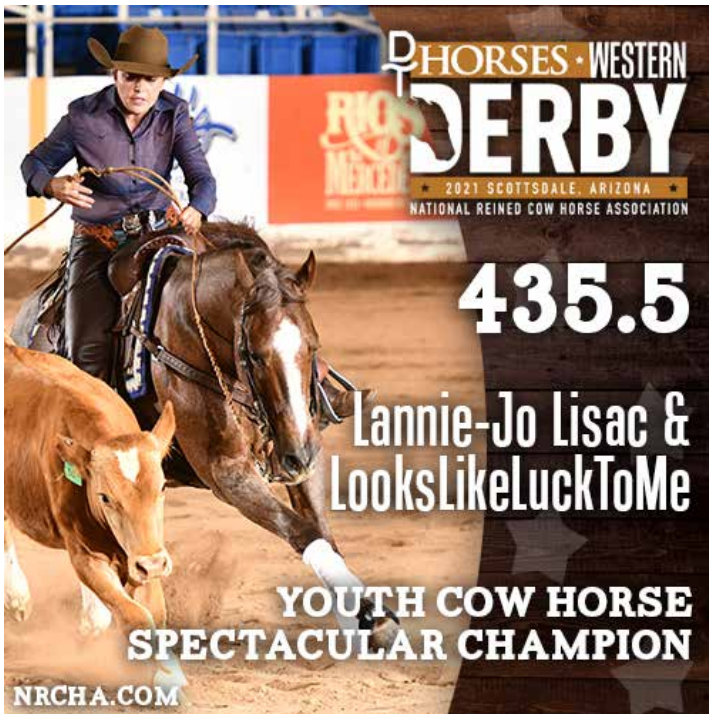

"She's really fun in the herd because she has a lot of expression and excels in the herd," she said. "I was nervous to open her up in the prelims, but I hope to show off what she can do in the finals. I made the Intermediate and Limited Open finals on her."

Crafton has had a successful show in Scottsdale, earning top scores in the Non Pro Derby cow work and rein work on her younger horses. However, the two rein has presented a new challenge.

“The two rein is fun and I am enjoying it and the whole set up,” said Crafton. “It feels good on this horse, especially. “Right now, he’s made the transition into the bridle really well,” said Dawson. Some horses it is a more difficult transition, but he took to it from the get-go. I was really excited to show him in the two rein because he wanted to pack it really well. Right now, his transition is his strong suit.”

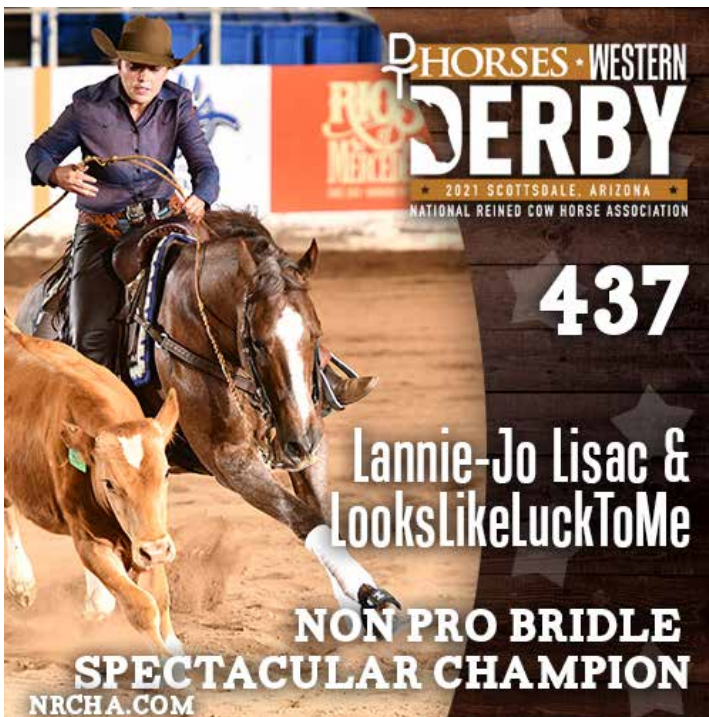

Though Lannie-Jo has shown “Marsha” several times, this show is where the duo finally put it all together for a

Spectacular win. The young lady was all smiles following the win.

“We’ve tried it at a lot of shows, but it was nice that it all came together,” she said. “We are finally clicking, getting to know each other and we drew good cows. It just kind of worked.”

While Lannie-Jo is only 17 years old, she’s ridden and competed for many years. However, riding in the Non Pro Spectacular still feels exciting.

“Everybody riding in that class has such nice horses and they’re great riders. To be on top is kinda cool,” Lannie-Jo said. “I feel like she put together our reining and I’ve worked hard on herd work. I finally cut good and it worked out.”

For the Non Pro Spectacular win, the Pueblo, Colorado, youth earned \$4,200 at the DT Horses Western Derby and a C.R. Morrison trophy courtesy of the Arizona Quarter Horse Association, a straw hat from Shorty’s Caboy Hattery, a \$50 UltraCruz gift card from Santa Cruz Animal Health and a gift certificate from Platinum Performance for product.

There was a tie for reserve in the Non Pro Bridle Spectacular. With a 433.5, Tylor Todd rode 2011 gelding Mr Stylish Cat (Mr Playinstylish x Lil Sally Cat x High Brow Cat), bred by Kit & Charlie Moncrief, to tie with Amy Bailey riding 2012 gelding Electra Tuff (Woody Be Tuff x Electras Boots x Doc O Boots), bred by the W.T. Waggoner Estate. Both earned \$2,925.

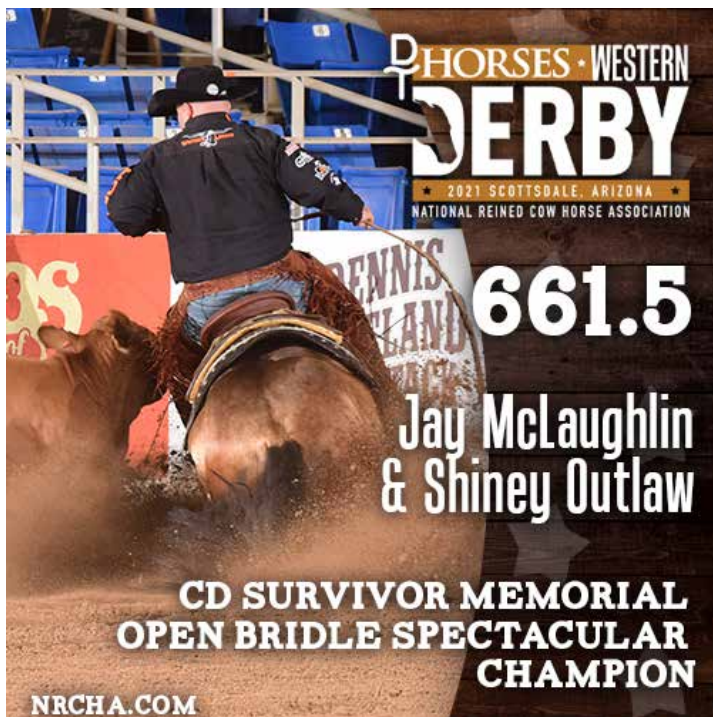
Cd Survivor Memorial Open Bridle Spectacular

A tremendous 227 in the cow work propelled Jay McLaughlin and Shiney Outlaw (Shiners Nickle x Mereyda x Dual Rey) to the top of a talented field of Open Bridle horses, earning McLaughlin’s second CD Survivor Memorial Open Bridle Spectacular title.

The déjà vu feeling started in the herd work on Monday, June 7, when the pair scored a 214.

“We didn’t get the cattle cut like we wanted to [in the herd work], so I started off a tick like the World’s Greatest this year,” the Clarendon, Texas, trainer said. During the 2021 DT Horses and Hashtags’ World’s Greatest Horseman, the pair rallied to reserve after a disappointing herd work.

“The rein work, I thought I had him prepared, but he got pretty wound up when the crowd was getting it,” he continued. “He feels it when the crowd is electric! He ended up being really good there. I knew that the cattle were tough here but he has worked tougher cattle. I’ve scored higher, but this is really special to me.”



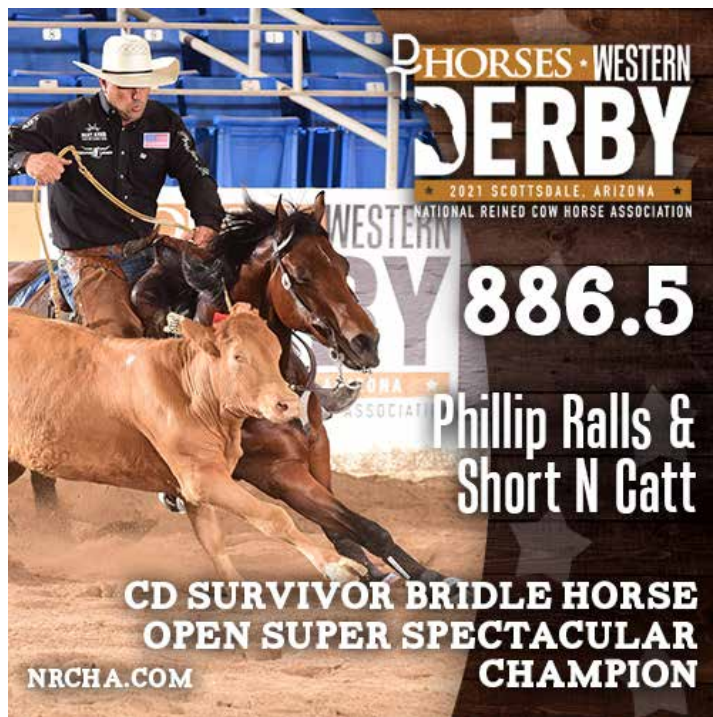
McLaughlin piloted CD Dee Vee Dee to the same title at a previous event. Showing a bridle horse is something the NRCHA Million Dollar Rider aims to do with every horse he trains.

“Nancy Crawford is very much into the longevity of the horses, and I am and so is my whole crew. We try on everyone to make it there [to the bridle] and if they can make it all the way through, that is pretty special,” he said. “I didn’t [train] this one all the way through but he has had some pretty special hands on him, and I am just following in their footsteps.”

The buckskin stallion and McLaughlin rode to a composite 661.5 (H:214/R:220.5/C:227), earning breeder and owner Michelle Cannon \$11,160 for the win. As the CD Survivor Memorial Open Bridle Champion, Shiney Outlaw’s connections took home the perpetual trophy for the event, a C.R. Morrison trophy courtesy of the Arizona Quarter Horse Association, a Gist buckle from Holy Cow Performance Horses, a \$50 UltraCruz gift card from Santa Cruz Animal Health and a gift certificate from Platinum Performance for product.

There was a tie for the Reserve Champion spot. Justin Wright rode Light And Sassy (CD Lights x Dual Sass x Dual Pep), bred by Winston Hansma and owned by Shelly Franklin, to tie Kelby Phillips and Duals Lucky Charm (Dual Smart Rey x TRR Ms Pepcid Olena x Pepcid), bred by Carolyn and Mark Murray and owned by JB6 LLC, both with a 660.5. Both horses earned \$8,091.

to throw a loop for the CD Survivor Bridle Horse Super Spectacular Open muley steer stopping, and a slew of big scores followed. When the last steer left the chute, the top spot in the steer stopping was claimed by Randy Paul riding LenaLilToTheWright (Lenas Wright On x Shining Survivor x Shining Spark), owned by Linda Katz and Richard Bell.

Paul, from Santa Maria, California, elicited cheers when his 231.5 steer stopping score was announced. He edged out Phillip Ralls and Short N Catt (Sophisticated Cat x Shortys Sugar Sue x Shorty Lena), bred by Tommy Mather and owned by Sarah Davis, who marked a 230.

In the end, though, it was Ralls and the 2011 bay gelding that claimed the inaugural CD Survivor Bridle Horse Super Spectacular Open Champion title. Their composite 886.5 (H:218.5/R:220/C:218/S:230). Holy Cow Performance Horses added \$5,000 overall to the Super Spectacular event, and Open won \$1,000.

“Growing up with my dad [Ron Ralls], that was always our biggest focus, a horse’s longevity in their career,” said Ralls. “We don’t want them to be done as 3-year-olds but to go through the whole process. I take a lot of pride in my bridle horses and the finished product that can show at these big events. These are the most exciting events to go to and there are always great horses, great riders, and to show these horse’s true all-around talents is important. It doesn’t get any more exciting.”

Ralls appreciated the opportunity to try out Short N Catt in a four-event format, much like the World’s Greatest Horseman.

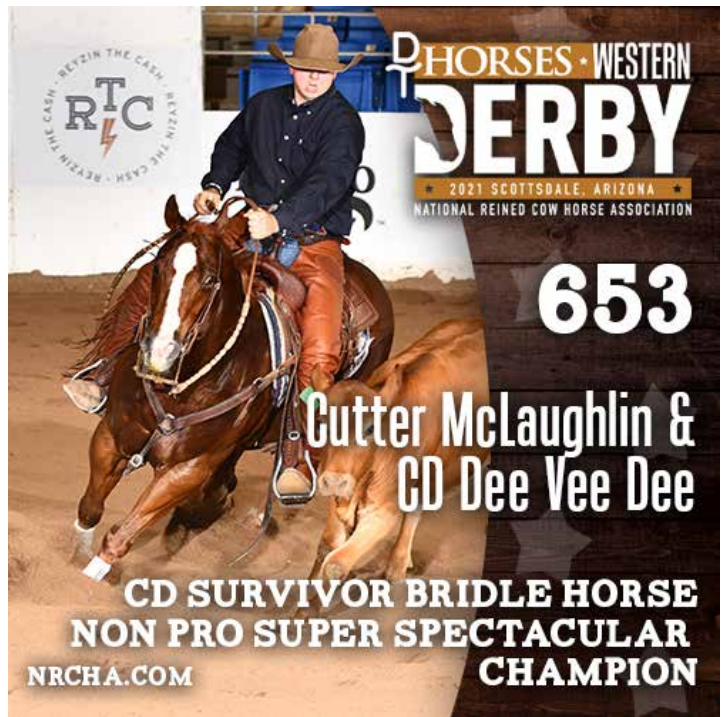
Paul and LenaLilToTheWright finished in reserve for the overall Super Spectacular with a composite 878 (H:210/R:218.5/S: 231.5) and earned \$800.

In the Non Pro, the CD Survivor Bridle Horse Super Spectacular championship and muley steer stopping high score went to Cutter McLaughlin riding CD Dee Vee Dee (CD Lights x Shiners Missy Jay x Shining Spark). Coming off his win at the 2021 World's Greatest Youth Horseman, presented by MARS Equestrian™, McLaughlin was thrilled to have another chance to rope off his good cow horse.

"It is always fun to get to rope with the other three events," he said. "It was cool because it was roping at a cow horse show, which we don't have many of. We rope enough at home to keep us remembering how to do it, but this is fun."

The Clarendon, Texas, horseman scored a 225 in the steer stopping. In total, his composite 653 (H:145.5/R:143.5/C:139.5/S:225) topped the division by 10.5 points.

In reserve, Ali Norcutt and Soulas Hickory Star (Soula Jule Star x Tun Liz Loose x), bred by Ken & Ramona Wold and owned by Darrell Norcutt, rode to a 642.5 (H:143.5/R:143/C:146.5/S:209.5) to claim the second-high spot for the Super Spectacular overall.

With European Youth and Amateur Team Cup / new: Covid-Trail and Covid-Pleasure

Finally, the time has come: one of the most beautiful Quarter Horse events in Europe casts its shadow ahead: the European Championship of American Quarter Horses invites the best horses and riders from all over Europe to a 4-fold AQHA show in Kreuth from August 8 to 15, 2021. This time, show management is again in the proven hands of Renate Gruber and Rainer Maierhofer, who have run the European Champion-



ship for more than ten years.

For optimal preparation, paid warmups will be offered on Saturday, August 7. The European Championship will begin on Sunday, August 8 with the Green and Novice classes in preparation for the Go Round. The European Champions in the Halter classes will be determined on Monday and Tuesday. There will be no finals here - the results will be

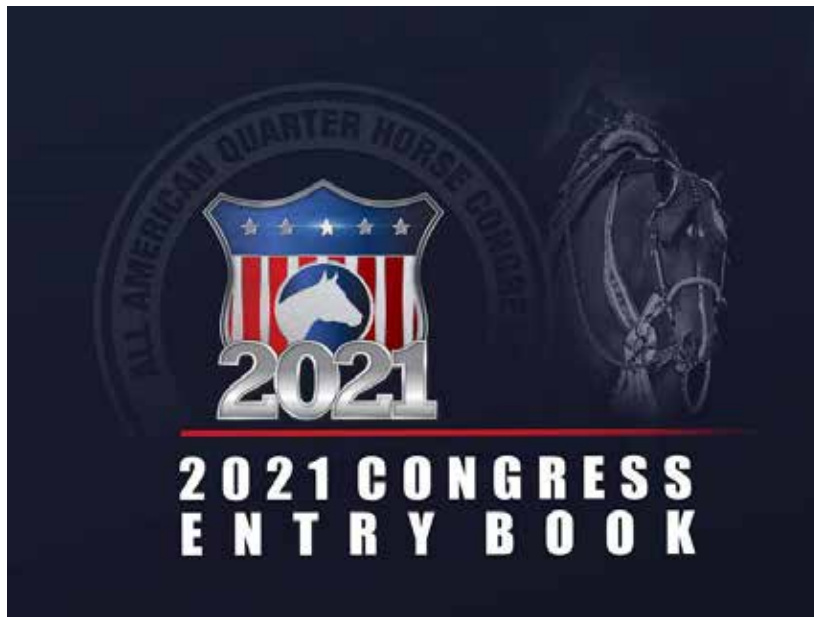
